Notice of Application to make a Non-Material Change (NMC) to the Development Consent Order for the Sizewell C Nuclear Generating Station order 2022.

Together Against Sizewell C (TASC) would be grateful if the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) accepts this supplementary submission regarding the above consultation due to information that has just come to our attention.

In [a post on social media platform X on 13th July 2026](#), Sizewell C Ltd (SZC) said, “We're thinking differently about how materials reach Sizewell C. We're working with off-site fabrication facilities in locations such as Vlissingen in the Netherlands, where components can be fabricated, stored and prepared before being transported directly to Suffolk by sea.”

This raises issues that TASC would like PINS to consider:-

1. Does this mean that the Cut and Bend Factory that is the subject of Change 1, is no longer required due to SZC's now stated intention to utilise offsite facilities?
2. This social media post appears to fly in the face of the thrust of SZC's position in Change 1 that it is more efficient to have onsite production.
3. SZC justify the significant change to the DCO set out in Change 1 on the basis that it reduces the number of HGV journeys in East Suffolk but surely offsite fabrication of the steelwork and delivery direct to site by sea (as advanced by the

social media post) would eliminate virtually all the HGV journeys related to moving the fabricated articles?

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
