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2. Executive Summary

- 2.1. The Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey undertaken by Royal HaskoningDHV in February 2017 (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a) identified 6 habitat areas as being suitable for supporting notable breeding bird species.
- 2.2. The purpose of the surveys was to ascertain whether any notable bird species (i.e. notified species of a Site of Special Scientific Interest, red or amber listed Bird of Conservation Concern, Norfolk Biodiversity Action Plan species or species listed on Schedule 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981[as amended]) were breeding at any of the sites and in what numbers.
- 2.3. Transect surveys were set up and carried out between May and August 2017 at 6 sites. Survey data, including sightings maps are included as separate documents under Appendix 2 (A through F). Methodologies were developed using guidance documents from Bibby *et al.* (2000) and Gregory, Gibbons and Donald (2004).
- 2.4. There was reduced access at three sites: Pigneys Wood BB04, Rush Meadows BB01 and River Wensum Floodplain BB06. Despite the reduced access, robust data was obtained from these three sites.
- 2.5. A number of notable bird species were recorded holding territories at all six sites surveyed.
- 2.6. In total 18 different species of Red and Amber listed Birds of Conservation Concern were recorded holding territories over the survey areas.
- 2.7. The greatest number of notable species (13) were recorded at Dillington Carr BB02 and the greatest number of different species holding territories (33) were recorded at the River Wensum Floodplain BB06.
- 2.8. Schedule 1 birds were recorded holding territories at two sites: Land to the south of Dillington Carr BB05 (Kingfisher) and River Wensum Floodplain BB06 (Barn owl).
- 2.9. Due to reduced access coverage at Pigneys Wood BB04, Rush Meadows BB01 and River Wensum Floodplain BB06 and lack of dawn/dusk surveys at all sites, it is recommended to check desktop records to ensure that no significant species have been under represented.

3. Introduction

3.1. Project background

- 3.1.1. Norfolk Vanguard is a proposed offshore wind farm being developed by Vattenfall Wind Power Limited (or an affiliate company), with a capacity of 1800MW, enough to power 1.3 million UK households. The offshore wind farm comprises two distinct areas, Norfolk Vanguard East (NV East) and Norfolk Vanguard West (NV West) and will be connected to the shore by offshore export cables installed within the provisional offshore cable corridor. The project will also require onshore infrastructure in order to connect the offshore wind farm to the National Grid at the existing National Grid substation at Necton, which in summary will comprise the following:
 - Landfall;
 - Cable relay station (if required);
 - Underground cables;
 - · Onshore substation; and
 - Extension to the existing Necton National Grid substation.
- 3.1.2. The location of the onshore electrical infrastructure is shown on Figure 1, Appendix A: of the Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey Report (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a). Collectively the onshore electrical infrastructure is herein referred to as the 'onshore project area'.
- 3.1.3. During the development of the project, the onshore Scoping Area that was initially defined has been refined, to include three landfall options, associated cable relay search zones, as well as an onshore substation search zone in proximity to the Necton National Grid substation. A 200m wide cable corridor has been identified within which the buried cable will be located, and Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) zones and mobilisation zones have been identified along the cable corridor.
- 3.1.4. The surveys described within this report were designed and based on the onshore project area which was in use when the project Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey was undertaken (February 2017). As the project design is further refined, these search zones will decrease in size, and the final options for the siting of infrastructure (i.e. one cable relay station, one landfall, one onshore substation) will be taken forward for the final Development Consent Order (DCO) application in June 2018.

3.2. Aim of report

- 3.2.1. As Norfolk Vanguard is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is required as part of a DCO application under the Planning Act 2008.
- 3.2.2. Norfolk Wildlife Services were appointed in late April 2017 to undertake additional ecological surveys to support this application as set out within the Survey Scope (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017b).
- 3.2.3. The Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a) identified the potential for legally protected species located within the project area plus a 50m buffer surrounding the project area, and provided recommendations for further surveys required to characterise the ecological baseline for the project area.

3.3. Survey objective

3.3.1. To ascertain whether notable bird species (i.e. notified species of a Site of Special Scientific Interest, red or amber listed Bird of Conservation Concern, Norfolk Biodiversity Action Plan species or species listed on Schedule 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981[as amended]) are breeding; in what numbers; and at what times of year within those habitat areas identified by the Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a) as being suitable for supporting notable breeding bird species.

