Thank you for your letter of 27th September 2019 which informed us of the decision to set a new date for determination of the above application and informed us of, and invited comment on, late representations relating to ornithological matters.

Eastern IFCA has no comment to make on the late representations relating to ornithological matters.

In relation to the sandbanks in The Wash and North Norfolk Coast Special Area of Conservation (SAC), Eastern IFCA would like to report that our position has not changed from that presented in our Statement of Common Ground. We remain concerned that the export cable route for Hornsea Project Three crosses an area of this SAC that is closed to demersal fishing via an Eastern IFCA byelaw, and that this area (which includes habitats that are sub-features of sandbanks) is likely to be
