I am heartened that you have at last bowed to pressure to defer your application for a DCO for 'a few weeks'. If we are to believe the Planning Inspectorate website, this will in fact only be for a month.

With the country going into ever further lockdown, London (and even the Prime Minister himself) paralysed by the virus, it is inconceivable that the Inspectorate, Statutory Bodies and local authorities will have the capacity to give the detailed consideration that your lengthy and complex application will require. This is particularly the case in view of the cursory and dismissive way in which your company has responded to community concerns , particularly on the environmental impact of your development, at every stage of tour public consultation so far.

Your press statement of yesterday almost suggests that you are welcoming the impact of the virus at a time when the country is at its most vulnerable as a way of sneaking your application through and of avoiding the rigorous evaluation that it demands.
