Dear Mr Murdoch,

East Anglia TWO Offshore Windfarm Order 2022 (“the Order”) - Variation 1 (Schedules 13 and 14)

In April 2022 the Secretary of State for the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) granted consent for the East Anglia (EA) TWO Offshore Wind Farm Order 2022 (“the Order”) which included, in Schedules 13 and 14, Deemed Marine Licences (DMLs) in accordance with Section 149 of the Planning Act 2008.

In October 2025 the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) received a request from the Project to vary the DMLs for EA TWO (Schedules 13 and 14) contained within the Order. The request was to make the following changes:

1. To include an additional coordinate to define the array area in order to align with the array area authorised under the Order;
2. To increase the maximum hammer energy to be used for the monopile foundation installation from a consented 4,000 kJ to a proposed maximum of 5,500 kJ;
3. To decrease the maximum monopile foundation diameter from a consented 15 metres (m) to a proposed maximum of 10.6 m;
4. To include the designated disposal site references TH084 and TH085 in the Generation Asset DML (Schedule 13) and references TH086 and TH087 in the Transmission Asset DML (Schedule 14).

The MMO has now completed its consideration of these requests and, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72(3)(d) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009, has varied the DMLs as detailed in the Notices of Variation enclosed.

Also enclosed is a copy of the varied DMLs.

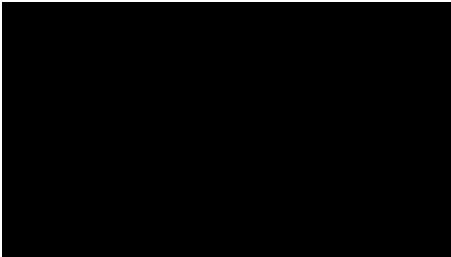
