2. a highways NSIP comprising alterations in excess of 15 hectares to a motorway within England for which National Highways is the highway authority under sections 14(1)(h) and 22(5) PA 2008.

5. Non-technical description of the Proposed Development



A brief, non-technical description of the Proposed Development must be entered in Box 5. Brief non-technical description of the Proposed Development

SEGRO is proposing to develop a second phase of its East Midlands Gateway Logistics Park (known as EMG1). This second phase is to be provided on land to the south of East Midlands Airport and the A453, west of the M1 motorway and is referred to as EMG2. The proposals for EMG2 comprise the following:

- Construction of a maximum of 300,000 sq.m. of floorspace plus 200,000 sq.m. of internal mezzanines for logistics and advanced manufacturing development with ancillary buildings;
- Construction of internal road infrastructure;
- Construction of a bus interchange;
- Construction of dedicated HGV parking; and
- Provision of hard and soft landscaping.

Further elements are as follows:

- Upgrade of the EMG1 substation; and
- Creation of a 14.3ha (35 acre) Community Park to the west of the logistics and advanced manufacturing development

Significant improvements to facilitate delivery of EMG2 are proposed at Junction 24 of the M1 motorway and the wider highway network including improvements to active travel works. These works are summarised as:

- A453 access junction works;
- Works to Hyam's Lane;
- Works to the M1 northbound;
- Construction of a new link road from the M1 northbound to the A50 westbound via a bridge over the A453;
- Works to the A50 westbound;
- Works to the link road from the M1 southbound and A50 eastbound to M1 Junction 24;
- Works to the west side of the M1 Junction 24 roundabout and A453 northbound approach;
- Works to the east side of the M1 Junction 24 roundabout and A453 southbound approach;
- Improvements to the EMG1 access junction;
- Construction of an Active Travel Link between the EMG1 access junction and the A453 west of Finger Farm roundabout:
- Provision of an uncontrolled crossing of the A453 at the East Midland Airport signalised access junction;
- Works to M1 northbound signage on the approach to M1 Junction 23A;
- Works to Long Holden;
 - Works to the A42/A453 Finger Farm roundabout; and
- Works to upgrade public footpath L57 to a cycle track.

6. Location or route of the Proposed Development

This is because the Secretary of State will otherwise already be in receipt of the information needed for the Examining Authority to then inform specified persons of their right to request a Compulsory Acquisition Hearing. These obligations on the Secretary of State and the Examining Authority are set out in section 92 of the Planning Act 2008. The Book of Reference must also, in Part 4, specify the owner of any Crown interest in the land which is proposed to be used for the purposes of the order for which application is being made. This information must be included in the Book of Reference even if the applicant is not proposing to seek Compulsory Acquisition powers.
