Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited: Wylfa Newydd New Nuclear Power Station

Notification in accordance with section 46 of the Planning Act 2008

1. I write on behalf of Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited ("Horizon") regarding its proposals for the construction, operation and maintenance of a new nuclear power station and other development, at Wylfa, Anglesey ("Wylfa Newydd Project").
2. Horizon intends to apply to the Secretary of State ("SoS") for a development consent order ("DCO") for the Wylfa Newydd Project under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("Planning Act"). The application for DCO is anticipated to be submitted in the third quarter of 2017. This letter constitutes formal notification of the SoS pursuant to section 46 of the Planning Act.
3. Horizon is now commencing formal pre-application consultation about the Wylfa Newydd Project with the consultation bodies identified under section 42(1) of the Planning Act and this will run from 24th May 2017 until 22nd June 2017. This consultation is Horizon's Stage Three pre-application consultation.
4. In accordance with section 46(1) of the Planning Act please see below the Stage Three pre-application consultation documents that have been provided to the section 42 consultation bodies and which have been separately sent to you.
 - (a) Non-technical document:
 - (i) **Consultation Overview Document** – This is a 46 page document providing an overview of the key changes to the project since our Stage 2 pre-application consultation. In accordance with our Welsh language policy this document has been provided in Welsh and English)

(b) Technical document:

(i) **Main Consultation Document** A 222 page document providing more detailed descriptions of the project changes and how the project has evolved following previous consultation along with associated Preliminary Environmental Information (provided in English only)


The purpose of the Statement of Community Consultation as stated in Section 47 of The Act is to set out how the applicant (Horizon) proposes to consult, about the proposed application.

Isle of Anglesey County Council's Response to Horizon Nuclear Power's Statement of Community Consultation (SOCC) (in accordance with s.47 of the Planning Act 2008).

This letter constitutes the Isle of Anglesey County Council's (IACC) formal response to the Wylfa Newydd Project Statement of Community Consultation (SOCC), which was received on 13th March 2017. In accordance with the provisions of s.47(3) of the Planning Act 2008, the IACC have 28 days to respond beginning the day after which the local authority receives the consultation documents. This deadline is the 10th April 2017.

Since the close of Horizon's Stage 2 consultation (PAC2) on the 25th October 2016, we understand that there have been significant and fundamental changes to the Wylfa Newydd project. This has triggered the need for a Stage 3 consultation (PAC3) so that Horizon can consult publically on these changes. In short, we understand that the project changes can be summarised as:

- i. Change to the scope, design and layout of the power station following 'optimisation'.
- ii. Change in legislation which has resulted in Horizon changing their consenting strategy. The Wales Act 2017, which received Royal Assent on 31 January 2017, introduced changes to the application of the Planning Act 2008 in Wales. Section 43 of the Wales Act permits the inclusion of development commonly referred to as "associated development" within the application for the DCO.
- iii. Significant change in Horizon's Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy. In their informal 'Project Update' consultation in January 2016 and thereafter in PAC2, Horizon consulted on a number of construction worker accommodation options including Land & Lakes (3,500 workers), Madyn A & B (800 workers), Rhosgoch as a 'top up site' if required (1,500 workers) and 500 essential workers accommodated on-site. There has been a fundamental shift in Horizon's Strategy and they now propose to have between 2,500 and 4,000 construction workers on-site. In addition there is now some uncertainty as to whether the consented site at

Land & Lakes will be used as part of this strategy. These changes have the potential to substantially alter the predicted impacts of the construction workers' accommodation and will require detailed consideration. In addition this is likely to be the first time that the communities neighbouring the power station site have been asked to comment on the possibility of having up to 4,000 workers accommodated on site.

Against this setting, the IACC has been formally requested to comment on Horizon's draft revised SOCC which outlines how Horizon propose to undertake the next stages of consultation about their proposed application. However, before the IACC can comment on the revised SOCC (i.e. the how, who, when and where) we must first comment on the 'what' and the 'why' in response to the above project changes.

1. The IACC fully recognise and appreciate that the optimisation process was necessary to make the project commercially viable and investable. The IACC welcome Horizon's openness, dialogue and transparency during this challenging process. This demonstrates the developing maturity in the relationship between Horizon and the IACC and we are eager for this to continue. The IACC would however request confirmation that the optimisation process will not affect the established principles of the (appropriate) community benefit package required for hosting this Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project and will not affect Horizon's 100-year commitment to the residents and communities of Anglesey.
2. The IACC acknowledge Horizon's decision to include the majority of the associated developments within the DCO application. The IACC would however question Horizon's ability to meaningfully consult on all of the associated development elements together with the changes to the power station development within a 28-day consultation period. In PAC2 there was some consideration of the associated development elements but not in the level of detail necessary to allow a complete and meaningful response. Given that lack of detail on associated developments and given that the IACC would have been the determining authority for these applications, the IACC did not make detailed comments on the associated development in its formal response to PAC2. It was anticipated that detailed discussions would have commenced after PAC2 through individual pre-application discussions and consultation (including public consultation). The IACC would therefore strongly encourage Horizon to discuss and liaise with Officers now on the detail of these associated developments and advise that Horizon does not wait until PAC3 before sharing this information.
3. The change in Horizon's Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy is a fundamental change to the project which has the potential to substantially alter the impacts of Wylfa Newydd on North Anglesey. The IACC have always accepted that there will be some essential workers on-site (up to 500 in line with the proposals made by Horizon) but a campus of this scale has never been considered in any detail as it was not put forward as a proposal. With potentially 2,500 – 4,000 workers now proposed in on-site temporary workers accommodation, the IACC and the residents of Anglesey will need time to meaningfully consider these impacts individually and cumulatively. Far more certainty on the proposals for worker accommodation is required to allow meaningful consultation. In the absence of a revised Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy to date, the IACC would request that Horizon clearly outline their worker accommodation strategy in PAC3 and do not consult on worker accommodation options which are not properly reflective of the changes in approach to worker accommodation.

In terms of the structure and contents of the SOCC, the IACC believes that it is broadly fit for purpose and outlines the methodology of how Horizon are going to consult. The SOCC is consistent with previous versions (PAC 2 and January 2016 'Project Update' consultation) which will assist the public in that respect. The IACC do however have a number of comments

on the SOCC, which are further outlined below:

4. Horizon only propose to consult on the changes to the project and not on the project as a whole. The IACC recognise Horizon sharing the draft scope of the consultation and appreciate the logic in the proposed approach. The IACC therefore expect that Horizon will consult on the changes to the Wylfa Newydd site (including worker accommodation), consult on each of the associated developments, the Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy, the Cumulative Impact Assessment and what this means for the Welsh Language. This approach should also be reinforced by Horizon setting out explicitly in their documentation how feedback from previous pre-application consultations has shaped PAC3.
5. As Horizon are fully aware, Local Council and Town and Community Council Elections will take place on 4th May 2017. These elections could potentially result in a significant number of new elected Members who will need time to be briefed on, understand and consider the proposals and influence the various responses. The IACC fully recognise and appreciate Horizon's tight timescale for the consultation process in order to be in a position to submit a Development Consent Order application in 2017. The IACC therefore acknowledges the flexibility Horizon has shown in agreeing to the request to delay the proposed start of the consultation period for three weeks to allow for the post-election bedding in period. However, the 28 days period proposed remains challenging for the IACC to undertake the necessary processes for formal consideration of its PAC3 response. Similarly, the Community Councils have limited capacity to respond during this period. Should the consultation be commenced in May to accord with the revised SOCC timescale then the proposed consultation period requires to be extended to ensure there is sufficient time to consider Horizon's proposals. As an overriding principle, the public should be given as much time as possible to consider and respond to this hugely complex project of national significance and should not be constrained to 28 days around the election when there are already high levels of information being communicated to them and there is a real danger of confusion and consultation fatigue in the public.

Given the scale of the project changes, the IACC believe that a 28-day consultation period is insufficient for PAC3. The IACC would strongly request that Horizon considers a longer consultation period to allow the IACC and the public to meaningfully consider, digest and respond to the project changes. The changes to the design and layout of the power station, changes to the consenting strategy as well as changes to the worker accommodation strategy are significant changes that merit a longer consultation period. In accordance with DCLG Guidance, consultation deadlines should be realistic and proportionate to the project, in this case we do not believe that objective will be met with a 28 day period.

In conclusion, the IACC welcomes the proposed delay in commencement of the consultation period to allow for newly elected Councils to 'bed in'. We also acknowledge your sharing of the scope for the PAC3 consultation. Whilst this will focus on changes post PAC2, it is the IACC's view that these changes would benefit from a consultation period longer than 28 days to allow sufficient time for public consideration and feedback.

I look forward to continuing to develop the positive working relationship between Horizon and the Council over the coming months and to your revised proposal in relation to the consultation strategy.

**Ymateb Cyngor Sir Ynys Môn i'r Datganiad o Ymgynghori Cymunedol (y Datganiad) gan
Pŵer Niwclear Horizon (yn unol ag Adran 47 Deddf Cynllunio 2008).**

Y llythyr hwn yw ymateb ffurfiol Cyngor Sir Ynys Môn (CSYM) i'r Datganiad o Ymgynghori Cymunedol (y Datganiad) ar gyfer Prosiect Wylfa Newydd a dderbyniwyd ar 13 Mawrth 2017. Yn unol â darpariaethau Adran 47 (3) Deddf Cynllunio 2008, mae gan Gyngor Sir Ynys Môn 28 diwrnod i ymateb, gyda'r cyfnod hwnnw'n dechrau ar y diwrnod ar ôl i'r awdurdod lleol dderbyn y dogfennau ymgynghori. Y dyddiad cau felly yw 10 Ebrill 2017.

Ers cau'r ymgynghoriad Cam 2 (PAC2) ar 25 Hydref 2016, 'rydym yn deall y bu newidiadau sylweddol a sylfaenol i'r prosiect Wylfa Newydd. Mae hyn wedi sbarduno'r angen am ymgynghoriad Cam 3 (PAC3) fel y gall Horizon ymgynghori'n gyhoeddus ar y newidiadau hyn. Yn fyr, 'rydym yn deall y gellir crynhoi'r newidiadau i'r prosiect fel a ganlyn:

- I. Newid i sgôp, dyluniad a gosodiad yr orsaf bŵer yn dilyn 'optimeiddio'.
- II. Newid mewn deddfwriaeth sydd wedi golygu bod Horizon wedi newid eu strategaeth ganiatáu. Mae Deddf Cymru 2017, a gafodd Gydsyniad Brenhinol ar 31 Ionawr 2017, wedi cyflwyno newidiadau i'r ffordd o weithredu Deddf Cynllunio 2008 yng Nghymru. Mae Adran 43 y Ddeddf yn caniatáu cynnwys datblygiad y cyfeirir ato'n aml fel "datblygiad cysylltiedig" o fewn y cais am y Gorchymyn Caniatâd Datblygu. (GCD)
- III. Newid sylweddol yn Strategaeth Horizon ar gyfer Lletya Gweithwyr Adeiladu. Yn eu hymgyngoriad anffurfiol 'Diweddarriad ar y Prosiect' ym mis Ionawr 2016 ac ar ôl hynny yn PAC2, ymgynghorodd Horizon ar nifer o opsiynau i letya gweithwyr adeiladu, gan gynnwys Land & Lakes (3,500 o weithwyr), Madyn A & B (800 o weithwyr), safle yn Rhosgoch fel safle 'atodol' os bydd angen (1,500 o weithwyr) a 500 o weithwyr hanfodol

yn cael eu lletya ar y safle. Bu newid sylfaenol yn Strategaeth Horizon ac maent bellach yn bwriadu cael rhwng 2,500 a 4,000 o weithwyr adeiladu ar y safle. Yn ogystal, mae yna rywfaint o ansicrwydd erbyn hyn yngylch defnyddio safle Land & Lakes, sydd wedi derbyn caniatâd cynllunio, fel rhan o'r strategaeth hon. Gall y newidiadau hyn effeithio'n sylweddol ar yr effeithiau a ragwelir yn sgil y llety ar gyfer gweithwyr adeiladu a bydd gofyn rhoi sylw manwl iddynt. Yn ogystal, mae'n debygol mai hwn yw'r tro cyntaf y gofynnir i'r cymunedau sy'n gyfagos i safle'r orsaf bŵer gyflwyno sylwadau ar y posibilrwydd o letya hyd at 4,000 o weithwyr ar y safle.

Yn erbyn y cyd-destun hwn, gofynnwyd yn ffurfiol i Gyngor Sir Ynys Môn gyflwyno sylwadau ar y Datganiad drafft diwygiedig gan Horizon sy'n amlinellu sut mae Horizon yn bwriadu ymgymryd â'r camau ymgynghori nesaf yngylch eu cais arfaethedig. Fodd bynnag, cyn y gall CSYM wneud sylwadau ar y Datganiad diwygiedig (h.y. sut, pwy, pryd a ble) rhaid i ni wneud sylwadau yn gyntaf ar y 'beth' a'r 'pam' mewn ymateb i'r newidiadau uchod i'r prosiect.

