Dear Sir/ Madam,

I understand that the deadline for recording comments about the building of Sizewell C is tomorrow. I have already written to you with my opposition to this project and thought I would send just a few points on this occasion. In the last few years I have become somewhat cynical about the word "consultation". It seems that large corporations pay "lip service" to the views of the public by organising consultations which do not make any difference to their plans.

In spite of my cynicism, I would like to stress these points:

- 1. I hear that the building of Hinkley Point is in trouble due to the financial state of EDF.
- 2. The £20 billion cost of the Sizewell C project is an unimaginable amount of money and that figure is sure to increase.
- 3. The 1953 floods on the North Sea coast raised the sea level by approximately 4 metres, causing the deaths of many inhabitants of Suffolk and Essex. A repeat of that disaster could well affect the operation and safety of any Nuclear Plant on our coast. The coast is eroding at an alarming rate which makes this whole project illogical.
- 4. The numbers of jobs produced by this project may well exist initially, but when the reactor is finished, the number of people working there will diminish considerably.
- 5. We already have a nuclear plant on the precarious Suffolk coast. Let another area take the strain if we HAVE to have more nuclear power plants.
- 6. Transport is already stretched to the limit on the single carriageway A12. You could invite a politician to experience this road, which was soaked with lorries when Sizewell B was built.
- 7. In Europe, Germany to be precise, there are still significant levels of nuclear pollution in small animals from the Chernobyl disaster! And, as you will know, that disaster occurred 35 years ago!!
- 8. Finally, is the cost of dealing with the waste and decommissioning of the plant factored intro the cost??
