Throughout the campaign by Anglesey Says No to Pylons, to stop National Grid building more pylons across Anglesey, I have always been neutral towards Horizon. As you know, from my presentation at the public hearing, like you, I was brought up with nuclear power on Anglesey, and so have always tried to deflect criticism from Horizon. Like you I returned to Anglesey towards the end of my career, and wanted to bring my knowledge and skills to benefit Anglesey.

I fully understand why Horizon are continuing with the DCO, as this will create shareholder value for Hitachi, and fully expect Wylfa Newydd will be built as soon as Horizon is owned by a power utility rather than a technology provider.

My concern is that your DCO document "Statement of Common Ground with National Grid" (SoCG) contains statements that may "lock in" pylons as the only solution. PINS have confirmed to me that when National Grid look again at how to export the power from Wylfa, the entire NSIP process has to start from scratch (if they propose pylons). As such, the comments made in the SoCG about overhead transmission lines are simply no longer true. As an aside, If the connection were buried, as we have endlessly requested, the project would not be an NSIP and the decision would lie with IoACC rather than PINS. IoACC have also requested a buried connection.

I understand the examination is nearly over. The editing work required is minimal. I will do it for you if you are really pushed for resource. I cannot see National Grid having any issues if all you do is state facts.

I understand you want the development consent to be granted. But do you really want it to be obtained by submitting documents that are untrue? Do you really want it recording that you intend being a "bad neighbour"?

Be on the right side of history Gwen!
