I refer to the Compulsory Acquisition Hearing for the above Development Consent Order. National Trust previously confirmed it wished to attend the hearing. This email confirms we do not wish to attend the ISH on 5th March 2019.

The National Trust's Relevant Representations state that, "to the extent that any land in which the Trust has an interest will be acquired", it objects. That remains the Trust's position.

On 22 February, Clifford Chance, were instructed to act for Horizon in relation to all aspects of the Trust's land concerns.

Since then, Clifford Chance and the Trust's solicitors, Sharpe Pritchard, have been negotiating the heads of terms of a deed of agreement in respect of Plot Nos. 3 and 4, 61, and 63 to 65. Discussions are at an advanced stage and it is hoped that the deed of agreement can be finalised shortly.

Owing to these developments, the Trust does not intend to appear at the Compulsory Acquisition Hearing on 5 March 2019. Instead, the Trust proposes to send a further note in the next week which will provide more detail on the contents of the deed of agreement.

Once the deed of agreement is completed, the Trust should be in a position to withdraw its objection and will confirm to the Examining Authority if and when it is in a position to do so.

I wish to flag up that the latest version of the Book of Reference (Deadline 6 submission, dated 19 February 2019) identifies the Trust as having an interest in Plot Nos. 5 and 6. The precise nature of that interest is currently being established and so the Trust hopes that the forthcoming note will provide more information in respect of the Trust's relationship with those plots as well.
