Officers from the Counter Terrorism Unit (CTU) swooped on the Selby address in November last year.

"What police found was that the defendant had been publishing numerous Facebook pages which contained anti-Muslim comments," added Mr Brook. "Some of these posts were clearly threatening and clearly designed to stir up anti-Muslim feelings."

In his rants, Carver declared his hatred of Muslims and shared similarly-vile

He said Carver had lived an introverted life and "felt useless" following the break-up of his relationship, but he had since found new accommodation and work.

Judge Paul Batty QC described Carver's "extremely-serious" posts as "persistent in the extreme".

Following sentence, Detective Chief Superintendent Clive Wain, head of the North East CTU, said: "Posts like these have the power to influence many vulnerable people and stir up racial hatred. As this case shows, it is vital that the public report concerning online material."

"By bringing such postings and websites to the attention of police we can work together with our partners to identify those responsible and put them before the courts."

Street lights are in the spotlight

RYEDALE District Council (RDC) is to carry out a review of street lighting in Norton and Malton ahead of assessing who should maintain them in the future.

Norton and Malton town councils had previously been told the district authority intended to cease responsibility for footway lighting from April 2018, but questions had arisen over who owned the lights.

In a letter, Peter Johnson, RDC's resources and enabling services lead, said: "The council has reviewed the statutory instruments relating to the transfer of property under the 1974 Local Government reorganisation and has concluded, based on the informa-

tion available that it cannot enforce the course of action.

"While the legal advice is that we retain the legal obligation, it is still possible to enter into a voluntary arrangement to transfer street lighting as we did in 1994 when street lighting for Pickering was transferred to the town council."

He added: "In line with the principles of subsidiarity, RDC believes the responsibility for street lighting would be best provided through the town/parish councils.

"RDC has faced significant reductions in its funding and, as a result, has had to deliver savings of over £4m over the last six years.

"The council estimates that further savings of over £1m will be required over the next four years.

"This will require the council to

continually review the services, including the provision of street lighting, to address the funding deficit."

Mr Johnson said RDC could undertake a survey of street lighting to assess the implications of bringing the lamps and columns up to standard and then provide options of future delivery to the members of RDC.

A survey carried out by Councillor Ray King, mayor of Norton, and the deputy clerk, Tim Hicks, had found a varied condition of the lights.

Norton town clerk Ros Tierney said: "As the district council has concluded that it is their legal obligation to maintain the lights, and until such time as they have carried out the assessment to bring the lamps and columns up to standard, when they will consult with us again, no further action is required."

Drug-fuelled attacker left his girlfriend with severe injuries to brain

A DESIGN engineer who left his girlfriend with severe brain injuries after a drug-fuelled attack has been jailed.

Samuel Farley, 21, inflicted at least 17 blows on Esther Garrity as they walked home from a night out in Middlesbrough.

Miss Garrity, a teenage fashion student at Manchester Metropolitan University, lost teeth and suffered a badly broken jaw and severe brain swelling.

Farley was jailed for 12 years and six months at Teesside Crown Court for the horrific attack and two counts of supplying cocaine.

Judge Simon Bourne-Atton QC said: "This case effectively illustrates the dangers of drug taking. This is, on any view, a tragic case, for it involves the fact that two young hitherto vibrant and talented young people have been blighted. Blighted, of course, Samuel Farley, by your actions on that night, effectively blighted by the drugs you chose to take."

He added: "You would not have become involved in this horrendous attack were it not for the drugs you chose to take."

Miss Garrity's injuries were so bad her head swelled to three times its normal size and her father could not recognise her when he saw her in hospital. A paramedic who attended the scene said her injuries were the worst he had seen anyone survive. She spent 108 days in hospital and continues to suffer the consequences of the attack in April.

Farley, of Melbourne Close, Middlesbrough, had taken cocaine, ketamine and LSD. Sam Green QC, mitigating, said the drugs caused the defendant, normally a loving and caring boyfriend, to behave psychotically.

One fake news story we can assure you is absolutely true

THE TERM "fake news" has been named Collins's Word of the Year 2017.

Usage of the term – regularly used by US President Donald Trump – has risen by 363 per cent since 2016.

Defined as "false, often sensational, information disseminated under the guise of news reporting", "fake news" will now be added to the next print edition of the Collins Dictionary.

Lexicographers, the people who compile dictionaries, found that other politically relevant words had been significant over the last 12 months, including "antifa", an abbreviation of "antifascist", and "echo chamber", which refers to those who share their opinions in environments, especially social media, where the only people who hear or read their views will be of a similar disposition.

"Coryxitismania" enjoyed a resurgence this year thanks to general election coverage, after surfacing in 2015.

