Dear Mr Wheeler

Further to your email below and your letter of 1 August 2018 attached, I am sorry for the delay in a response reaching you however a number of the points you raise were covered in our email to you on 13 August in response to your earlier submission on 4 July.

As explained in our email on 13 August, as the projects have not yet been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate (the Inspectorate), the Inspectorate has no formal powers to intervene on consultees' behalf and we are therefore not in a position to supervise the statutory consultation process conducted by the Applicant and cannot consider representations about the merits of a proposed application at the pre-application stage of the process.

The Inspectorate can however consider your comments in addition to the statutorily required Acceptance tests when making the decision about whether or not to accept the application under section 55 of the Planning Act 2008. It will be for the decision maker (the Inspectorate on behalf of the Secretary of State) to decide the weight to give to the views expressed in your comments based on the individual facts of the case.

In relation to your request for outreach, whilst we have held meetings with the public to explain the NSIP planning process in certain instances for other proposals, we have now provided the same information in videos as part of the advice readily available on our website. We therefore feel that the information will sufficiently cover the advice we could provide in person and we would be grateful if you could please share this with any relevant people.

If the application is accepted for examination you will have the opportunity to make representations about the merits of the application to an appointed Examining Authority at the appropriate time. In order for members of the public to be involved in the examination of a project please note they must, at the appropriate time, register to become an interested party.