1. Mae CSYM yn cydnabod ac yn deall yn llwyr fod angen y broses optimeiddio i wneud y prosiect yn fasnachol hyfwy ac yn ddeniadol i fuddsoddwyr. Mae CSYM yn croesawu agoredrwydd, a thryloywder Horizon yn ystod y broses heriol hon a'r dialog a gafwyd. Mae hyn yn dangos yr aeddfedrwydd sy'n datblygu yn y berthynas rhwng Horizon a CSYM ac rydym yn awyddus i hyn barhau. Fodd bynnag, mae CSYM yn gofyn am gadarnhad na fydd y broses optimeiddio yn effeithio ar egwyddorion a sefydlwyd ar gyfer y pecyn budd cymunedol (priodol) sydd raid wrtho ar gyfer cynnal y Prosiect Seilwaith hwn sydd o Arwyddocâd Cenedlaethol ac na fydd yn effeithio ar ymrwymiad 100 mlynedd Horizon i drigolion a chymunedau Ynys Môn.
2. Mae CSYM yn cydnabod penderfyniad Horizon i gynnwys y rhan fwyaf o'r datblygiadau cysylltiedig o fewn y cais am Orchymyn Caniatâd Datblygu. Fodd bynnag, mae CSYM yn cwestiynu gallu Horizon i ymgynghori'n ystyrlon ar yr holl elfennau datblygiadau cysylltiedig, ynghyd â'r newidiadau i ddatblygiad yr orsaf ynni, o fewn cyfnod ymgynghori o 28 diwrnod. 'Roedd PAC2 yn cynnwys rhywfaint o ystyriaeth o'r elfennau datblygiadau cysylltiedig, ond nid mewn digon o fanylder i ganiatâu ymateb cyflawn ac ystyrlon. O gofio'r diffyg manylion am y datblygiadau cysylltiedig ac o ystyried mai CSYM fyddai wedi bod yn penderfynu'r ceisiadau hynny, ni chyflwynodd CSYM sylwadau manwl ar y datblygiadau cysylltiedig yn ei ymateb ffurfiol i PAC2. Rhagwelwyd y byddai trafodaethau manwl wedi cychwyn ar ôl PAC2 ar ffurf trafodaethau cyn cyflwyno ceisiadau unigol a thrwy ymgynghori (gan gynnwys ymgynghoriad cyhoeddus). Byddai CSYM felly yn annog Horizon yn gryf i drafod a chydgylltu â swyddogion yn awr yngylch manylion y datblygiadau cysylltiedig hyn, gan gynghori na ddylai Horizon aros tan PAC3 cyn rhannu'r wybodaeth hon.
3. Mae'r newid yn y Strategaeth Horizon ar gyfer Lletya Gweithwyr Adeiladu yn newid sylfaenol i'r prosiect sydd â'r potensial i newid yn sylweddol effeithiau Wylfa Newydd ar Ogledd Ynys Môn. Mae CSYM wedi derbyn o'r cychwyn y bydd rhai gweithwyr hanfodol ar y safle (hyd at 500 yn unol â'r cynigion a wnaed gan Horizon) ond nid yw campws ar y raddfa hon erioed wedi cael sylw manwl gan na chafodd ei gyflwyno fel cynig. Gan y cynigir yn awr y gall bod rhwng 2,500 a 4,000 o weithwyr ar y safle mewn llety gweithwyr dros dro, bydd CSYM a thrigolion Ynys Môn angen amser i ystyried yr effeithiau hyn yn ofalus, sef yr effeithiau yn unigol ac yn gronol. Mae angen llawer mwy o sicrwydd yngylch y cynigion ar gyfer llety gweithwyr er mwyn caniatâu ymgynghoriad ystyrlon. Yn absenoldeb Strategaeth ddiwygiedig hyd yma ar gyfer

Lletya Gweithiwr Adeiladu, mae CSYM yn gofyn i Horizon amlinellu'n glir eu strategaeth ar gyfer lletya gweithwyr yn PAC3 ac nad yw'n ymgynghori ar opsiynau llety gweithwyr nad ydynt yn adlewyrchu'n briodol y newidiadau yn y dull o letya gweithwyr.

O ran strwythur a chynnwys y Datganiad, mae CSYM yn credu ei fod yn addas i'r diben yn gyffredinol a'i fod yn amlinellu'r fethodoleg mewn perthynas â sut mae Horizon yn bwriadu ymgynghori. Mae'r Datganiad yn gyson â'r fersiynau blaenorol (PAC 2 a'r ymgynghoriad 'Diweddarriad ar Brosiect' yn Ionawr 2016) a bydd hynny o gymorth i'r cyhoedd yn hyn o beth. Fodd bynnag, mae gan CSYM nifer o sylwadau ar y Datganiad fel yr amlinellir ymhellach isod:


4. Nid yw Horizon ond yn cynnig ymgynghori ar y newidiadau i'r prosiect ac nid ar y prosiect yn ei gyfanrwydd. Mae CSYM yn cydnabod Horizon yn rhannu sgôp draftyr ymgynghoriad ac yn deall y rhesymeg yn y dull arfaethedig o weithredu. Mae CSYM felly yn disgwyl y bydd Horizon yn ymgynghori ar y newidiadau i safle Wylfa Newydd (yn cynnwys llety gweithwyr) ac yn ymgynghori ar bob un o'r datblygiadau cysylltiedig, y Strategaeth Llety Gweithwyr Adeiladu, yr Asesiad o'r Effaith Gronnol a beth mae hyn yn ei olygu ar gyfer yr Iaith Gymraeg. Dylid atgyfnerthu'r dull hwn o weithredu trwy i Horizon ddangos yn gwbl eglur a diamwys yn eu dogfennaeth sut mae atborth a gafwyd o ymgynghoriadau cyn ymgeisio a gynhaliwyd eisoes wedi siapio PAC3.
5. Fel y gŵyr Horizon yn iawn, cynhelir Etholiadau'r Cyngor Sir ac Etholiadau Cynghorau Tref a Chymuned lleol ar 4 Mai 2017. Gallai'r etholiadau hyn arwain at weld nifer sylweddol o Aelodau etholedig newydd a bydd angen amser arnynt i gael eu briffio ac i ddeall ac ystyried y cynigion a dylanwadu ar y gwahanol ymatebion. Mae CSYM yn llwyr sylweddoli ac yn cydnabod bod amserlen Horizon yn dynn ar gyfer y broses ymgynghori er mwyn bod mewn sefyllfa i gyflwyno cais Gorchymyn Caniatâd Datblygu yn 2017. Mae CSYM felly yn cydnabod yr hyblygrwydd a ddangoswyd gan Horizon wrth gytuno i'r cais i ohirio dyddiad cychwyn arfaethedig y cyfnod ymgynghori am dair wythnos i ganiatâu ar gyfer cyfnod o ymsefydlu ar ôl yr etholiad. Fodd bynnag, mae'r cyfnod o 28 diwrnod a gynigir yn parhau i fod yn heriol i CSYM o ran ymgymryd â'r prosesau angenrheidiol ar gyfer ystyried ei ymateb i PAC3 yn ffurfiol. Yn yr un modd, mae capaciti'r Cynghorau Cymuned i ymateb yn ystod y cyfnod hwn yn gyfyngedig hefyd. Os bydd yr ymgynghoriad yn cychwyn ym mis Mai i gyd-fynd â'r amserlen ddiwygiedig ar gyfer y Datganiad, yna bydd angen ymestyn y cyfnod ymgynghori arfaethedig i sicrhau bod digon o amser i ystyried cynigion Horizon. Fel yr egwyddor bwysicaf, dylai'r cyhoedd gael cymaint o amser ag y bo modd i ystyried ac ymateb i'r prosiect hynod gymhleth hwn sydd o arwyddocâd cenedlaethol ac ni ddylid eu cyfyngu i 28 diwrnod o gwmpas yr etholiad pan fyddant eisoes yn cael llawer iawn o wybodaeth a phan fo perygl gwirioneddol o ddryswnch a blinder ymgynghori ymmsg y cyhoedd.

Wylfa Newydd Project – A proposed new nuclear power station on Anglesey

This Statement of Community Consultation relates to Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited's (Horizon's) proposals to develop a new nuclear power station on Anglesey – the Wylfa Newydd Project.

We have produced this update to our January 2016 Statement of Community Consultation as we are proposing some significant changes to the project design. We have decided to carry out a further phase of formal consultation on these changes before the submission of our Development Consent Order (DCO) later in 2017.

In addition to the evolution of the project design there have been changes in the law. The Wales Act 2017 allows developers to include associated developments (such as park and ride facilities or temporary workers' accommodation) within the DCO for the power station. Our further consultation will include a number of associated developments now to be included in the DCO.

Who is Horizon and what is the Wylfa Newydd Project?

The Horizon group of companies, which is ultimately owned by Hitachi, Ltd., is developing a new generation of nuclear power stations to help meet the UK's need for safe, affordable, low carbon energy. Nuclear power can play a vital role in meeting the challenge of maintaining secure energy supplies for the UK, while also tackling the global threat of climate change by meeting emissions reduction targets.

As part of our Project, we are proposing to construct and operate a new nuclear power station, which will be known as 'Wylfa Newydd'. It will comprise two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors (supplied by Hitachi-GE Nuclear Energy, Ltd.) and associated plant, structures and features (the Power Station), together with associated development to support its delivery. The Power Station will have a capacity of at least 2,700 megawatts of electricity, producing enough power for around five million homes.

The main plant and structures of the operational Power Station will be situated next to the existing Magnox power station, to the west of Cemaes, on Anglesey. We intend to be generating electricity at Wylfa Newydd by 2025.

Horizon Nuclear Power – Our Vision and Mission

We believe there is a compelling requirement for new nuclear power in the UK to help tackle the vital and complex challenge of delivering a sustainable energy future. Nuclear power is a key element of the UK's energy mix. We will deliver secure, affordable, low carbon energy for present and future generations.

Our mission is to build a new, leading, UK nuclear utility company, successfully developing, constructing and operating UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors on Anglesey and at Oldbury-on-Severn in South Gloucestershire.

Horizon is committed to working with our host community of Anglesey, and the wider North Wales region, to ensure that these communities benefit from the positive socio-economic impacts of a UK significant infrastructure project. For example, we are committed to recruiting locally and developing skills and the supply chain whilst safeguarding the Welsh language and culture. Horizon recognises that Wylfa Newydd is a 100 year project from development, construction through to operation and eventually decommissioning.

What is a Statement of Community Consultation and how does it relate to the consenting process?

The Power Station is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project under the Planning Act 2008 and we will need to make an application to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy for a DCO under that Act to authorise it and its associated developments.

Consultation is an important part of the planning and development process and the Planning Act 2008 requires developers to publicise their proposals widely as well as consulting with the local community, local authorities, statutory bodies and persons with an interest in land potentially affected by the proposed Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project. This process is referred to as 'pre-application consultation' and must be carried out before an application for a DCO can be accepted by the Planning Inspectorate on behalf of the Secretary of State.

In particular, section 47 of the Planning Act 2008 requires developers to prepare a Statement of Community Consultation explaining how they will consult with people potentially affected by the development of a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project, including people living in the vicinity of the proposals. This document is therefore an important part of the consenting process, guiding us through effective consultation on our proposals before making an application for a DCO.

We published our first Statement of Community Consultation in September 2014. In January 2016, we produced an update reflecting changes to our approach to consultation.

Following some significant changes to the project, and emerging changes in the law under the Wales Act 2017, we are now producing this further update. As required by the Planning Act 2008, we have consulted with the relevant local authority, Isle of Anglesey County Council, on a draft of this Statement of Community Consultation and our strategic approach as described in this document.

We will make copies of this Statement of Community Consultation available to people living in the vicinity of our proposals by providing copies on our website and in libraries across Anglesey, Gwynedd and Conwy, and by advertising this in local and regional newspapers.

This Statement of Community Consultation explains:

- **what** we are proposing to develop – comprising a brief description of the Wylfa Newydd Project, including the associated developments;
- **the consenting process** – including our programme and how environmental effects are assessed in order to identify the Project's potential benefits and adverse effects;
- **when** we will be consulting;
- **who and where** we will be consulting;
- **how** we will consult with people, groups and community organisations; and
- **how** consultees can respond to the consultation and find out about how feedback has been taken into account.

The Wylfa Newydd Project

The main permanent development we are seeking consent for is the Power Station which will include the two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors and supporting buildings together with the steam turbines, electrical generators, and related plant (such as cooling water infrastructure and breakwaters), waste and spent fuel storage buildings, and supporting structures and features (such as roads and landscaping).

A number of other associated developments will be required to support the construction and operation of the Power Station. These include a park and ride facility, temporary workers' accommodation and a logistics centre, all of which would also be included in the DCO application.

It is also anticipated that the DCO will incorporate a marine off-loading facility (MOLF), used for deliveries directly to the Power Station site by sea in addition to other integral off-site facilities for the operation of the Power Station (a mobile emergency equipment garage, an alternative emergency control centre and an environmental survey laboratory) provided locally to, but geographically separate from, the main Power Station development site.

Road improvements will be needed in the north west of the island to support construction and operation of the Power Station and will be consented as associated development either through the DCO application (for new stretches of road) or through an application for planning permission to the Isle of Anglesey County Council (for the improvement of existing roads).

Some enabling works, such as site preparation, may be progressed through applications for planning permission to Isle of Anglesey County Council. We carried out consultation under s.61Z of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 for some of these early works last year and we may re-consult at a future date separately from the consultation described in this Statement of Community Consultation.

There is a need for the Power Station to be connected to the National Grid electricity transmission network, and consultation on the necessary DCO application to implement a grid connection is being progressed separately by National Grid.