Helen Newstead, the head of language content at Collins, said: "Much of this year's list is definitely politically charged, but with a new president in the US and a snap election in the UK it is perhaps no surprise that politics continues to electrify the language."

Cash machine shortage fears

PLANS TO protect free-to-use cash machines have been put forward by the UK's Link network – amid fears that consumers face the possibility of "ATM deserts".

The proposals follow a row over the funding of cash dispensers – and warnings that consumers face more machines charging them to withdraw money, or disappearing altogether. The ATM Industry Association warned Link's proposals could lead to "a vast reduction in free access to cash" and "ATM deserts".

Link said the plans will help to retain an extensive network of free ATMs for consumers.

Brewers Arms making improvements after '0' food hygiene rating

A Snaith pub has been given a '0' food hygiene rating, after inspectors found the establishment to be in a "very dirty" condition.

The Brewers Arms, on Pontefract Road, was found to need 'major improvement' after the council visited the premises on December 5. Since that visit, the pub was found to have made improvements and will soon be given a new rating.

The pub was handed a rating of improvement necessary for hygienic food handling, major improvement necessary for cleanliness and condition of facilities and building, and major improvement necessary for management of food safety.

A spokesman for East Riding of Yorkshire Council said: "An inspection carried out by the council's environmental health officers found the premises, food storage and preparation areas to be in a very dirty condition.

"Fridges and freezers were also found to be dirty, disorganised and badly over-frosted and there was little evidence that food safety measures were being adhered to.

"Officers have revisited the premises since

the initial inspection and have found that significant improvements have been made.

"Further visits will be made to ensure the premises continue to comply with the food

hygiene regulations."

Chris Smith, owner of the pub, wrote on Facebook to explain the situation to customers.

He said: "Regarding our recent 0 food hygiene

rating, we had a routine visit on the 5th December by the Head of Department from ERYC food hygiene and at the time of the visit he has recommended some building work be completed including plastic cladding to the walls and full internal clean of the extraction unit which can only be completed by a registered extraction cleaning company.

"The other reason for the rating was due to some paperwork being misplaced. We have since had a re-visit on the 23rd December and all relevant paperwork was in place and the plastic cladding and extraction unit cleaning has been scheduled for work completion in the next four weeks. Due to this he has verbally recommended a 3-4 score but we will have to reapply and will only go live after 21 days. An internal five critical standards report was completed on the 5th January to which we received a 75 per cent score.

"We want to reassure you all that our standards are as high as ever but unfortunately EHJO have a 0 tolerance on these minor issues. Chris and Chrissie would like to thank everyone for their continued support and messages."

Plans for 200 new affordable homes

A PLAN to invest up to £22 million to build or acquire more than 200 new affordable homes by March 2020 has been agreed by Selby District Council.

Twenty new affordable homes have already been built at sites in Byram and Eggborough and 30 more are lined up for other areas including Selby town and Riccal.

Now the council has a plan that will see it make the most of land it already owns, develop brand new sites for housing and acquire affordable homes built by others too.

A spokesman for the council said: "With a great quality of life, fantastic transport connections, good schools and vibrant market towns, demand for housing in the district remains high.

"The council's addressing this in lots of different ways, including through support for large and small-scale new

developments, bringing more empty homes back into use and through this new ambitious plan to deliver brand new affordable homes too."

The council could deliver some of this in partnership with the Selby District Housing Trust, which manages a range of affordable homes in the area.

Affordable housing will be delivered in the following ways through this new approach:

- The direct development of housing on land already owned by the council, primarily using sites that are already developed but not currently used for housing such as former garage sites



and larger plots of land owned by the council

- The possible acquisition and development of brand new housing sites in the district

- Through the acquisition of homes built by others which can be managed as affordable properties

- The ability to release council-owned land to 'self-builders' if the authority's not in a position to be able to develop it

Selby District Council executive member for housing Cllr Richard Musgrave, pictured, said: "Housing is such an important part of what the council's doing, because it's such an important part of people's lives.

"This is yet another way in which we're investing in delivering quality homes that people want and need in our area. It'll provide more options for families and individuals in an area that's really growing fast.

"By March 2020 we aim to have provided over 200 new affordable homes."

Drax Power Limited is proposing to modify up to two of its remaining coal-fired generating units and construct up to two gas-powered electricity generating units. Each gas-powered unit would (subject to technology and commercial considerations) be connected to its own battery energy storage facility. In addition, a proposed new pipeline will provide gas to the new generating units.

The whole scheme would upgrade and increase Drax's generation capability to meet demand into the 2030s and beyond, make Yorkshire home to large-scale battery technology and provide lower carbon power generation in line with Government plans to phase out coal-fired power stations.
