Dear Mr Scott

The Marine Management Organisation (“MMO”) received an request on 23 December 2022, to vary the Deemed Marine Licences (dMLs) contained within Schedules 10 and 11 of the Dogger Bank A&B Wind Farms Orders 2015. The requests were to make the following key changes:

- An increase from 6 weeks to 9 weeks for the amount of time required to submit the Noise Monitoring Report to the MMO for Dogger Bank ‘A’ & Dogger Bank ‘B’ Substation Platforms (OSP) pin piles.

The MMO has now completed its consideration of this request, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3)(d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, has varied the dMLs as detailed in the Notice of Variation enclosed (Schedules 8, 9, 10 and 11). If you wish to appeal then in accordance with Rule 22(1)(b) of the Tribunal Procedure (First-tier Tribunal) (General Regulatory Chamber) Rules 2009 (SI 2009/1976) you have 28 days from the date of the sending of the notice of variation to send or deliver a notice of appeal to the First-tier Tribunal.