WHAT IS THE CONSENTING PROCESS?

The Wales Act 2017 enables DCOs in Wales to include a wide range of associated development. Previously this was required to be permitted by planning permission from the local planning authority, which in the case of this Project is the Isle of Anglesey County Council.

We now plan to include most of the associated development elements of the Wylfa Newydd Project in our DCO application. This means that as well as the Power Station, the MOLF and the off-site power station facilities, the DCO application will now also include the temporary workers accommodation, a park and ride facility, a logistics centre, and key highway improvements.

A number of other related developments (including site preparation works, improvements to the existing highway and the visitor centre) will be consented through applications for planning permission made to the Isle of Anglesey County Council. Consultations will be held on these applications in due course.

The Planning Inspectorate will need to be satisfied that we have carried out effective pre-application consultation, in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act 2008. Following acceptance and examination of the DCO application, the Planning Inspectorate will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy who will make the final determination as to whether to grant a DCO for the Wylfa Newydd Project, in line with policy.

The Secretary of State has set out policies in relation to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects in National Policy Statements. The Planning Inspectorate must consider, and the Secretary of State must determine, whether our application for a DCO is in accordance with the following National Policy Statements:

Overarching National Policy Statement for Energy (NPS EN-1)

This National Policy Statement sets out the national framework for energy development. It establishes the urgent need in the UK for new low carbon electricity generation.

National Policy Statement for Nuclear Energy Generation (NPS EN-6)

This National Policy Statement identifies the Wylfa Newydd site as one of a number of sites in the UK that the Government considers to be potentially suitable for the deployment of a new nuclear power station. It also establishes the framework for considering DCO applications for new nuclear projects.

Together, these National Policy Statements establish that there is an urgent need for new electricity generating capacity, including nuclear. EN-6 makes clear that an application for a DCO for a new nuclear power station should be assessed on the basis that "the need for such infrastructure has been demonstrated". As such, we will not be consulting on the principle of nuclear power, or the suitability of the Wylfa Newydd site for a new nuclear power station; instead the consultation will seek views on the specific proposals that we put forward.

In addition we will need to apply for a Marine Licence (for works in the sea) as well as other environmental permits.



HOW ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS ARE ASSESSED

The Power Station is classified as an environmental impact assessment development under Schedule 1 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009. This means that an Environmental Statement, describing the environmental effects of the project, must be prepared to accompany the DCO application.

We have provided Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) and updates to PEI during all our consultation rounds. In our third pre-application consultation we will be providing further updated environmental information, focusing on the effects of the changes to the Project.

POTENTIAL BENEFITS AND EFFECTS


The Wylfa Newydd Project would bring significant (multi-billion pound) investment and benefits to the economy of Anglesey and North Wales during its development, operation and decommissioning.

Already the Project is having a positive impact. Last year, approximately £12.3m was invested in the local supply chain, and these benefits will continue to grow. We expect to deliver:

- **25%** local economic growth during construction;
- **12** more local apprentices starting in 2017, on top of the **10** already recruited;
- development and delivery of 'Futures' – our education engagement programme;
- significant investment in local training facilities, including a **£1 million** investment in Coleg Menai's new Engineering Centre; and
- over **£20 million** every year in wages alone into the local economy throughout 60 years of operation.

A maximum of 9,000 construction workers will work at Wylfa Newydd during peak periods. This includes construction workers at the main Power Station site, off-site Power Station facilities and associated developments. The Project will also create and support further employment and supply chain opportunities in support services and industries.

Once operational, we expect up to 850 permanent jobs at the Power Station across a wide range of roles. Approximately 1,000 additional workers will be required during planned periods of plant outage for maintenance.



The Wylfa Newydd Project would be a large construction scheme, with major activities taking place on the Wylfa Newydd site and surrounding area over a number of years. Once constructed, the Power Station would become a significant feature within the landscape.

We will include information on the potential community and environmental effects of the proposed changes, covering issues such as socio-economics, Welsh language, recreation, traffic and transport, noise, air quality, soils, hydrology, ecology, the marine environment, landscape and views. Information will be included on measures that we propose to reduce any potential adverse effects such as landscaping and the provision of new wildlife features and habitats. Our consultation information will also outline the potential environmental and socio-economic mitigation we will provide to reduce impacts on local communities and enhance the benefits of the Project.

What and when will we consult on the Wylfa Newydd Project?

In mid-2017, we will be conducting a third stage of pre-application consultation. We are consulting on proposed changes to the Project as a result of ongoing design development, changes in the law and in response to consultation responses received from our previous rounds of consultation. Those changes that we are consulting on are:

- changes to our proposed construction worker accommodation strategy, including a reduction in the number of workers likely to be required to deliver the Project and an increase in number of workers that we are proposing to accommodate on the main Power Station site;
- potential consequential changes to the number of locations where temporary worker accommodation needs to be delivered;
- changes to the design and operation of our proposed park and ride site at Dalar Hir and logistics centre site at Parc Cybi; and
- we are now proposing that the off-site power station facilities, the mobile emergency equipment garage (MEEG), alternative emergency control centre (AECC) and environmental survey laboratory (ESL), would be on the single site previously proposed to accommodate the MEEG, in Llanfaethlu.

In addition we will be sharing our updated plans for the main Power Station site. It will still include the two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors and supporting buildings, structures and features; however we have made changes to move the reactors closer together and reduce the footprint of the Power Station.

We will ensure consultation is inclusive and clear by providing consultees with information that can be easily understood, using visual material where appropriate. This will enable constructive and informed comments on the Wylfa Newydd Project. The consultation materials will explain elements of the proposals on which we are actively seeking the views of the local community and stakeholders.

We will publish the details of consultation dates, venues, and where documents can be reviewed on our website www.horizonnuclearpower.com/consultation and in advertisements placed in local newspapers approximately four weeks in advance (depending on local newspaper publication dates).

If necessary we may also carry out additional targeted public consultation on specific issues. Such consultation would also be advertised approximately four weeks in advance.

We also continue to undertake regular community engagement through open surgeries, which are widely advertised in advance in local newspapers and on our website www.horizonnuclearpower.com/consultation, and the Wylfa Newydd Project Liaison Group. Newsletters about the progress of the Wylfa Newydd Project will continue to be delivered regularly to all Anglesey households.

Once we have analysed and taken account of consultation feedback, we propose to make our application for a DCO later in 2017.




Figure 4: Our consultation approach

Who are we consulting and where?

We will continue to consult with the communities identified below, across Zones A, B and C. However, anyone can provide feedback on our proposals for the Wylfa Newydd Project and written information will be made widely available, to ensure consultation is effective and accessible.

Our consultation process will take place across the three 'zones' which are:

- **Zone A** – Anglesey, which is the area most likely to be directly affected by the Wylfa Newydd Project;
- **Zone B** – Gwynedd (Arfon) area, which includes Bangor and Caernarfon; and
- **Zone C** – North West Wales, as defined by the Welsh Government, including key centres of population and business, such as Llandudno and Porthmadog and the Conwy County Borough Council area.

We recognise that residents, communities, organisations and other stakeholders will have different requirements for information and our process of consultation will reflect this. For example, in Zone A we expect many discussions will focus on the direct effects of construction and operation, whereas in Zone C, interest may well be on broader economic and social matters, such as employment opportunities.

We will target engagement events appropriately at those who are potentially most affected by the Wylfa Newydd Project, whilst recognising that those who are less directly affected may also want to take part in consultation events.




Figure 5: Consultation zones

As well as consulting with the wider public and their representatives, we will also work with specific groups, local businesses, community councils, county councils and other community groups and organisations to increase awareness of the consultation process. To help ensure consultation is as accessible as possible, we have developed a Maximising Inclusion Strategy, a copy of which is uploaded on our website, with hard copies available on request. This aims to ensure that we work with organisations across the community to ensure that people have reasonable opportunity to access information about the Wylfa Newydd Project and respond to the consultation should they wish to do so.

In particular, we will continue to work with the Isle of Anglesey County Council to implement locally relevant good consultation practice, such as that developed through the Community Voice project, and to support the work of Community Involvement Officers.

We will work with organisations across the community to provide people with information about our Wylfa Newydd Project and ensure they have appropriate opportunities to respond. This will be an integral part of all our consultation activity.

How will we be consulting?

The Stage Three consultation will focus largely on the changes to the Project which have arisen since previous consultations. It will last for 30 days.

Like Stage One and Stage Two, our Stage Three consultation will be structured around a series of small exhibition events and drop-in sessions that allow people to meet our team, ask questions and provide feedback. These events will be spread across Zones A, B and C and will be targeted at those areas anticipated to be most directly affected by the Wylfa Newydd Project. The consultations will include overview, summary and display materials in Welsh and English, written in clear, easy to read language.

We will seek to pro-actively engage with interested parties by attending local events e.g. markets and hold a number of small pop-up events in locations identified to have high footfall. This will provide opportunities for people who may not otherwise engage with us to learn more about the Project and provide feedback. Members of the community who are interested in the Wylfa Newydd Project will also be able to access information at local libraries and other civic buildings, although these locations will be unstaffed unless otherwise stated.

Any additional targeted consultation focussing on specific issues following Stage Three consultation will be largely based around short summary documents although limited community meetings may be required.

Non-technical materials produced for all consultations and engagement activities will be bilingual. Welsh speakers will be available at staffed events and consultation feedback will be welcomed in both Welsh and English. Our consultation document will include details of how to request information in large print and we have a freephone number to help with enquiries in Welsh and English on **0800 954 9516**.

All consultation documents, including those from past consultations, are available via our website at www.horizonnuclearpower.com/consultation.



HOW WILL THE CONSULTATION BE ADVERTISED?

We use a number of ways to communicate about the consultation process and ensure the community can take part. We will consider all types of suitable media for communication and will work with representative groups, including the Isle of Anglesey County Council Communications Team, to maximise our effectiveness.

As a minimum these will include:

- **newsletters** – Our bilingual Community Update is delivered to around 33,000 households across Anglesey and is also downloadable from our website. It provides detail on the consultation, including how to get involved and where more information can be found. We will publish an edition ahead of the consultation;
- **press adverts** – We will place adverts in a variety of local publications detailing our consultation, including event locations and timings, in Welsh and English language, local and regional media;
- **press releases** – Consultation events will be announced via press releases and we will offer press briefings to local publications and local radio, in Welsh and English;
- **posters** – Posters will be placed in civic buildings such as libraries and community halls and will be issued to community groups and organisations. These will detail event locations and how people can find out more about consultation;
- **Wylfa Newydd Project Liaison Group** – This is an independent stakeholder liaison group and is designed to channel information between us via community representatives to the wider community and vice versa. A meeting will be held at the start of the consultation;
- **stakeholders, groups and organisations** – We will engage with a range of stakeholders and organisations to make them aware of the consultation and, where appropriate, provide details of how people can get involved;
- **website** – All consultation documentation and details of all stages of consultation, including event locations and timings, will be available on our website at www.horizonnuclearpower.com/consultation and the website will be clearly signposted in all literature;
- **social media** – We will use Twitter and YouTube to publicise each stage of consultation with the introduction of other social media channels as appropriate. We will actively engage in the conversations occurring throughout the consultation on social media and will review activity to identify any key issues that may trend in relation to our Project; and
- **other media** – We will contact local media outlets (e.g. radio stations and newspapers) before and during the consultation to ensure local people are kept up to date.

How can I respond?

Your response to our public consultation is a very important part of the pre-application consultation process and can be submitted in either Welsh or English. There are a number of ways in which you can respond:

- **in person**, at any of our events. We will be on hand to help you complete and provide written feedback, ensuring your views are captured completely;







Important – your property rights may be affected

I'm writing to you because you own, occupy or have an interest in land on or near to proposed highway improvements associated with our proposals for building Wylfa Newydd, a new nuclear power station on Anglesey (Wylfa Newydd), or you may have a right to statutory compensation in respect of those improvements.

Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited is launching Stage Three of its pre-application consultation on Wednesday 24 May. This consultation focuses on updates we've made to Wylfa Newydd, since the previous stage of consultation in Autumn last year.

We are proposing eight sections of highway improvements along the A5025, including new stretches of road at five locations:

- Section 1 - A5/A5025 Valley junction: this work creates a bypass to the east of Valley, between the A5 (south of Valley) and a new junction with the A5025 to the north of Valley.
- Section 3 - Llanfachraeth: this work creates a bypass to the east of Llanfachraeth with a new 2km highway.
- Section 5 - Llanfaethlu: this work creates a bypass of Llanfaethlu and straightens two existing bends near the Black Lion pub and the Old Coffee Shop.
- Section 7 - Llanrhuddlad: this work creates a bypass of two existing bends in Llanrhuddlad between Llanrhuddlad and Cefn Coch. The road leading to Llanfechell to the east of the proposed bypass would be stopped-up and the existing staggered cross-roads along the A5025 between Llanrhuddlad and Llanfechell would be removed.
- Power Station Access Road: this work provides a new roundabout junction from the A5025 to link with the proposed access road to Wylfa Newydd.

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We call these new sections of road our "Off-line Highway Improvements". Works in Sections 2, 4,6 and part of 8 are improvements to the existing highway.

