1. Introduction

comprises an electricity generating station made up of reciprocating gas engines with electrical output totalling 600 MW, and batteries with electrical output of 150 MW and storage capacity of up to 600 MWh (referred to as 'the Development'). The Development will be known as the Thurrock Flexible Generation Plant. A full description of the Development can be found in the Environmental Statement ('ES'), Volume 2, Chapter 2 (Project Design) (examination library reference: [APP-045]), and information relating to design evolution and principles of design is

1.1.1 The development for which Thurrock Power Limited ('the Applicant') is seeking consent

- Statement ('ES'), Volume 2, Chapter 2 (Project Design) (examination library reference: [APP-045]), and information relating to design evolution and principles of design is contained in the Design Principles Statement (examination library reference: APP-140). As the generating capacity of the scheme is above 50MW, it falls under the definition of a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project ('NSIP') and therefore requires a Development Consent Order ('DCO') under the Planning Act 2008 ('the Act'). The DCO would authorise the compulsory acquisition of land, interests in land and rights over land, and the powers to use land permanently and temporarily for the construction, operation and maintenance of the proposed development.
- 1.1.2 The Applicant's DCO application was submitted to the Secretary of State on 27 May 2020 and was accepted for examination on 24 June 2020. The reference number applied to the DCO application is: EN010092. The examination of the application started on 16 February 2021.
- 1.1.3 On 20 April 2021, the Applicant made an application for a material change to the DCO application in relation to the access arrangements for oversized abnormal indivisible loads ('the material change request') (see covering letter at examination library reference: AS-012). The amendments will require additional land, a new work and a new sub-work to be added to the land affected by the DCO. The changes proposed include the construction of a new area of access road and an addition to the previously proposed access works.
- 1.1.4 In accordance with the Procedural Decision letter issued by the Examining Authority on 26 April 2021 (examination library reference: PD0-12), the Applicant ran a consultation process seeking views on the Supplemental Environmental Information ('SEI') submitted by the Applicant in support of the material change request.
- 1.1.5 The purpose of this report is to show how the Applicant has complied with the Examining Authority's Procedural Decision letter of 26 April 2021 in relation to consulting on the SEI submitted by the Applicant in support of the material change request.

2. SEI Consultation Requirements

2.1.1 In the Procedural Decision letter issued by the Examining Authority on 26 April 2021, it was noted that, although there is no statutory requirement for the Applicant to consult on or to publicise the SEI submitted in support of the Applicant's material change request, this was considered desirable in order to ensure that those who may wish to comment on it had the opportunity to do so. The Examining Authority therefore agreed to the Applicant's suggestion that consultation on the SEI be carried out alongside the notification/publicity requirements under the Infrastructure Planning (Compulsory Acquisition) Regulations 2010 ('CA Regulations') and copies of the consultation responses on the SEI be provided to the Examining Authority at the same time as the Certificates of Compliance relating to the consultation on compulsory acquisition.

3. Consultation on SEI Undertaken by the Applicant

Identifying Consultees

- 3.1.1 The Applicant identified that all statutory consultees, including the relevant local authorities, and all parties with land interests affected by the material change request needed to be notified under the CA Regulations, and the same parties were consulted in relation to the Applicant's SEI. A list of parties consulted on the SEI can be found at Appendices 1 and 11.
- 3.1.2 The Applicant identified persons who had an interest in the land affected by the material change request by ongoing engagement with land interests consulted during the consultations undertaken in 2018 and 2019 and by instructing Ardent infrastructure and Regeneration ('Ardent') to conduct a comprehensive land referencing exercise in respect of the additional land required by the proposed changes to the DCO. The full methodology used by Ardent can be found at Appendix 2.
- 3.1.3 In summary, Ardent has conducted a number of Land Registry Title Edition checks subsequent to acceptance of the DCO application by the Planning Inspectorate in June 2020, the most recent of which was on 16 April 2021. Any changes to the relevant land interests were tracked in the updated Book of Reference submitted by the Applicant in support of the material change request. The updated Book of Reference can be found in both clean and tracked versions on the project page of the Planning Inspectorate's website (examination library references: AS-029 and AS0-31, respectively).

