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# 1 Development Consent Order Glossary

## 1.1 Purpose of the Development Consent Order Glossary

- 1.1.1 Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited (referred to as Horizon unless otherwise stated) has produced a glossary of terms and definitions to ensure important terms are used consistently throughout the organisation and to ensure readers understand what the terms mean.
- 1.1.2 This Glossary should be used as a reference document as it provides the full definition of each defined term used across the Development Consent Order (DCO). It should be noted that whilst the definitions provided have been agreed for use within Horizon, they do not necessarily fully align with those of external organisations<sup>1</sup>.