These Off-line Highway Improvements are similar to those that we have consulted on previously. However, after reviewing our plans and undertaking further assessment we are proposing the following refinements:

- Section 1: The bypass has been moved further east to ensure the new highway is located outside the flood zone. (The previous proposal was to raise the road above the flood zone.) A cycling and pedestrian path to the south of the roundabout (away from the carriageway edge) is now proposed.
- Section 3: The bypass will continue to include an elevated viaduct across the Afon Alaw, however the proposed viaduct is now around 25m longer to provide more clearance beyond the riverbanks (which respond to further flood modelling). Additional land to the east is included to allow for Great Crested Newt environmental mitigation.
- Section 5: Additional land to the west of the Llanfaethlu road straightening is now included for Great Crested Newt environmental mitigation.
- Section 7: The carriageway of these road improvements are now narrowed slightly at each end to reduce the need for earthworks and, at the northern end, to avoid earthworks within an area of ancient woodland.
- A new roundabout to connect the Power Station access road to the A5025 south of Tregel.

Following the introduction of the Wales Act 2017, we are now seeking consent for these Off-line Highway Improvements as part of our Development Consent Order for Wylfa Newydd, rather than by a separate planning permission from the Isle of Anglesey County Council as was previously required.

Horizon wishes to acquire the land required for highway improvements through voluntary agreements with landowners. However, if negotiations have not succeeded at the point where Horizon needs to apply for a Development Consent Order it may, as a last resort, apply for compulsory acquisition powers as part of that application.

If you are currently in negotiation with Horizon in respect of your land interests, our preference still remains to reach agreement with you in a timely manner rather than to fall back on powers of compulsory acquisition. If Horizon has previously reached agreement with you in respect of your land interests please be assured that such agreement remains unaffected.

We recommend that you review the enclosed plans showing the red line boundaries relating to the Off-line Highway Improvements to identify whether your land or property may be affected. Should you consider this to be the case I would encourage you to feed in to the Stage Three consultation process at your earliest opportunity so that your comments can be considered. Further details are also provided at pages 32-34 of our Consultation Overview Document.





I'm writing to inform you that Horizon Nuclear Power is launching its Stage Three pre-application consultation on Wednesday 24 May, and because you own, occupy or have an interest in land near to the Power Station site we wanted to let you know.

This consultation focuses on updates we've made to our proposals for building Wylfa Newydd, a new nuclear power station on Anglesey, since our stage two consultation last autumn. After reviewing our plans, we've redesigned the Power Station site layout to move the reactors closer together. This reduces the area of the Power Station and moves the perimeter fence further away from the A5025 and local communities.

As a result of the redesign, some other elements of our proposals have changed including our strategy for housing construction workers. We're now proposing to accommodate up to 4,000 workers on-site in a temporary Site Campus with dedicated facilities. 



Notice is hereby given that Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited (the "Applicant") of Sunrise House 1420 Charlton Court, Gloucester Business Park, Gloucester, GL3 4AE proposes to apply to the Secretary of State under s37 of the Planning Act 2008 for an order granting development consent ("DCO") for the construction, operation and maintenance of a new nuclear power station and other development, at Wylfa, Anglesey ("Wylfa Newydd Project").
2. The Applicant is part of the Horizon Nuclear Power Limited group of companies and is wholly owned by Hitachi, Limited, the headquarters of which is in Tokyo, Japan.
3. The application for the Wylfa Newydd Project is anticipated to be submitted in the third quarter of 2017.
4. The Wylfa Newydd Project is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project for the purposes of the Planning Act 2008 and requires development consent under that Act. Horizon proposes to apply for a DCO for the Wylfa Newydd Project which would include the following principal elements:
 - (a) *Development on the main power station site including:*
 - (i) Two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors (UK ABWR) with a combined electrical output of approximately 2,700MWe and related plant located on the north coast of Anglesey to the west of Cemaes.
 - (ii) Reactor, control, service and turbine buildings and other supporting facilities, buildings, structures, features and works which are integral to the generating station including:
 - (A) Radioactive waste and spent fuel storage buildings
 - (B) Electrical connection to National Grid substation
 - (C) Marine works comprising a cooling water system, marine off-loading facility, breakwater structures, and navigational lighting and safety systems
 - (D) Administration building and training and simulator building
 - (E) Landscape works and planting including drainage, foul drainage and surface water management systems and footpath works
5. Horizon also intends to bring forward applications for planning permission under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 for works which support, but which will not form part of, the DCO application. These include applications for:
 - (a) Site Preparation and Clearance works
 - (b) Online highways improvements on the A5025
 - (c) A visitor and media reception centre

6. 1. Notice is hereby given that Horizon Nuclear Power Wylfa Limited (the "Applicant") of Sunrise House 1420 Charlton Court, Gloucester Business Park, Gloucester, GL3 4AE proposes to apply to the Secretary of State under s37 of the Planning Act 2008 for an order granting development consent ("DCO") for the construction, operation and maintenance of a new nuclear power station and other development, at Wylfa, Anglesey ("Wylfa Newydd Project").
2. The Applicant is part of the Horizon Nuclear Power Limited group of companies and is wholly owned by Hitachi, Limited, the headquarters of which is in Tokyo, Japan.
3. The application for the Wylfa Newydd Project is anticipated to be submitted in the third quarter of 2017.
4. The Wylfa Newydd Project is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project for the purposes of the Planning Act 2008 and requires development consent under that Act. Horizon proposes to apply for a DCO for the Wylfa Newydd Project which would include the following principal elements:
 - (a) *Development on the main power station site including:*
 - (i) Two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors (UK ABWR) with a combined electrical output of approximately 2,700MWe and related plant located on the north coast of Anglesey to the west of Cemaes.
 - (ii) Reactor, control, service and turbine buildings and other supporting facilities, buildings, structures, features and works which are integral to the generating station including:
 - (A) Radioactive waste and spent fuel storage buildings
 - (B) Electrical connection to National Grid substation
 - (C) Marine works comprising a cooling water system, marine off-loading facility, breakwater structures, and navigational lighting and safety systems
 - (D) Administration building and training and simulator building
 - (E) Landscape works and planting including drainage, foul drainage and surface water management systems and footpath works
 - (F) Public Access works including closure and diversion of public rights of way
 - (G) A power station access road and internal site roads
 - (H) Car parking
 - (I) Construction sites, laydown areas, working areas, temporary works and structures, and temporary construction viewing area
 - (J) Diversion of utilities
 - (K) Main perimeter fence and construction fence
5. Horizon also intends to bring forward applications for planning permission under to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 for works which support, but which will not form part of, the DCO application. These include applications for:
 - (a) Site Preparation and Clearance works
 - (b) Online highways improvements on the A5025
 - (c) A visitor and media reception centre
 - (d) Other related and enabling works as needed to support delivery of the Project
6. The proposed DCO will also seek various other powers including provisions permitting the compulsory acquisition of interests and rights in land, the temporary use of land, interference with rights and the closure or diversion of streets and other public rights of way including the permanent closure of Cemlyn Road.
7. The proposed development is "EIA development" for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009. An environmental impact assessment is being carried out and an environmental statement will be submitted with the proposed application. The environmental statement will provide a detailed description of the Project and its likely significant environmental effects.
8. In accordance with Regulation 10 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009 the Applicant has previously made Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) available together with a non-technical summary of that information (as part of its Stage One and Stage Two pre-application consultations). This PEI is supplemented by the updated environmental information presented in the Stage Three pre-application consultation documents.
9. An updated statement of community consultation ("SOCC") has been prepared explaining how this Stage Three pre-application consultation will be undertaken in respect of the Wylfa Newydd Project.
10. The documents which support this Stage Three pre-application consultation comprise:
 - (a) A Consultation Overview Document (available in English and Welsh)
 - (b) A Main Consultation Document
11. Reference copies of these Stage Three documents showing the nature and location of the Wylfa Newydd Project will be available for viewing free of charge between 24 May and 22 June 2017 at the library locations listed opposite. Box shipping recovery relies on ordering restraint



Shipyard capacity is the elephant in the room, says MSI analyst James Frew.

Shipyard overcapacity remains a threat to stability, says James Frew

SHIPYARD capacity is the “elephant in the room” that threatens the recovery of both freight and charter rates unless yards consolidate and owners show restraint, according to MSI analyst James Frew, writes James Baker.

Speaking at the Global Liner Shipping conference in Hamburg, Mr Frew said that during the period from 1998 to 2010, freight and charter

rates had normally moved in the same direction.

This changed, however, after 2010 and the two markets became disconnected as the idle fleet either expanded or contracted.

“There was a new phenomenon of having a large number of containerships lying idle,” Mr Frew said. “Before 2010 there was no similar idle fleet.”

While some of the disruption to the connection between freight and charter rates could be attributed to trade growth, this had not always been the case, as in

2013-2014, when there was strong trade growth but a weak charter market.

Internal carrier dynamics also affected the pattern, which could be seen in the carriers holding off from chartering tonnage ahead of the alliance reshuffle, then rushing to secure ships, pushing prices up.

But shipyard capacity was the biggest threat to stability in both freight and charter rates, Mr Frew said.

“Shipyard capacity is the elephant in the room,” he said. “And like elephants, yards have long memories







2. The Applicant is part of the Horizon Nuclear Power Limited group of companies and is wholly owned by Hitachi, Limited, the headquarters of which is in Tokyo, Japan.

3. The application for the Wylfa Newydd Project is anticipated to be submitted in the third quarter of 2017.

4. The Wylfa Newydd Project is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project for the purposes of the Planning Act 2008 and requires development consent under that Act. Horizon proposes to apply for a DCO for the Wylfa Newydd Project which would include the following principal elements:

(ii) Reactor, control, service and turbine buildings and other supporting facilities, buildings, structures, features and works which are integral to the generating station including:

(A) Radioactive waste and spent fuel storage buildings

(B) Electrical connection to National Grid substation

(C) Marine works comprising a cooling water system, marine off-loading facility, breakwater structures, and navigational lighting and safety systems

(D) Administration building and training and simulator building

(E) Landscape works and planting including drainage, foul drainage and surface water management systems and footpath works

(F) Public Access works including closure and diversion of public rights of way

(G) A power station access road and internal site roads

(H) Car parking

(I) Construction sites, laydown areas, working areas, temporary works and structures, and temporary construction viewing area

(J) Diversion of utilities

(K) Main perimeter fence and construction fence

(b) *Off-site Power Station Facilities co-located on land in Llanfaethlu including:*

(i) An alternative emergency control centre

(ii) An environmental survey laboratory

The proposed DCO will also seek various other powers including provisions permitting the compulsory acquisition of interests and rights in land, the temporary use of land, interference with rights and the closure or diversion of streets and other public rights of way including the permanent closure of Cemlyn Road.

7. The proposed development is "EIA development" for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009. An environmental impact assessment is being carried out and an environmental statement will be submitted with the proposed application. 





What's changed?

- we've reduced the number of locations for temporary worker accommodation and we are now proposing a single Site Campus on the Wylfa Newydd site. This will reduce our impact elsewhere on Anglesey and means that fewer construction workers will have to travel to and from the site each day
- we've also reduced the number of associated development sites, combining our essential off-site power station facilities together at Llanfaethlu

What's staying the same?

Much of our proposals remain as we set out in 2016:

- improvements to the A5025 between Valley and the Wylfa Newydd site

We're now proposing to reduce the number of accommodation sites that we build from seven to one, and accommodate up to 4,000 workers, at the peak of construction, on a Site Campus.

This will be built and removed in phases: the first two phases will total 2,500 beds, and the final phase of 1,500 beds will be built only as required. This will minimise the impact on existing forms of accommodation such as the private rental sector.

We'll also provide dedicated facilities on-site to minimise our impact on local facilities and services including:

- a services building including a restaurant, café, reception area, gym and other social space
- a comprehensive health service to ensure the workforce is in good health, and other measures to avoid impacting existing community facilities
- outdoor space including three activity areas, seating and open space

The workforce we'll need:

- approximately a quarter of the workforce will be local residents commuting daily from their homes


We're still proposing to operate shuttle bus routes for home-based workers.

- **Alternative Emergency Control Centre (AECC):** providing alternative command and communications facilities; not staffed day-to-day
- **Environmental Survey Laboratory (ESL):** facilities to manage radiological surveys in the local area; staffed by two people during normal operations
- **Mobile Emergency Equipment Garage (MEEG):** storage and basic servicing of the vehicles and equipment; not staffed day-to-day

After listening to feedback from our previous consultations we are now proposing to combine these three essential facilities at Llanfaethlu, the site we had previously identified for the MEEG. This means we no longer need the sites previously identified at Cefn Coch or Llanrhuddlad.



People in North Wales are being invited to have their say on updated proposals for Wylfa Newydd, a new multi-billion pound power station on Anglesey.

WELSH LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

We continue to recognise that the Welsh language and culture are integral to the communities of Anglesey, and central to many people's sense of identity. We also recognise the connection between a strong economy, jobs and the well-being of the Welsh language and culture on Anglesey. We value Welsh language skills at all levels within our workforce and we are committed to supporting the use of the language across Anglesey's communities.

We are continuing our work to understand how our proposals could affect the Welsh language, culture and traditions – this is called a Welsh Language Impact Assessment.



THE ENVIRONMENT

The changes to the Project will have different effects for communities and the environment across Anglesey. Within the Main Consultation Document the Preliminary Environmental Information presents the changes to the project since Stage Two. We're also carrying out a Habitats Regulations Assessment to consider the potential effects of the Wylfa Newydd Project on European Designated Sites. The progress on this is summarised in Chapter 9 of the Main Consultation Document.



HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

As we've presented in previous consultations, when large projects such as ours are built in Wales, it is good practice, and suggested by national and local policy, to complete an assessment to understand how the project may affect health and well-being. The current status and findings of our Health Impact Assessment are described in Chapter 9 of the Main Consultation Document.



BENEFITS OF THE PROJECT

From page 35 you can find information about our approach to delivering economic, educational and community benefits and other ways that we intend to enhance the positive, and reduce the negative, effects of our Project.







A summary of what's changed



Since our public consultation last autumn, we've been busy reviewing feedback and further refining our plans for Wylfa Newydd. Many of our proposals remain as we set out in 2016 but, to make sure the project is the best it can be, we're proposing some changes to the Power Station layout, and other aspects, such as how we house and manage the temporary construction workforce.

We've carried out a thorough review of our plans and redesigned the layout of the Power Station to make it more compact overall. This means we've been able to streamline our construction schedule and reduce construction worker numbers, which is expected to peak at a maximum of 9,000 for a few months at the end of 2023. This is fewer than the previous peak.

We've also updated other elements of the project:

- we've reduced the number of locations of temporary worker accommodation sites and we are now proposing to accommodate up to 4,000 workers in a specially designed single Site Campus on the Wylfa Newydd site. This will reduce our impact elsewhere on Anglesey
- we've refined our parking and travel plans to reflect our revised approach to housing construction workers as Site Campus workers won't need to travel to and from work each day
- we've changed the design of the Logistics Centre at Parc Cybi, and the park and ride at Dalar Hir
- we've also reduced the number of Associated Development sites, combining our essential off-site Power Station Facilities together at Llanfaethlu

WHAT'S STAYING THE SAME?

Many of our proposals remain as we set out in 2016:

- improvements to the A5025 between Valley and the Wylfa Newydd site
- the location for a park and ride at Dalar Hir
- the location for a Logistics Centre at Parc Cybi
- our commitment to the Welsh language and culture
- our commitment to providing community benefits that help deliver a positive socio-economic legacy to Anglesey but also the wider North Wales region



DID YOU KNOW?

We'll construct the Site Campus in phases, with the first two totalling 2,500 beds. The final phase of 1,500 beds will be built only as required.



MORE INFORMATION

The construction workforce is now anticipated to peak at around 8,500. However, to ensure that the Project can be flexible to the pressures of unforeseen increased demand, we are basing our assessments on 9,000 workers. This is a reduction from our Stage Two pre-application consultation estimate of peak working numbers, which is also in response to concerns expressed in previous consultations.



Project introduction

The UK faces significant energy challenges in the coming years and needs investment in low carbon electricity generation.

To support this, we are planning to construct and operate a new nuclear power station on Anglesey, to the west of Cemaes and south-west of the existing Magnox power station. The Wylfa Newydd Power Station would generate 2,700 megawatts of electricity, providing enough secure, low carbon power for around five million homes for decades to come. It will involve substantial investment in the area and create significant short, medium and long-term employment opportunities and economic benefits for Anglesey and North Wales.

THE POWER STATION

The new nuclear Power Station will include two UK Advanced Boiling Water Reactors (UK ABWRs) supplied by Hitachi-GE Nuclear Energy Ltd (Hitachi-GE), associated plant, ancillary structures and features that will be constructed and operated on Anglesey.

Construction works will be needed on the land around the Power Station and in the sea at Porth-y-pistyll. This will include creation of a permanent landscaped setting for the Power Station as well as construction of our cooling water system, associated breakwaters and Marine Off-Loading Facility (MOLF).

As part of the construction and subsequent operation of the facility we are committed to encouraging local employment and increasing the skills base on Anglesey and in North Wales. These initiatives will be directly aligned with the promotion of the Welsh language and culture.

This document provides an update to the Wylfa Newydd Project, which has gone through an important period of review since the previous consultation in the autumn of 2016. Ongoing design work and your feedback has allowed us to improve the balance between a project which is deliverable and one that increases local opportunities while minimising impacts as far as possible on communities and the environment.

This consultation explains the changes to the Project since our previous Stage Two consultation and any significant individual or collective changes that are likely to occur. Where changes have not been made from the proposals we set out in our Stage Two pre-application consultation, we have not repeated that information. The Project includes our proposals for the Power Station, Off-Site Power Station Facilities and Associated Development.

OFF-SITE POWER STATION FACILITIES

We also have to develop some facilities that are geographically separate from, but local to and part of, the Power Station. These are an alternative emergency control centre, an environmental survey laboratory for the Power Station, and a garage to store specialist vehicles. You can find more about this on page 17.

ASSOCIATED DEVELOPMENT

Associated Development supports the delivery and operation of the Power Station. This includes new sections of the A5025, temporary accommodation for construction workers, a park and ride facility, and a Logistics Centre. You can find more information on these starting on page 24.

ENABLING WORKS

We are also proposing to undertake enabling works which include:

- **Site Preparation and Clearance works** – this is to prepare the site for the Main Construction stage. Works include demolishing existing buildings, constructing fencing, clearing vegetation and treating contaminated land
- **On-Line Highways Improvements** – this is work to improve the existing A5025 and includes widening, reconstructing and resurfacing the road from Valley to the Power Station Site

Update on consultation and engagement activities

WHERE WE ARE NOW

We have previously asked for your views in autumn 2014, January 2016 and autumn 2016. Feedback from previous consultations has been important in helping us to refine our Project to respond to your comments. This has helped us develop our proposals for the numbers and accommodation for temporary construction workers, and proposals to enhance benefits and to reduce or avoid the negative effects of the Project.

We are also continuing to engage on Project proposals with technical consultees such as Isle of Anglesey County Council, Welsh Government, Natural Resources Wales, Gwynedd Council, Conwy County Borough Council, Design Commission for Wales and the Office for Nuclear Regulation.

At the same time as updating our proposals, we have been continuing to develop initiatives that encourage local training and education. We've also continued to work on our commitment to the Welsh language and culture to support understanding within the construction and operational workforce.



DID YOU KNOW?

We will appoint a Welsh Language and Culture Coordinator to develop a behavioural based programme aligned to the goals of the consultation recommendations.

CHANGES TO THE CONSENTING PROCESS

At the time of our Stage Two consultation, under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, we were required to submit several individual planning applications for our Associated Development to Isle of Anglesey County Council.

A change in the law (known as the Wales Act 2017) means that we are now able to include our Associated Development in our main application for Wylfa Newydd Power Station, known as a Development Consent Order (DCO). This means that the multiple sites which form the Project can be considered and controlled 'in the round' as one main application. We will still need separate marine licenses for work we do in the marine environment.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

Our Associated Development proposals will now be included as part of our main application, called a Development Consent Order (DCO), following recent changes in legislation.



MORE INFORMATION

Feedback received from our Stage Two pre-application consultation can be found in Chapter 2 of the Main Consultation Document.

CONSULTATION ON ENABLING WORKS

We will be submitting planning applications for our enabling works to Isle of Anglesey County Council in 2017. We held a series of information events in spring and autumn 2016 to present our proposals as they stood at that time.

Since then, we have reduced the scope of the Site Preparation and Clearance proposals. We have also refined our proposed improvements to the existing A5025 between Valley and our site, known as On-Line Highways. We will be consulting separately on both of these in summer 2017.




Project proposals

PROJECT LOCATION AND AREA

The area of land needed to build the Power Station has remained largely the same. However, additional pockets of land have recently been added to the Wylfa Newydd Development Area to allow the landscaping to be improved. The main buildings for operation of the Power Station will be located in the Power Station Site. As well as this, we need other areas to locate the Off-Site Power Station Facilities and Associated Development.

We use different terms to refer to where parts of our Project will be built:

- **Power Station Site:** the indicative area of land and sea within which the majority of the permanent Power Station buildings, plant and structures will be located. This includes the two nuclear reactors, steam turbines, the cooling water system intake, outfall structures, breakwaters and the Marine Off-Loading Facility (MOLF)
- **Wylfa Newydd Development Area:** the indicative areas of land and sea including the Power Station Site, and the surrounding areas that will be used for construction and operation of the Power Station. It will also include the onsite temporary workers accommodation known as the Site Campus. This area is representative of the maximum area that will be physically affected by construction activities related to the Power Station and used to form the setting and landscaping features of the operational Power Station. Additional land that has been included in this area since the previous consultation is highlighted in the layout figure
- **Off-Site:** the areas of land needed for the Project that fall outside of the Wylfa Newydd Development Area. Components that will be off-site include most of the Associated Development and the Off-Site Power Station Facilities

POWER STATION SITE

The design of the Power Station Site has been refined since our previous consultation, informed by the appointment of Menter Newydd to help construct and deliver the Project. Permanent development at the Power Station Site includes the main operational plant and structures comprising:

- **main plant:** the parts of the Power Station that enable generation of power. This includes a single power island containing the two UK ABWRs and directly associated buildings
- **common plant:** the parts of the Power Station that service the generation of power but are shared between the two UK ABWRs
- **supporting facilities, buildings, structures and features:** the parts of the Power Station necessary to support the operation and maintenance of the Power Station, including offices, security facilities, and the MOLF
- **marine works:** the components of the Project required in the marine environment to support construction and operation of the Power Station, including the cooling water system intake, the outfall, and two breakwater structures



DID YOU KNOW?

Horizon recently finalised its Engineering Procurement and Construction Joint Venture with Hitachi Nuclear Energy Europe, Bechtel Management Company and JGC Corporation (UK). It will be overseen by Horizon and known as Menter Newydd, and they will build the power station.

WHAT'S CHANGED?

- *The main plant buildings are now located on a single 'power island' - the Power Station buildings contain the main plant needed to generate power - rather than two independent areas. This has reduced the overall site area and created a more sustainable Project*
- *Some of the buildings, structures and features needed to generate power or support the Power Station have been reduced in number and redesigned to make the Power Station more efficient and deliverable. This reduces the area of the Power Station and moves the perimeter fence further away from the A5025 and local communities*
- *The construction process now adopts a more modular technique (i.e. components pre-constructed off-site) which reduces the construction programme and requires less construction workers on site*
- *The training and simulator building has been relocated to the south of the Power Station to a new location further from the village of Tregele*
- *To allow us to refine the design and layout of the site further and make sure construction can take place as smoothly as possible, we will seek flexibility as to the precise locations of some of these supporting buildings on the Power Station Site in our DCO application*
- *A temporary viewing area will be built during the construction period to provide a safe area for visitors to see the construction. It is still our intention to construct a permanent Visitor Centre on site*

WYLFA NEWYDD DEVELOPMENT AREA AND SURROUNDINGS

Temporary development within the Wylfa Newydd Development Area to support construction of the Power Station includes:

- **on-site temporary workers' accommodation (the Site Campus):** providing temporary accommodation and key services for up to 4,000 construction workers
- **construction laydown areas, working areas, car parking, access roads and internal site roads:** construction infrastructure to enable the development of the Power Station
- **interim landscape works, drainage, fencing and closure and diversion of public rights of way:** aspects of the construction works designed to reduce effects as far as possible and described within our Landscape and Environmental Masterplan (LEMP)

One of the ways that we're managing the effects of the Project is through our LEMP. We are continuing to develop a comprehensive plan for the Wylfa Newydd Development Area as it sets out the environmental context, landscape and seascape settings for the Power Station. The LEMP shows how we plan to adapt the environment within the Wylfa Newydd Development Area and the permanent changes to the landscape we expect to make.

The LEMP incorporates preliminary environmental assessment work, and outlines proposals for drainage; ecology; recreation and agricultural use; and landscaping. More preliminary environmental information on the LEMP is in Chapter 3 of the Main Consultation Document.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- *The Site Campus provides temporary workers accommodation and key services for up to 4,000 workers on the Wylfa Newydd Development Area. This means we no longer need to provide campus style temporary workers' accommodation elsewhere on Anglesey*
- *The construction and working areas have continued to evolve including provision of additional parking for construction workers on the site*



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- *The landscape mounds have been reviewed to give a more natural shape to the landscape, in keeping with the existing surrounding drumlins. They will help screen the Power Station from surrounding viewpoints and will appear more consistent with the existing landscape*
- *Particular focus has been given to the profile and height of mounding where it is closest to existing communities and the Site Campus*
- *The Wales Coast Path would be diverted inland of the Power Station mainly due to the technical, safety, and security challenges of providing a footbridge over the cooling water intake structure*
- *Most of the public rights of way and access to Fisherman's Car Park will remain open during the early Site Preparation and Clearance works*

OFF-SITE POWER STATION FACILITIES

The Off-Site Power Station Facilities will be physically separate from, but local to, the Power Station Site and are an integral part of our emergency arrangements. These include:

- **Alternative Emergency Control Centre (AECC):** to provide back-up command and communication facilities
- **Environmental Survey Laboratory (ESL):** to provide facilities to manage radiological surveys in the local area, including radiation monitoring equipment controls
- **Mobile Emergency Equipment Garage (MEEG):** to house a number of specialist vehicles



WHAT'S CHANGED?

All three Off-Site Power Station Facilities have been consolidated on to the site at Llanfaethlu (an existing bus depot). This means we no longer need the Cefn Coch or Llanrhuddlad sites. This reduces the number of development sites associated with our Project.