Consultation Process

- 3.1.5 Consultation on the SEI was undertaken concurrently with notification/publicity undertaken under Regulations 7 and 8 of the CA Regulations. Both consultations began on 29 April 2021 and closed on 05 June 2021, a period of 35 days.
- 3.1.6 The Applicant publicised the notice of SEI consultation (Appendix 3) in the following ways:
 - The original notice was sent under cover of a consultation letter (Appendix 4) by Royal Mail first class post to all consultees for whom the Applicant had postal address details only, on 28 April 2021. A list of the postal addresses is at Appendix 1.
 - The original notice was published in two newspapers circulating in the area local the site of the proposed development, on 29 April 2021. The newspapers are the Thurrock Gazette and Gravesend Messenger, and both are published in hard copy and online. Copies of the notice published on 29 April are at Appendix 5.
 - Subsequent to publication of the SEI notice on 29 April 2021, the Planning Inspectorate confirmed that SEI consultation responses were to be sent direct to the Applicant and not submitted by way of representation to the Planning Inspectorate. The Applicant produced an amended notice of SEI consultation (Appendix 3), which was published in the Thurrock Gazette and the Gravesend Messenger on 06 May 2021. Copies of the amended notice published on 06 May 2021 can be found at Appendix 6.
 - A second consultation letter, enclosing an updated SEI consultation notice, was sent out by Royal Mail 1st class post on 30 April 2021 to all postal consultees, to explain that SEI consultation responses should be sent direct to the Applicant. A copy of that letter can be found at Appendix 7 and a copy of the updated notice is at Appendix 3.

- The updated SEI consultation notice was laminated and displayed at a place at the site of the proposed development that is accessible to the public, from 06 May 2021 to 05 June 2021. Photographs of the site notice in situ are at Appendix 8.
- The updated SEI consultation notice was published in the London Gazette and the Times national newspaper on 06 May 2021. Copies of the notice as published are at Appendix 9.
- The updated SEI consultation notice was published on the Applicant's website, in the 'Documents' section from 06 May 2021 and also on the project page of the Planning Inspectorate's website.
- Consultation letters and a copy of the updated SEI notice were sent by email under cover of a short explanatory email to those consultees for whom the Applicant had email addresses, on 29 April 2021. A copy of the covering email is at Appendix 10 and a list of email addresses is at Appendix 11.
- Throughout the consultation period, copies of the proposed changes to the DCO, revised draft DCO, land plans identifying the additional land and land affected by the proposed changes, a supplemental Book of Reference, a Statement of Reasons setting out why additional land is required and further details of how the acquisition of additional land is to be funded, and an addendum to the Environmental Statement were made available on the project page of the Planning Inspectorate's website (examination library references: AS-012 to AS-037, inclusive) and also in the 'Documents' section of the Applicant's website. It was not possible to make the documents available at a location in the vicinity of the application site due to the current COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic and the UK Government's advice relating to health and safety, and the Applicant notes that the Government has issued guidance that a website is a 'place' for the purposes of inspecting documents across all planning regimes.
- The SEI notice and consultation letters made it clear that responses should be sent to the Applicant by email or be made over the telephone and that the consultation would close at 23.59 hours on 05 June 2021.

4. Consultation Responses

4.1.1 The Applicant received 9 responses to the SEI consultation, and these are detailed in Table 1 below, along with the regard had by the Applicant to those responses.

Change Request

Further to your letter of 21st May 2021, Natural England notes the developer has submitted a Change Request upon which comments are invited from Interested Parties. The details of this Change Request are described in the applicant's letter dated 20th April 2021. In essence we understand the Change Request to amount to an alternative access arrangement for Abnormal Indivisible Loads (AILs) which would be delivered via the Port of Tilbury's facilities and then via road access to the development site. This option would entirely negate the need for the riverside causeway and proposed delivery of AIL by barge as is currently proposed, although we note that the applicant intends to retain the causeway option pending legal certainty that the PoT alternative can be secured.

Overall, Natural England supports the Change Request proposal. We have already made representation regarding the proposed causeway

and have raised concerns that this is located within an area of inter-tidal habitat that is functionally linked with the Thames Estuary & Marshes Special Protection Area (SPA) and Ramsar site. We continue to work with the applicant with regard to their Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA), and note the Inspector's Further Questions (ExQ2) issued on 1st June 2021 on this matter (Q7, 2.7.1-2), and anticipate providing a response by Deadline 5 (14th June 2021).

Consistent with the Environmental Impact Assessment and Habitats Regulations Assessment frameworks, if there is an alternative way of delivering the AILs which is less environmentally damaging (notwithstanding ongoing discussions), then this is to be preferred if at all possible. This is also consistent with the 'mitigation hierarchy' of avoid – mitigate – compensate – enhance.

