It has been brought to my attention that the Socg with National Grid still contains reference to overhead connection via pylons. This is despite the considerable opposition from residents of Anglesey and that of our govt and local govt representatives.

In the unlikely event that this project is ever resurrected either by Horizon or a subsequent investor it implies that an overhead connection is already agreed when in fact a number of alternatives could be utilised that would have a less devastating effect on our landscape and the health of residents living close to pylons.

The impact of a new station will be bad enough for local residents, having a new line of pylons would be a double whammy and signal an end for any hope of a future tourist industry, which those not employed in the nuclear industry rely on.

This seems to be an attempt to gain approval by stealth, and frankly is typical of Horizon's attitude to local concerns across a whole range of issues.