ASSOCIATED DEVELOPMENT

Associated Development supports the delivery of the Power Station and includes:


- **Off-Line highway improvements:** these comprise new sections of road along the A5025 between Valley and the Power Station Site to improve access and safety
- **park and ride facility:** a temporary hub for the transfer of construction workers from private vehicles onto shared transport to reduce Project traffic on local roads
- **Logistics Centre:** a temporary secure facility where we can manage lorry movements to the Power Station Site to reduce effects on communities



WHAT'S CHANGED?

We have amended our proposals for Associated Development including:

- *Changes to the Off-Line highways improvement proposals are described in more details at page 32 of this document*
- *We have made changes to the facilities located on the park and ride and the Logistics Centre sites, see pages 27 – 29 for additional detail*

Update on construction, operation and decommissioning

ENABLING WORKS

To prepare the site for the Main Construction Stage, the land will need to be cleared of many existing features such as buildings, walls and hedges. We will also need to make improvements to the A5025 between Valley and the Power Station Site. Both of these will be subject to separate planning applications to be submitted in summer 2017.

The Site Preparation and Clearance works will include demolishing existing buildings, clearing many features, and creating several construction compounds and two new road crossings. A section of an existing watercourse will also be realigned. We have identified historic contamination in several locations of the site and this will be treated using specialist techniques.

We intend to keep public rights of way open for much of the period of the works, and any construction fencing needed will include gaps for public access on permitted routes.

If for any reason we are not granted a DCO for Wylfa Newydd, we would restore the site to a condition to be agreed with Isle of Anglesey County Council.

The required changes to the existing A5025 between Valley and the Power Station Site are known as “On-Line highway improvements”. These works include:

- **widening:** the road to an overall width of 7.3 metres (with only a handful of locations where this is not possible)
- **reconstruction:** remove and replace the layers which make up the highway surface. We have undertaken tests to assess the condition of different layers of the road to help us understand the sections that need to be reconstructed and strengthened
- **resurfacing:** resurfacing the base layers of the road where, even though it may look acceptable, we know through testing that the base conditions are poor

The stretch of the A5025 from Valley to the Power Station Site will also require improvements that are unable to be accommodated along the line of the existing road. These new sections of road, known as Off-Line highway improvements, are explained in Chapter 32 of the Main Consultation Document.



MORE INFORMATION

As part of our surveys of the Wylfa Newydd Development Area several locations of archaeological interest have been identified. We will be investigating these areas during 2017 and 2018 to understand their importance and will be sharing the findings with local communities.



MAIN CONSTRUCTION

The Main Construction stage is anticipated to start in 2020 and would last for around eight to nine years.

The types of main construction activities remain largely unchanged since the previous consultation and continue to include:

- bulk earthworks including site levelling and grading, leading to the creation of building platforms and construction laydown areas
- construction of a new Power Station access road
- establishment of large temporary construction compounds to allow for storage of materials and temporary construction buildings
- construction of haul roads and bridges
- construction of a concrete batching plant
- marine construction including the breakwaters, cooling water intake and outfall and a Marine Off-Loading Facility (MOLF)
- construction and occupation of the Site Campus
- deep excavations and tunnelling for construction of the foundations of the main plant
- general construction of all Power Station buildings, facilities and structures, and installation of all major equipment

More information on Main Construction is at Chapter 3 of the Main Consultation Document.

MARINE WORKS

The Project continues to include development within the marine environment in two locations:

- at Porth-y-pistyll, where the breakwaters, cooling water intake, MOLF, and other structures will be located; and
- the cooling water outfall which is located in the same position as the outfall structure of the existing Magnox power station

These works include:

- a MOLF to provide berths for bulk vessels which will facilitate delivery of materials directly to the Power Station Site by sea during construction
- two breakwaters to form the harbour area and provide protection to the cooling water intake and vessels using the MOLF
- shore protection to prevent erosion
- dredging to provide sufficient water depths for navigation of vessels using the MOLF
- cooling water intake, including screening and fish deterrent systems, and a cooling water outfall
- dredged material disposed at sea and/or re-use for construction

Since the previous consultation we have changed the proposed design of both breakwaters (the eastern and the western breakwater as shown on page 9). We intend to retain some flexibility in our proposals to allow for some further refinement in the final design of the breakwaters. Overall, however:

- We anticipate the eastern breakwater to be larger than previously proposed (with a length of around 150 metres)

- The western breakwater is anticipated to be smaller than previously proposed (with a reduced length of around 500 metres). It will also be located slightly further out to sea

We will need to obtain marine licences from Natural Resources Wales to undertake these works.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- *The sizes and location of the breakwaters have been refined to allow for flexibility and the western breakwater is now around 20 metres further out to sea*
- *The cooling water intake is larger to make the system more efficient and better able to protect fish and marine mammals*


COMMISSIONING THE POWER STATION

Commissioning is a period of testing to ensure all systems in all parts of the Power Station operate as intended. It will continue to occur in three phases: construction testing, pre-operational testing, and start-up testing. We expect commissioning to take around three years for each UK ABWR. Commissioning of the first UK ABWR will begin during the final stages of construction of the second UK ABWR. There are no significant changes to this part of the Project since the previous consultation.

OPERATING THE POWER STATION

We are proposing to operate two UK ABWRs, each with an expected operational life of 60 years. We continue to expect to employ around 850 people at the Power Station during operation, with recruitment beginning early in the construction phase to ensure we have a highly-skilled workforce in place in time for operation of the Power Station.

In accordance with requirements set out by regulators, we are developing plans for operational and emergency preparedness. A requirement of our Nuclear Site Licence is for us to have adequate emergency preparedness plans in place, and our operational emergency plan will need to be in place before bringing nuclear fuel to the Power Station Site. This plan will include a phased approach to emergency response identifying actions to be taken at the Power Station Site, in the local communities, across the region and then across the UK. This has not changed since our previous consultation.

DID YOU KNOW?

In March 2017 we applied to the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) for a Nuclear Site Licence, one of the main permissions we need to build and operate the Power Station. If the licence is granted, Horizon will then be regulated by the ONR for the full lifecycle of the site from construction to decommissioning.

DECOMMISSIONING THE POWER STATION

As set out in our Stage Two consultation, at the end of the operating phase, the Power Station will be decommissioned. We will remove buildings from the site while responsibly managing all spent fuel and radioactive wastes. The end state of the site will be agreed with regulators and uses other than nuclear could be approved. While we will have a decommissioning programme available at the early stage of the Project, decommissioning activities will be planned in detail closer to actually decommissioning the Power Station. We will need to apply for additional permissions at that time, and prepare an assessment of the potential effects on the environment.

MANAGEMENT OF RADIOACTIVE WASTE AND SPENT FUEL

Once operational the Power Station will create radioactive wastes which need to be treated and stored before they are ready to be removed from the Power Station Site.

Our main plant buildings include a facility to process and manage radioactive waste for both UK ABWRs. This will be constructed during the Main Construction phase of the Project for use through commissioning and at the start of operation of the Power Station.

In addition, Government policy requires us to have facilities for 'interim' longer term storage of spent fuel, intermediate level waste and dry high level radioactive waste at the Power Station Site. Our proposals now include two radioactive waste storage buildings to provide safe and secure storage facilities until the radioactive waste can be repackaged for transfer to a national radioactive waste disposal facility being planned by the UK government.

We estimate radioactive waste could remain on the Power Station Site for up to 140 years after the end of electricity generation, although we are still studying how this time might be reduced.

The radioactive waste storage buildings are located immediately to the south-west corner of the Power Station Site and will be constructed in time to receive the relevant waste.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- *We're now proposing one larger radioactive waste building to serve both reactors, rather than two smaller buildings. The height of the building has stayed the same*
- *Instead of three buildings, we're now proposing two longer-term storage buildings for radioactive waste*

Off-Site Power Station Facilities

As part of our emergency planning arrangements, a number of buildings will need to be geographically separate from, but near to, the Power Station Site. The requirements for these buildings are established by the Office for Nuclear Regulation.

Since our Stage Two pre-application consultation, we have been working closely with the regulators and have made further progress in understanding our needs for these Off-Site Power Station Facility requirements. Based on feedback received, we have refined our proposals.

The Off-Site Power Station Facilities we need are:

- **Alternative Emergency Control Centre (AECC):** which would provide alternative command and communications facilities in the unlikely event that the main Emergency Control Centre on the Power Station Site is inaccessible
- **Environmental Survey Laboratory (ESL):** which would provide facilities to manage radiological surveys in the local area, including radiation monitoring equipment controls
- **Mobile Emergency Equipment Garage (MEEG):** which would provide storage and basic servicing of the vehicles and equipment that would be used to respond to an unlikely emergency event at the Power Station Site

We previously consulted on an undeveloped site at Cefn Coch for the AECC and ESL facilities and a potential alternative previously developed site at Llanrhuddlad, which was identified shortly before the previous consultation. We also consulted on a previously developed site at Llanfaethlu for the MEEG facility only.

We are now proposing to group all three facilities together at the Llanfaethlu site and not develop the Cefn Coch or Llanrhuddlad sites. Consultation feedback was generally positive for development on the Llanfaethlu site as it is developed land. Llanfaethlu was understood to be too far away from the Power Station Site to be a possibility for the AECC and ESL facilities, but we have subsequently met with the Office for Nuclear Regulation and agreed that this is not the case.

Details of the grouped facilities include:

- the AECC could be occupied by up to 25-30 staff during an emergency event, but would not be staffed day-to-day
- the ESL could be occupied by two staff during normal operations, increasing to 12 during an emergency event
- the MEEG could be occupied by approximately 20 staff during an emergency event, but would not be staffed day-to-day. During periodic vehicle checks (typically one every six months), staff would be on site
- approximately 16 parking spaces (including 12 for cars, 2 for disabled drivers and 2 for motorcycles)
- approximately 50 additional/overspill parking spaces for use in an emergency, using land not previously identified for development
- access for large vehicles
- drainage
- security features including: fencing, retaining walls combined with vegetation barriers, CCTV, and lighting

The existing buildings on the site would be demolished.



Indicative image of MEEG, AECC and ESL at Llanfaethlu




Preferred location of MEEG, AECC and ESL at Llanfaethlu



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- Our proposals are now to group the MEEG, AECC and ESL facilities together on the same site at Llanfaethlu. This will allow us to reduce the overall land used for these Off-Site Power Station Facilities elsewhere. This means we no longer need the sites at Cefn Coch or Llanrhuddlad
- Locating these facilities on a single site means that the site footprint has increased from what we previously proposed to allow for additional parking spaces

Managing the construction workforce

We recognise that the number of workers needed to construct our Project is a key concern of communities across Anglesey and North Wales.

We have been continuing our work to understand the number and profiles of the construction workforce that we will need, by working closely with our supply chain.

This is also a key factor in determining our strategies to minimise effects, including through our Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy and commitments to protecting and enhancing Welsh language and culture, and local public services. It will also be important to increase local access to specialist training programmes and educational opportunities.

NUMBER OF CONSTRUCTION WORKERS


Key to calculating the number of workers for a complex infrastructure project like ours is a clear understanding of the approach to construction and timings. We continue to work with our supply chain to build upon their experience gained during the construction of ABWR plants in Japan, adapting that experience to the engineering and construction challenges presented for the Wylfa Newydd Project.

For the construction phase, we will aim to recruit as many workers from Anglesey and North Wales as we can, although we anticipate that a significant proportion will need to be recruited from elsewhere. To ensure our assessments are based on a worst case scenario (particularly for our assessments of housing) we are assuming a minimum of around 22% of our workers during the construction phase will be from Anglesey and North Wales. However, we will seek to maximise this number.

Our commitment to the Welsh language, through our existing policy and emerging Welsh Language and Culture Mitigation and Enhancement Strategy, will form an important element of our recruitment process.

WHAT'S CHANGED?

For assessment purpose we use 9,000 workers. However, we anticipate a peak workforce of around 8,500 for a few months at the end of 2023, this is a reduction from the previously anticipated peak at 10,720.

WORKER ACCOMMODATION MANAGEMENT SERVICE

We know that there is a lot of interest in offering private accommodation for use by construction workers. In response to feedback we've received, we have established the principles of our Worker Accommodation Management Service (previously called the Construction Worker Accommodation Management Portal) to manage available accommodation during construction. This service will allow local people to register a room or property with us and we will require all of our construction workers to arrange their accommodation through this service. The aim is to match workers with accommodation in a way that avoids or reduces impact on local residents (especially those renting privately) and tourist accommodation.

The service will ensure registered accommodation meets quality and safety standards and offers bed spaces in accessible locations, ideally as close as possible to the site. It will also distribute the construction workforce across accommodation types and locations.

CONSTRUCTION WORKER ACCOMMODATION STRATEGY

We are continuing to work on our Construction Worker Accommodation Strategy to determine how we house our construction workers.

In our Stage Two consultation, we received a number of different views about our Construction Worker Accommodation, which we considered very carefully. We have now revised our Strategy to balance where workers can be most appropriately accommodated. For the purposes of our housing assessments we have assumed:

- approximately a quarter of the workforce (around 2,000 workers) will be local residents commuting daily from their existing homes
- approximately 3,000 construction workers living in accommodation that is on the open market, or in the private rental and tourist sectors
- up to 4,000 construction workers will live in the Site Campus


Our current proposal for the Site Campus removes the need for temporary workers' accommodation at other locations including Cae Glas (Holyhead), Rhosgoch, and an alternative area in Amlwch.