Additional Environmental Information – ES Addendum

Natural England has also reviewed the Supplementary Environmental Information (SEI) submitted alongside the Change Request (ES Addendum dated April 2021), and has the following comments. We note that some new impacts to ecological interests are identified, but are assessed as not significant in EIA terms. We generally concur with this opinion.

We do note that a 140m stretch of water vole ditch habitat is to be lost in the eastern section, and that water vole presence is assumed (but not recently surveyed). Provision for water vole mitigation as part of the wider project is considered by the ES Addendum to be adequate for translocation purposes, however no reference to licensing requirements has been made, and it is not clear whether a Letter of No Impediment (LONI) is needed for the purpose of the Examination. We have made enquiries with the developer and will discuss requirements with them shortly.

Overall, Natural England's position is that notwithstanding some additional ecological impacts arising from the alternative access proposal, the balance of ecological impacts lies clearly in favour of the alternative access and the removal of the causeway entirely from the project. In our opinion, this option would enable the project to much more

Submissions in respect of Applicant's Material Change Request

Introduction

- Thurrock Power Limited ('the Applicant') made a material change request ('the Request')
 in respect of its application for a Development Consent Order for the Thurrock Flexible
 Generation Plant ('TFGP') on 20 April 2021.
- 2. Following the acceptance of this material change request into the Examination by the Examining Authority ('ExA') and consequential procedural decisions on 26 April 2021, this letter constitutes the Port of Tilbury London Limited's ('PoTLL'):
 - Relevant Representation in respect of the 'Additional Land Request' included within the Request by the Applicant, pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Infrastructure Planning (Compulsory Acquisition) Regulations 2010, in light of PoTLL's interests in new plots 05/01 to 05/04 and 05/07 (as identified in the Book of Reference [AS-029]; and
 - response to the additional environmental information included within the Request, pursuant to Regulation 20 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 ('the EIA Regulations').
- As the response to the additional environmental information is required to go to the Applicant under the EIA Regulations, a copy of this letter has also been sent to the Applicant. This will also enable the Applicant to have early sight of PoTLL's Relevant Representation in respect of the land issues.

The Causeway

4. As set out in its Deadline 2 [REP2-096], Deadline 4 [REP4-031] and the Joint Position Statement submitted prior to the 27-29 April Hearings [AS-038], PoTLL's primary concern with the TFGP application and the scope of the Request as it currently stands is that it





does not provide for the removal from the draft DCO of the proposed causeway (Work No. 10) to provide access for Abnormal Indivisible Loads ('AlLs').

- 5. As set out in those submissions, in the context of:
 - the Port's further expansion plans;
 - the Government's choice for this location to form part of its Freeports initiative to help facilitate economic growth in deprived areas, innovation and the levelling-up agenda;
 - the technical difficulties of installing and removing the causeway, which means that it is not just a 'simple' task to remove it to facilitate Port development,

the Port considers that the proposals for a causeway, which would only have a short initial use and a minimal long term-use, are completely disproportionate.

- 6. This is particularly the case as there has always been, and as demonstrated through the Request, there is, an alternative option available to facilitate AIL access to the main TFGP site without the need for a causeway.
- 7. As such, whilst PoTLL is pleased to see the Applicant bring forward the Request to help facilitate this alternative option, PoTLL is disappointed to see that it stops there and does not include removal from the draft DCO of the causeway works and access provisions as a wholesale 'package' of dealing completely with the AlL issues.
- 8. As set out in its Deadline 4 submissions, PoTLL considers that if the Applicant were to bring forward a further change to remove the causeway, this would not need to lead to any further procedural requirements within the Examination timetable as:
 - such a change would be brought in response to the representations of interested parties and thus would not need further consultation; and
 - it would involve the *removal* of powers and development proposals, therefore taking away the effects to interested parties and receptors and thus not leaving them in any way worse off, given that the positive change, of using Tilbury2 instead, has already been considered as part of the Request.

This is particularly relevant given the ExA's SWQ 2.7.1, which asks the Applicant to reconsider its HRA in respect of impacts from the causeway to functionally-linked habitat, further to Natural England's submissions. PoTLL notes in this regard page 3 of Natural England's Procedural Deadline D submission [PDD-012] which highlights that such effects can be 'undone' by removal of the causeway, whilst also noting that the potential 35 year life of the causeway is on the bounds of what could be considered 'temporary'. Clearly, therefore, removal of the causeway would help assuage the important concerns of Natural England.