3.4. Survey scope

3.4.1. Development of survey scope

- 3.4.1.1. A Scoping Report for the EIA (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2016) was submitted to the Secretary of State on 3 October 2016 and the response in the form of a Scoping Opinion (PINS, 2016) published on 11 November 2016. That Scoping Opinion included the consultation responses of Natural England and Norfolk County Council.
- 3.4.1.2. An Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey of the onshore project area was undertaken during February 2017 (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a). The Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey identified the potential for legally protected species located within the project area plus a 50m buffer surrounding the project area, and provided recommendations for further surveys required to characterise the ecological baseline for the project area. These recommendations were issued to stakeholders on 17 March 2017 for comment, as part of the project Evidence Plan Process. Feedback was received from Norfolk County Council and Natural England on the 23 March 2017 and 3 April 2017 respectively that the methodologies were appropriate and acceptable.
- 3.4.1.3. A Survey Scope detailing the surveys required in order to deliver the Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey Report recommendations (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017b) was produced in March 2017. The Survey Scope (set out in Section 3.4.2) was used to tender for delivery of ecological surveys required for the project. Norfolk Wildlife Services based the methodology on this Survey Scope in consultation with the client.

3.4.2. Survey scope

Survey Areas

- 3.4.2.1. The locations of the survey areas are shown in Appendix 1. Three SSSIs located within a precautionary 1km disturbance buffer of the project area are notified for the breeding bird assemblage they support. The sites are:
 - · Booton Common;
 - · Dillington Carr; and
 - Dereham Rush Meadows.
- 3.4.2.2. A County Wildlife Site associated with Dillington Carr, Land South of Dillington Carr, extends into the project area.
- 3.4.2.3. In addition, there are no notified breeding birds associated with the River Wensum SSSI, however the Wensum valley is known to support a range of breeding birds along the habitats adjacent to the River. Coastal floodplain grazing marsh habitat has been identified along the habitats adjacent to the river within the survey area.
- 3.4.2.4. One Local Nature Reserve which includes suitable habitats for breeding birds, Pigney's Wood, is located within the project area.

3.4.2.5. Breeding bird surveys of the habitat areas identified above will be undertaken. This includes surveys of the statutory and non-statutory designated sites listed above, and the coastal floodplain grazing marsh adjacent to the River Wensum.

Methodology

- 3.4.2.6. A transect is required to survey each habitat / site. The transect must cover as much of site as possible, ensuring a route which gets you within 50m of every point within the site. The exact location of the transect will be determined by the survey team on site during the first transect survey.
- 3.4.2.7. The transect survey will be conducted following the methodology adapted from Bibby et al. (2000) and Gregory, Gibbons and Donald (2004). All birds observed or heard whilst walking the transect are to be recorded following the established British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) hierarchical coding scheme (Crick, 1992). This includes all species, not just those for which a site is designated or notified. Location of species within the survey area will also be recorded. Birds that are seen flying over the survey area (aerial species) are recorded separately. Individual birds should not be double-counted. The exact location of the transect will be determined by the survey team on site during the first transect survey.
- 3.4.2.8. This transect survey will be conducted approximately once a month within the period from April to August inclusive to provide a good degree of coverage over the breeding period (SNH, 2014). Exacts dates for the survey should be determined based on the prevailing weather conditions and on landowner access restrictions. Surveys should not take place in heavy rain, poor visibility or strong wind. This survey should be undertaken during the morning (prior to midday), but avoiding the dawn chorus (when song activity is too concentrated).
- 3.4.2.9. All survey should be undertaken by experienced ornithologists, preferably members of the Chartered Institute of Ecology and Environmental Management (CIEEM). No species licences are required for these surveys.

3.5. Scoping of survey locations

- 3.5.1. The Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey by Royal HaskoningDHV (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2017a) identified designated sites, which had associated need for breeding bird surveys. These sites were specified within the document: PB4476.003.041 Environmental Impact Assessment Phase 2 Ecological Surveys Scope 2017 (Royal HaskoningDHV, April 2017) and set out in Section 3.4.2 above. This includes surveys of the statutory and non-statutory designated sites listed below, and the coastal floodplain grazing marsh adjacent to the River Wensum Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).
- 3.5.2. The survey locations consist of 6 survey sites. The location of these sites are shown in Appendix 1. The sites and rationale are summarised in Table 1.

4. Methodology

4.1. Section 4.1 sets out the proposed survey protocol as agreed between Royal HaskoningDHV and Norfolk Wildlife Services prior to any field work commencing, and Section 4.2 sets out how the surveys were delivered in relation to the protocol and identifies any deviations or modifications that took place during the delivery phase.

4.1. Survey protocol

4.1.1. This Section details the proposed survey protocol as agreed between Royal HaskoningDHV and Norfolk Wildlife Services prior to any field work commencing.

Relevant guidance

- 4.1.2. The following guidance documents were informative to the development of the survey methodology:
 - Bibby, C. J. (2000). Bird census techniques. Elsevier.
 - Gregory, R. D., Gibbons, D. W., & Donald, P. F. (2004). Bird census and survey techniques. Bird ecology and conservation, 17-56.
 - Crick (1992) British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) hierarchical coding scheme (within Bibby et al 2000).