We are also no longer proposing to house construction workers in the proposed permanent housing at Kingsland (Holyhead). We are also no longer proposing Madyn Farm (Amlwch) as part of our application for the DCO.

The benefits of this approach to accommodating construction workers are:

- reducing the number of locations of temporary workers accommodation from seven to a single on-site campus. This will reduce our impact elsewhere on Anglesey, addressing concerns that we received from previous consultation feedback
- reduction in the number of construction workers travelling to and from work each day on local roads
- reducing travel times for many workers, which will increase on-site productivity and reduce health and safety risks
- allowing key workers to have immediate and easy access to the Power Station Site so they can respond to emergencies and out-of-hours site needs
- providing shared dedicated facilities for all workers at the Site Campus, irrespective of where they live. This will enable a greater opportunity for workers to interact, socialise and bond – all of which improve the workers' well-being
- significantly improving the overall efficiency of providing temporary workers' accommodation for the Project

SHIFT WORKING

Our proposed shift patterns remain as follows:

ACTIVITY	INDICATIVE WORKING HOURS AND SHIFT PATTERN
Main Construction works	11-day fortnight, i.e. 11 days on, three days off, including a stagger
Staggered day shifts	three start times at 07:00, 07:30 and 08:00
Staggered night shifts	starting at 16:30, 17:00 and 17:30*

*Some trades will be required to work through the night, for example when continuous concrete pours are needed

We will continue to work with Menter Newydd and our supply chain to finalise the shift pattern. We will take into consideration the construction schedule, the safety and well-being of the construction workforce as well as effects on communities.

We recognise the importance of reducing negative impacts of proposed shift patterns. We are already taking into account school hours, traffic peaks on the Britannia Bridge and peak travel to work times. We will continue to engage with key stakeholders including trade unions and emergency services, and respond to the outcomes of our ongoing environmental impact assessment.



DID YOU KNOW?

'Latent' accommodation is made up of bed space which is available locally, such as an annexe or spare room. A survey conducted across Anglesey in 2015 indicated there are around 400 such bed spaces available on Anglesey.

The Site Campus

The Site Campus would house up to 4,000 construction workers in modular type accommodation blocks, providing an independent living space for each worker, with shared campus-style amenities.

The Site Campus will be a temporary facility, completed in phases with the first phase providing 1,000 bed spaces. Subsequent phases would include additions of up to 1,500 bed spaces, taking into account demand. This would ensure that housing units would not be constructed unnecessarily, reducing the potential for unnecessary environmental effects.

We expect most of the temporary residential buildings to be four storeys in height. Some buildings in later phases may be up to seven storeys in height, although due to their location toward the lower end of a sloping landscape, our aim is for all of the temporary residential buildings to appear at broadly the same height when viewed from a distance.

The accommodation would be supported by a variety of facilities, including:

- An amenity building including a restaurant, café, reception area, gym, bar and other social space
- Outdoor social areas including three sports pitches (multi-use games areas), outdoor seating and open space
- A comprehensive occupational health service to ensure the workforce is in good health. This will be complemented by other services such as primary care GP. We anticipate that dentistry and pharmacy provision will be from existing community facilities that we would look to support. This is to be agreed with local health stakeholders. (e.g. Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, Public Health Wales, the Welsh Ambulance Service)

Minor injuries would be treated at the on-site facility and it would also be used if there was a major incident. Any serious injuries would be transferred to hospital.

We considered a number of locations on the Wylfa Newydd Development Area to locate the Site Campus. We previously identified this land for development of some accommodation and materials storage during Stage Two consultation.

This site was chosen because it maximises the distance of the accommodation from the active construction site while avoiding constraints on construction activities. It is also located away from neighbouring communities and in a location which will be screened by our LEMP proposals.

Whilst the Site Campus is near some environmental features (including Tre'r Gof Site of Special Scientific Interest, designated ancient woodland, and the existing bat barn) the detailed design will ensure that effects on these sites will be avoided or minimised. Further preliminary environmental information about the Site Campus can be found at Chapter 6 of the Main Consultation Document.






While this accommodation would be used throughout the period of Main Construction of the Power Station, the site would not be fully developed for the full period of Main Construction. We anticipate it will be at peak capacity for a short period of time, following which the amount of accommodation will be reduced again. When construction of the Power Station is complete, the Site Campus will be removed and the area will be restored in line with the LEMP, as shown on page 44 of this document.

The detailed design of the Site Campus will seek to minimise visual impacts. Landscape mounding as part of the LEMP will provide visual screening of the Site Campus from Tregele and partially from Cemaes. Horizon will apply a Site Campus Management Plan to avoid disruption to local communities, and a community liaison officer will be available should any queries arise.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- Up to 4,000 workers at peak will now be accommodated on a single temporary Site Campus within the Wylfa Newydd Development Area
- Reducing the number of locations of temporary workers' accommodation from seven sites to one reduces our impact elsewhere on Anglesey
- Dedicated on-site facilities such as a comprehensive health service and leisure facilities will be provided to minimise effects on existing capacity in local communities

Integrated approach to traffic and transport

Through our integrated approach to traffic and transport, we are committed to improving the transport system while reducing adverse effects on communities and the environment.

Our approach sets out how we intend to transport construction workers and materials to the Power Station Site by road, rail and sea. It shows our commitment to road safety; promoting sustainable travel by making fewer journeys; and leaving a lasting transport legacy after the construction phase of the Project.

TRANSPORT STRATEGY

At the peak of construction, in addition to workers travelling from the Site Campus, up to around 5,000 workers could be commuting in shifts (as described on page 23) to the Power Station Site each day from across Anglesey and the mainland.

When the Power Station becomes operational, we will require a workforce of around 850, with up to 1,000 additional workers to carry out routine maintenance during annual outage periods.

The transport strategy for the operational phase will encourage sustainable travel and promote the legacy benefits of improved roads, and pedestrian and cycling routes.

FREIGHT AND LOGISTICS

We will need to transport over five million tonnes of construction materials and welfare goods to the Power Station Site.

MARINE OFF-LOADING FACILITY (MOLF)

Our transport strategy includes measures to significantly reduce the number of heavy goods vehicles on the roads. We continue to propose the construction of a MOLF at Porth-y-pistyll for sea freight, which is anticipated to carry 60% to 80% of all construction materials for the Power Station.

We aim to complete construction of the MOLF in time for the first significant deliveries for construction of the Power Station.

LOGISTICS CENTRE: PARC CYBI

As set out in our previous consultation, we are proposing that the remaining materials will be delivered by road and controlled through our Logistics Centre. We have established routes by which construction-related traffic would have to travel to the Logistics Centre from locations such as the mainland and Holyhead Port.

The Logistics Centre will be a temporary secure facility from where deliveries to the Power Station Site are managed to reduce traffic on and impacts to the local road network. The dispatch of lorries would be controlled to relieve traffic to the Wylfa Newydd Development Area. Robust logistics management will ensure that we can avoid convoys of delivery vehicles traveling along the A5025 and reduce queuing of vehicles entering the Power Station Site.


Following changes, the logistics centre will now have:

- around 14 full-time employees
- welfare/security building and kiosks, covered inspection bay, laydown/storage areas
- working hours of generally 7.5 hours a day, 5 days a week during construction of the Logistics Centre, increasing to 24 hours a day once the Logistics Centre is operational
- up to 100 heavy goods vehicles on-site at any one time
- a peak of around 40 vehicles per hour and 160 vehicles per day arriving at the Logistics Centre. A similar number would depart and the vehicles would consist of a combination of light goods vehicles, medium goods vehicles and heavy goods vehicles
- 14 staff parking spaces available (including disabled)
- security features including: paladin fencing (2.4 metres high) with controlled access barriers and systems, CCTV and lighting


Once construction of the Power Station is complete, the serviced site will remain and would be available for redevelopment as warehousing or an alternative employment use.

WHAT'S CHANGED?

The warehouse building previously proposed has been replaced by a covered inspection bay as it is no longer considered appropriate to consolidate smaller freight loads into larger vehicles here. Instead, we will require our suppliers to make sure the delivery loads are as full as possible when they start their journey, to reduce traffic on the wider road network.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

Additional parking spaces are provided to allow up to 100 heavy goods vehicles to be located at the Logistics Centre at any one time. This allows us to hold additional vehicles on site in the event of an incident on the road network.

PARK AND RIDE: DALAR HIR

The park and ride is a temporary facility where workers can park their vehicles securely and transfer to our shuttle buses, which will take them to the Power Station Site. The site is designed to include a zone for buses to collect and drop off passengers, with a management office and parking for staff (working at the park and ride facility).

Details of the facility include:

- 10 staff to operate the park and ride facility and 15 bus drivers
- approximately 1,900 parking spaces (including disabled and mini-bus) plus spaces for motorcycles and bicycles
- up to 40 return bus movements from the facility to the Power Station Site daily
- a bus transport facility building providing transport information, a waiting area, welfare facilities, a bus driver canteen and management office facilities


We are also proposing a new roundabout located within the Dalar Hir site, near the existing junction 4 of the A55, which will be the main entrance to the park and ride. Minor layout improvements will be needed to junction 4 to make sure there is no impact on traffic.

The site will be needed for the duration of construction of the Power Station, then will be decommissioned and returned to its current use, with grassland, stone walling and field boundaries reinstated.



WHAT'S CHANGED?

- **Parking spaces reduced from around 2,700 to 1,900, resulting in less vehicle movements and less temporary development of greenfield land**
- **Minor improvements to Junction 4 of the A55 to improve traffic flows**



MORE INFORMATION


We are continuing to do a lot of assessment to consider how construction and operation may affect the Dalar Hir Stream which runs into a Site of Special Scientific Interest to the south of this site. We understand that there are badgers on site and we're working to reduce or avoid any impacts to them. We will plant trees to provide visual screening and we will provide directional lighting to reduce environmental effects.

Indicative park and ride site layout – Dalar Hir


SUSTAINABLE TRAVEL FOR WORKERS

We are continuing to develop a range of proposals for sustainable travel to move workers between their accommodation and the Power Station Site.

Our plans include:

- a park and ride facility at Dalar Hir
- shuttle bus services to collect workers who are home-based or living in private, tourist, or rental accommodation, with agreed routes of travel
- shuttle bus services to the Site Campus from key transport interchanges with agreed routes of travel
- a Worker Accommodation Management Service which enables car share arrangements and have easy access to information on local travel services
- promotion and incentivisation of Horizon's car sharing policy
- promoting the use of cycling to get to the Power Station Site

We will continue to engage with Isle of Anglesey County Council, Welsh Government and other relevant stakeholders to develop transport management strategies.



Off-Line Highway Improvements

The A55, A5 and A5025 are the main routes from the mainland and the Port of Holyhead to Wylfa Newydd. These roads are critical to the successful delivery of the construction phase of the Project.

We are working with Isle of Anglesey County Council to identify a range of improvements to the existing A5025 (On-Line) and the need for additional new sections of highway (Off-Line).

These highway improvements are generally similar to those that we have consulted with you on previously. We are proposing the following new sections of road:

- A5/A5025 Valley junction improvements
- Llanfachraeth bypass
- Llanfaethlu road straightening
- Llanrhuddlad to Cefn Coch road straightening
- Power Station Site access

Some changes to the detailed layout have been summarised in the box to the right. In addition, the works to the site access are now formally identified as a further Off-Line highway improvement.

We will apply for the Off-Line highway improvements as part of our DCO. Once approved, we expect these works to commence soon after grant of the DCO and take around 18 months to complete.



WHAT'S CHANGED?


As a result of previous consultation feedback and further technical review, we have made the following changes:

- The new junction and access road at Valley is now outside of the flood zone. The previous proposal was to raise the road above the flood zone
- The Llanfachraeth bypass now includes extra land for great crested newts and the viaduct now has more clearance beyond the riverbanks
- The Llanfaethlu road straightening now includes extra land for great crested newts
- The Llanrhuddlad to Cefn Coch road improvements are now narrowed slightly at each end to avoid the need for earthworks in areas including an ancient woodland
- Access to the Site Campus will be via the existing Magnox power station access road. No improvements are required to the A5025 in this location

Britannia and Menai Bridges

Following previous consultation feedback, we have sought to better understand the impacts of the Project on traffic using the Britannia Bridge. We have gathered preliminary traffic data for the bridge and have now conducted comprehensive traffic data collection of the network around both the Britannia and Menai bridges.

Traffic modelling undertaken shows that the Project causes no significant impact on traffic congestion on the Britannia and Menai Bridges. With the reduced worker numbers, impacts are likely to reduce further. For more information on traffic impacts, see section 6 of the Main Consultation Document.




On and Off-Line highway improvements






Indicative proposed highway alignment – Valley




Indicative proposed highway alignment – Llanfachraeth

Jobs, skills and supply chain

Since the previous consultation, we have continued to progress our strategies for jobs, skills, education and the supply chain. We are continuing to work hard to make sure young people in North Wales have the opportunities and information they need to become the next generation of skilled workers, and develop successful careers as part of the Wylfa Newydd Project.



WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP

We are continuing to work with stakeholders including Isle of Anglesey County Council, Gwynedd Council, Welsh Government, Conwy County Borough Council, Grŵp Llandrillo Menai, Bangor University, Energy Island Partnership and North Wales Economic Ambition Board (NWEAB).

