To whom it may concern,

Whilst East Ruston Parish council welcome the decision to use HVDC we must emphasise that there be no retraction of this decision. The use of HVDC is crucial to the reduction of traffic movements through the village and of course ensures that there will be no cable relay stations in our locality.

The following are concerns that the Parish Council have about the inevitable increase in construction traffic, together with suggestions on how to mitigate the impact.

- The ERPC would like to be kept informed of all road closures.
- Diversions need to take account of the fact that most of the roads in the area are single track and are used by walkers, horse riders and cyclists as well as motorised traffic and the ERPC would want to know in detail how such roads and the parties who use them would be protected from heavy and frequent traffic.

- Any damage to road surfaces and verges should be rectified.
- The ERPC would want to know how tourist businesses might be affected by traffic issues and how this can be minimised.
