Following our checks with the Ministry of Defence, we can confirm that the Air Defence Radar Mitigation Scheme Agreement (RMSA) cannot be shared due to MOD confidentiality provisions. MOD has also indicated that it does not understand why the RMSA itself is required for the purposes of assessing the discharge.

As you will be aware, the MOD has:

confirmed that the RMSA was agreed on 4 September 2025;

issued the Turbine Operation Letter dated 11 November 2025; and

advised that the Secretary of State may consider Requirement 34 satisfied on the basis that appropriate mitigation is in place and will be maintained for the lifetime of the authorised development.

On that basis and noting that Requirement 34 requires consultation with MOD rather than submission of the RMSA itself, we would be grateful if you could continue its assessment of the discharge application relying on the MOD's written confirmation already provided.

If DESNZ requires any further assurance regarding the agreed mitigation arrangements, we would welcome DESNZ engaging directly with MOD. We can help coordinate a contact point if that would assist.

Thank you for your review and for confirming the information required to progress the discharge of Requirement 34.

The Air Defence Radar Mitigation Scheme Agreement (RMSA) does contain MOD confidentiality provisions, and as such we are currently seeking confirmation from the Ministry of Defence that it can be shared with DESNZ for the purposes of your assessment. We expect to be able to provide this as soon as that confirmation is received.

In terms of timing, we are keen to progress the discharge at the earliest opportunity once the RMSA has been submitted, to provide regulatory certainty in respect of turbine operation. In addition, we have an agreed internal programme that has been shared with senior management, so timely discharge would support project governance and assurance at that level.

I will update you as soon as we are able to provide the RMSA, or if there is any further information you require in the meantime.

Thank you for submitting the formal request to discharge Requirement 34 for the East Anglia Two Offshore Wind Farm Order 2022.