We are focusing on improving the skills in the local supply chain and maximising the opportunities for local people to obtain jobs associated with the Project. This will help to transform some of the economically deprived areas in the region. In addition, effects on key issues such as Welsh language and culture, which is currently under pressure due to the outward migration of young people, will be reduced.

Horizon is looking at a number of other routes to securing local jobs for local people, and includes establishing a Wylfa Newydd Jobs & Skills Service for the construction phase of the Project.

In the longer term, our ambition is that we will contribute towards a generational improvement in Welsh language and culture, by transforming the local economy with long-term employment growth, including a significant focus on attracting skilled people back to the region who have previously moved away to find employment.

DEVELOPING JOBS AND SKILLS

In developing the Project, we will look to recruit individuals from a range of backgrounds and will maximise the number of routes into jobs and careers at Wylfa Newydd. Key to the transformation of jobs and skills across the island and North Wales is the early and frequent engagement of young people at school, regardless of the routes they subsequently choose to pursue. Engaging young people early on in their learning helps to inform choices as well as helping to encourage applications from typically underrepresented groups.

By developing apprenticeships, work placements, graduate opportunities and skills training for local people from all backgrounds, Horizon will leave a legacy of skilled workers equipped to support future projects and initiatives throughout North Wales.

EDUCATION FUTURES

We are engaging with schools on Anglesey and across North Wales to increase awareness of the Project, to promote the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) subjects and to highlight the choices children must make in school to access relevant career paths through Further and Higher Education.

We are working with Isle of Anglesey County Council, Coleg Menai, Anglesey schools and key partners to implement a programme that inspires school children and enables future job opportunities at Wylfa Newydd. This applies to students already studying (including mature students), or planning to study a discipline that could lead to a future job at the Power Station. Examples include STEM vocational subjects at Coleg Menai and engineering at Bangor University.

We have recently launched our Primary Outreach Resource programme, which has been developed in partnership with a number of Anglesey primary school teachers. The programme has been mapped to the curriculum in Wales, has all supporting materials needed for teachers to deliver it independently, and supports the development of key skills from a young age. In March 2017, we visited primary schools across Anglesey engaging with over 320 Key Stage 2 pupils and hope to reach many more schools across the wider North Wales region.

Following the success of last year's Work Insight Week, we will be offering an opportunity at the Energy Centre (Coleg Menai) for up to 28 young people (Years 11-13) from Anglesey and North Gwynedd to meet members of Horizon from a range of departments to gain a better understanding of the Project and future career opportunities.

We continue to develop educational resources for primary and secondary schools and have introduced a new education brand, "Futures". The Futures programme will take a young person all the way from the Primary sector to Further and Higher Education, as it incorporates all aspects of our educational engagement. To support the development of Futures, we have developed an education page on the Horizon website, which will house all our educational resources, signpost other relevant websites and offer careers-related information.



TECHNICAL APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME

In partnership with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai, Horizon launched its Technical Apprenticeship Scheme in 2016 with an initial intake of 10 apprentices and is recruiting for a further 12 apprentices for the academic year 2017/18. This three year programme represents the start of Horizon's long-term commitment to recruiting driven, talented people to work on the Wylfa Newydd Project. Horizon is also working with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai in order to secure suitable Level 3 and Level 4 apprenticeships in related fields for Wylfa Newydd and this work will help to secure high quality provision not just for Horizon but also for other businesses in the local area.

Horizon has a long history of cooperation with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai and over the past four years has provided £360,000 of funding for Cwmni Prentis Menai, aimed at providing employment and apprenticeships for young people before the Horizon Technical Apprenticeship scheme was operational.

It is not just in the area of apprenticeships that Horizon has developed a fruitful relationship with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai.

Horizon has invited lecturers from the Grŵp to sit nuclear training courses and attend nuclear events to help contextualise the project. In 2016, Horizon contributed £1 million towards the development and relocation of the Engineering provision at Grŵp Llandrillo Menai to Llangefni as well as providing advice and assistance in specification of the facility. This early investment in skills is seen as a crucial part of our strategy to upskill young people in the local area and prepare for the operation of Wylfa Newydd.

We have also been instrumental in the involvement of the wider Hitachi Group which has seen the Heavy Plant Centre concept at Coleg Menai revised and to which Hitachi Construction Machinery contributes earth moving equipment and construction machinery for use in the centre. In late 2016, Hitachi Power Tools donated £25,000 of power tools to the Grŵp which are in use by students. Horizon sees the development of these relationships with the Grŵp and other stakeholders as very important.

Horizon is looking at the feasibility of introducing degree apprenticeships in conjunction with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai and Bangor University in order to provide another route for local young people to enter the workforce at Wylfa Newydd.



GRADUATE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Horizon operates a Graduate Development Programme from our corporate headquarters in Gloucester across the business. The scheme aims to recruit and develop young talent to deploy across Horizon's sites. Horizon has a Memoranda of Understanding with the University of Bangor and maintains contact with Bangor and Wrexham Glyndŵr universities in North Wales along with a number of others across England. Horizon is working with Bangor University to add a nuclear context to some of their existing courses.

OTHER ROUTES TO EMPLOYMENT

In addition to the entry routes mentioned above, Horizon is looking at a number of other routes to a career at Wylfa Newydd. This includes, but is not limited to: those looking to change their career direction; those undergoing resettlement from HM Armed Forces; and, the long-term unemployed. Horizon is working with NWEAB and the Department of Work and Pensions to develop these routes further.

TRAINING AND SIMULATOR BUILDING

As part of our plans to provide a skilled workforce for the operational Power Station, we are continuing to propose a Training and Simulator Building close to the Wylfa Newydd site which will house full scope simulators, classrooms and teaching workshops. The facility will need to be up and running prior to commercial operation, in order to ensure that the first crews are ready and qualified to take over operation of the plant at the appropriate time.

The proposed location of the Training and Simulator Building has moved from the east of the Power Station to the south and is now further from the village of Tregele.

SUPPLY CHAIN AND BUSINESS ENGAGEMENT

We recognise that the supply chain is a key element in delivering the Project as well as delivering the benefits of the Project locally.

We have established a number of initiatives to promote the engagement of local and regional businesses and we now have an active programme of activities, including:

- planning a national supply chain event in either Bangor or Venue Cymru, Llandudno, with key partners in attendance
- developing a Supply Chain Action Plan outlining timelines and key activities including identification of categories to maximise opportunities locally
- participating in programmes set up by the Welsh and UK Governments to identify and develop potential suppliers across the whole UK supply chain
- continuing to work collaboratively with agencies such as Construction Future Wales, North Wales Business Council, Enterprise Zones, the local branch of the Federation of Small Businesses and the Confederation of British Industry North Wales
- working closely with Grŵp Llandrillo Menai to develop initiatives such as funding and support towards construction of a new Engineering Centre at Coleg Menai. In addition we are developing additional construction skills capacity in North Wales, collaborating with both Grŵp Llandrillo Menai and Coleg Cambria

- trialling the Wylfa Newydd Employment and Skills Service and developing an overall strategy for the service, this is an initiative led by the Department for Work and Pensions, in partnership with North Wales Economic Ambition Board, Grŵp Llandrillo Menai and Isle of Anglesey County Council

- partnering with the North Wales Economic Ambition Board, CBI North Wales and CBI Regional Council

We continue to promote local businesses and encourage their participation in tendering and many have already been awarded contracts (Balfour Beatty/Jones Bros, Corvus Security Ltd. and DU Construction), which is a reflection of their ability to compete in the UK market.

Community benefits

Our Project will bring important benefits to the UK as a whole including safe and secure electricity supplies, for which there is a nationally recognised need. The Project has the potential to deliver benefits to local communities, and to North Wales in general, through employment and training opportunities and the demand for local goods and services.

We remain committed to ensuring that the Project delivers long-term benefits and enhancements for communities throughout the life of the Power Station. We also want to be a good neighbour and continue to support local communities, including our ongoing commitments to provide charitable donations, community support and sponsorship and effective stakeholder engagement.

We are in the process of preparing a detailed and comprehensive package that will comprise tangible benefits measures, obligations and payments that recognise the communities that will host the proposed Power Station.



We are intending to deliver these benefits in three ways:

- **Inherent Benefits** are benefits that the Project will deliver as part of the project itself, such as local jobs and support to local schools and colleges
- **Statutory Benefits** are benefits secured by requirements on our DCO, planning conditions on the grant of planning permission, and by section 106 planning agreements. These types of benefits are likely to relate to offsetting any adverse effects from the Wylfa Newydd Project and will be informed by our environmental, Welsh language and health impact assessment work. We may also set up a small scale fund to mitigate specific community impacts
- **Voluntary Community Benefits** are contributions (of funds, time or resources) that we make to the local community. Small scale voluntary community benefits are already delivered through our Charitable Donations, Community Support and Sponsorship scheme

We will develop our community benefits package in conjunction with Isle of Anglesey County Council (IACC) and other stakeholders to take into account the following:

- Objectives included in Isle of Anglesey County Council's 2014 Supplementary Planning Guidance for new nuclear build
- The emerging Joint Local Development Plan
- Appropriate benefits shaped by feedback from engagement and communications channels



At this stage, proposed benefits are likely to include the following areas:

- **Education** programmes to create opportunities for young people in the communities local to the Project development sites, support through a capital investment programme for all five secondary schools on Anglesey, and to help promote the take up of STEM subjects
- **Jobs and Supply Chain** the creation and operation of an Employment and Skills Service with the North Wales Economic Ambition Board to promote jobs and skills training opportunities. We're also establishing a supply chain contracts service for businesses to engage in the Wylfa Newydd supply chain
- **Transport** a funding package to allow IACC to deliver highway improvements on the A5025
- **Health and Well-being** delivery of a project health and welfare programme to ensure that community health and welfare services and resources used by local residents are not adversely affected by the Project. We will work with Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board and other healthcare providers on this

- **Accommodation Strategy** including the creation and operation of the Worker Accommodation Management Service acting as a link between workers seeking accommodation and accommodation providers (more information is available in Chapter 5 of the Main Consultation Document). Horizon will also provide funding to support a capital investment programme for the provision of new build social and affordable housing, initially focusing on increasing the housing stock in the Wylfa and Amlwch area. We also intend to increase the available stock of housing to rent by funding a scheme to identify accommodation available for its workers and by providing funds to support IACC's existing empty homes scheme to bring vacant properties back into use



- **Welsh language and culture** we will appoint a Welsh Language and Culture Coordinator to develop a behavioural based programme aligned to the goals of the consultation recommendations and implementation of our Welsh Language and Culture Mitigation and Enhancement Strategy

Horizon is already contributing to the vitality of the Welsh language and culture. The Co-ordinator will work with other key Horizon staff and stakeholders, to make sure our activities that support the Welsh language and culture are maintained and enhanced. They will also play an important role in further developing and implementing mitigation and enhancement measures to address effects on the Welsh language and culture

- **Tourism** we will operate a temporary visitor facility area during the construction programme. We also intend to apply for planning permission for a permanent Visitor and Media Reception Centre for the operational phase of the Project. We will also establish a tourism fund to support and fund tourism initiatives on Anglesey






Landscape and environmental masterplan (LEMP)




Existing baseline




DCO grant








Completion of earthworks for Unit 1



Since our public consultation last autumn, we've been busy reviewing feedback and further refining our plans for Wylfa Newydd. Many of our proposals remain as we set out in 2016 but, to make sure the project is the best it can be, we're proposing some changes to the Power Station layout, and other aspects, such as how we house and manage the temporary construction workforce.

We've carried out a thorough review of our plans and redesigned the layout of the Power Station to make it more compact overall. This means we've been able to streamline our construction schedule and reduce construction worker numbers, which is expected to peak at a maximum of 9,000 for a few months at the end of 2023. This is fewer than the previous peak.

We've also updated other elements of the project:

- we've reduced the number of locations of temporary worker accommodation sites and we are now proposing to accommodate up to 4,000 workers in a specially designed single Site Campus on the Wylfa Newydd site
- we'll construct the Site Campus in phases, with the first two totalling 2,500 beds. The final phase of 1,500 beds will be built only as required. This will reduce our impact elsewhere on Anglesey
- we've refined our parking and travel plans to reflect our revised approach to housing construction workers as Site Campus workers won't need to travel to and from work each day
- we've changed the design of the Logistics Centre at Parc Cybi, and the park and ride at Dalar Hir
- we've also reduced the number of Associated Development sites, combining our essential off-site Power Station Facilities together at Llanfaethlu



WHAT'S STAYING THE SAME?

Many of our proposals remain as we set out in 2016:

- our commitment to improving to the A5025 between Valley and the Wylfa Newydd site
- the location for a park and ride at Dalar Hir
- the location for a Logistics Centre at Parc Cybi
- our commitment to the Welsh language and culture
- our commitment to providing community benefits that help deliver a positive socio-economic legacy to Anglesey but also the wider North Wales region




MORE INFORMATION

The construction workforce is now anticipated to peak at around 8,500. However, to ensure that the Project can be flexible to the pressures of unforeseen increased demand, we are basing our assessments on 9,000 workers. This is a reduction from our Stage Two pre-application consultation estimate of peak working numbers, which is also in response to concerns expressed in previous consultations.