Survey methodology

- 4.1.3. Breeding bird surveys will be undertaken at the sites identified above, based on a transect survey approach, following a methodology adapted from Bibby *et al.* (2000) and Gregory, Gibbons and Donald (2004). Field surveys will be carried out by Norfolk Wildlife Services based upon the supplied locations and methodology.
- 4.1.4. A transect will be laid out to maximise site coverage, ensuring access to within 50m of every point within the site wherever possible. The exact location of the transects will be determined and mapped by the survey team on site during the first transect survey.
- 4.1.5. All birds observed or heard on the transect will be recorded using British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) hierarchical coding scheme (Crick, 1992). All species and their locations will be recorded, not just those for which a site is designated or notified. Birds that are seen flying over the survey area (aerial species) will be recorded separately. Double-counting of individual birds should be avoided.
- 4.1.6. Transect surveys will be conducted approximately once a month within the period from April to August inclusive to provide a good degree of coverage over the breeding period (Scottish Natural Heritage, 2014).
- 4.1.7. Exact dates for the survey should be determined based on the prevailing weather conditions and on landowner access restrictions.
- 4.1.8. Surveys will be undertaken during the morning (prior to midday), but avoiding the dawn chorus when song activity is too concentrated.
- 4.1.9. Surveys will not take place in heavy rain, poor visibility or strong wind.
- 4.1.10. All surveys will be undertaken by experienced ornithologists.
- 4.1.11. No species licences are required for these surveys.

4.2. Survey delivery

4.2.1. This Section details how the surveys were delivered in relation to the agreed protocol, identifies any deviations or modifications that took place during the delivery phase and highlights survey limitations.

4.2.1. Survey methodology as delivered

Access to survey sites

- 4.2.1.1. The transect route maps as used are shown in Appendix 1. On one or two of the survey visits the transect route was reversed.
- 4.2.1.2. The identified transect routes allowed coverage of as much of the site as was safely practical given the habitats encountered. All transect routes were sufficient to allow surveyors to pass within 50m of every point (even where there were sections of the survey area that were difficult to physically access).
- 4.2.1.3. Some areas at Dereham Rush Meadows BB01, Pigney's Wood BB04 and River Wensum BB06 could not be safely accessed or easily viewed. Constraints on full access are detailed in Table 2.

Survey effort

4.2.1.4. Transect surveys were conducted at least once a month between May and August inclusive as set out in Table 3. April visits were not completed due to survey programme delays outside of NWS' control. An additional survey was completed at all sites as soon as feasible to compensate for this limitation.

Timing and weather conditions

- 4.2.1.5. The weather conditions and timings during the surveys complied with those required by protocol and are given in Table 4.
- 4.2.1.6. All surveys were prior to midday, but avoided the dawn chorus.

4.2.2. Limitations

- 4.2.2.1. The lack of an April survey for the sites deviates from the survey scope as set out in the Extended Phase 1 Habitat Survey Report, but given that the sites were all surveyed during May seems unlikely to form a significant constraint. It may mean that some early singers such as mistle thrush, dunnock, bullfinch, lesser and great spotted woodpecker are underrepresented.
- 4.2.2.2. Limitations of coverage at specific sites and expected impacts are outlined in Table 6.
- 4.2.2.3. There were no significant constraints in relation to timings specified in the protocol. A lack of dusk and dawn surveys means that some diurnal or night singers may be under represented e.g. owls, nightjar, and nightingale.

5. Results

- 5.1. Survey data, including sightings maps are included as separate documents under the heading Appendix 2 (A through F).
- 5.2. A brief summary of total notable species (excluding flyovers) observed holding territories on each site are summarised in Table 7 below. A full list of species noted holding territories is summarised in Table 8.
- 5.3. A number of notable species were recorded at each site, including breeding Barn Owl at River Wensum Floodplain, and Kingfisher at land south of Dillington Carr.
- 5.4. A total of 18 different Red and Amber listed Birds of Conservation Concern, 4 LBAP species and 7 SSSI notifiable species were noted holding territories throughout the surveys.

6. Conclusions

- 6.1. A number of notable bird species were recorded holding territories at all six sites surveyed.
- 6.2. In total 18 different species of Red and Amber listed Birds of Conservation Concern were recorded holding territories over the survey areas.
- 6.3. The greatest number of notable species (13) were recorded at Dillington Carr BB02 and the greatest number of different species holding territories (33) were recorded at the River Wensum Floodplain BB06.
- 6.4. Schedule 1 birds were recorded holding territories at two sites: Land to the south of Dillington Carr BB05 (Kingfisher) and River Wensum Floodplain BB06 (Barn owl).
- 6.5. Due to reduced access coverage at Pigneys Wood BB04, Rush Meadows BB01 and River Wensum Floodplain BB06 and lack of dawn/dusk surveys at all sites, it is recommended to check desktop records to ensure that no significant species have been under represented.




Figure 3: Bird survey location – Dillington Carr BB02




Figure 6: Bird survey transect route – Booton Common BB03




Figure 7: Bird survey location – Pigney's Wood BB04




Figure 11: Bird survey location – River Wensum Floodplain BB06
