1. IVY TODD FARM:

Justification: This is the very best advantage point to see the effect of the development not only on Ivy Todd Farm itself, (which is the closest receptor to Vanguard and Boreas) but on all the surrounding areas/villages/residences.

Being on the proposed substation site itself looking out, will not give nearly as much information as being on the vantage point of the closest of Ivy Todd farm's fields, whereby you would look out onto the whole of both substations' sites, the plane crash site, the Dudgeon substation and the National Grid existing substation and extensions sites. It will give you a complete overveiw of the situation in its entirety. You can even see Top Farm from here (see below).

A second suggestion for a site visit would be Top Farm, Necton, because we feel very strongly that the fact that VF cannot claim there was nowhere better that was available (and was offered to them for sale) will need to be considered when the possible CPO of Necton Farm is discussed.

The fact that VF is also going to completely sever Top Farm with its access road (as they have very clearly told the owners,) but not build the substations on it may be another reason for not building there. Perhaps you could ask them, on site, to explain why they did not buy it.
