Dear Inspectors,

Opposition to proposals for the construction of Sizewell C Nuclear Power Station

I am writing to express my very real concerns, and therefore opposition to, the construction of Sizewell C nuclear power station. There are many well rehearsed arguments which I trust you have become familiar with in recent times, but particularly pertinent to me are these three.

Geology

The coastline of East Anglia is disappearing at an alarming rate due to the soft coastal materials - ie the geology. Global rises in sea level are now inevitable (a change from when Sizewell B was constructed) and will create chaos for the next generation if the power station is permitted.

Zero Carbon

The carbon costs to build the power station are enormous and it will hardly be running by 2050 - so too late to help us stay the right side on 1.5 degrees.

Global nuclear vulnerability

If the UK can argue that nuclear is the way forward then every other country can too. It is a small technological step from enabling less stable nations to use nuclear energy to developing nuclear weapons.

The implications of your decision is huge.