- 9. PoTLL would also note that, as indicated in its Deadline 4 submissions, it is entirely possible for the Secretary of State to decide under section 114(1) of the Planning Act 2008 to make a DCO in a different form to that which was applied for, where the issues in contention which relate to the changed DCO have been the subject of submissions during the Examination.
- 10. In that context, it is also entirely possible for the ExA to make a recommendation on the same basis, i.e. to recommend a DCO which:

- removes Work Nos. 10 (causeway) and 11 (flood defence wall works) from Schedule 1;
- removes plot 04/01 (the north/south access to the causeway on RWE's land) from Schedule 5 to the DCO; and
- adds the words 'except for plot 04/02 as shown on the land plans' at the end of article 19(1) (compulsory acquisition), 22(1) (compulsory acquisition of rights), 25 (acquisition of subsoil only), 28(1)(a)(iii) (temporary possession) and 29(1)(a) (temporary possession for maintenance).
- 11. Having heard the arguments made by both parties to date, PoTLL would also suggest that the ExA could propose such changes in its schedule of proposed changes to the Applicant's DCO timetabled for release on 19 July.

Discussions with the Applicant

- 12. The Applicant has indicated that its primary concern in respect of facilitating AIL movements is to ensure that there can be no doubt that AILs will be able to be delivered to the existing Port of Tilbury, transported through the Tilbury2 and RWE sites and on to the TFGP site. It has indicated that until it has sufficient certainty on all of these elements it cannot remove the causeway from the draft DCO, which failing that certainty being achieved it could use as a fallback position.
- 13. As set out in the submissions referred to above, PoTLL disagrees with this position, noting that:
 - whilst it and RWE are working with the Applicant to agree a voluntary agreement, ultimately the Applicant could (and has) apply for compulsory acquisition powers to ensure that AILs could be transported through the Tilbury2 and RWE sites; and
 - like any other customer to the Port of Tilbury, the Applicant would be able to take advantage of PoTLL's 'open port duty' under section 6 of the Port of London Act 1968 to be open to all persons for the shipping and unshipping of goods.
- 14. As such, PoTLL continues to consider that the Applicant should now bring forward proposals for the removal of the causeway into the Examination in light of the proposals that are contained within the Request.
- 15. As mentioned above, however, PoTLL also continues to discuss a voluntary agreement with the Applicant to formalise:
 - the land rights needed to enable all vehicles (including those used for AlLs) to pass through Tilbury2;
 - the controls on those rights to ensure that PoTLL's statutory undertaking is protected, to work in tandem with the provisions of the DCO and its certified documents such as the Outline Construction Traffic Management Plan; and
 - the Applicant's ability to 'call-off' a Handling Agreement in relation to any use of Port of Tilbury (which it would be able to do in any event absent this proposed Agreement).
- 16. Good progress has been made in these discussions, and between the Applicant and RWE, and so it is anticipated that Heads of Terms agreeing all substantial points will be

agreed shortly after this deadline with the intention (agreed to by all parties) of seeking to complete the legal agreements themselves before the July hearings.

Additional Land Request - Concerns

- 17. Notwithstanding the positive progress that has been made in discussions and the welcoming of the Request in general terms, PoTLL objects to the ability for the Applicant to utilise compulsory acquisition powers over the land that is the subject of the Additional Land Request (and indeed over PoTLL's land in the Order limits prior to the Request) absent any form of control within the DCO as to the use of those powers.
- 18. As set out in its previous submissions, PoTLL wishes to achieve that either:
 - the relevant compulsory acquisition powers are removed from the DCO both within the previous Order limits and the land subject to the Additional Land Request, on the basis that an Agreement has been reached and so the compulsory acquisition powers are not justified; or
 - acknowledging that the Applicant will, until an Agreement is reached, want certainty
 that this alternative access provision is able to be brought forward, that the Protective
 Provisions for PoTLL's benefit in the DCO include provision that the use of land powers
 within the DCO over its land should be subject to its consent including the land within
 the Request which forms part of its statutory undertaking.
 - Such consent would enable PoTLL to ensure that the use of powers is consistent with any Agreement it will hopefully reach with the Applicant or, failing that, that controls are able to be imposed to ensure there is no detriment to the Port's undertaking as a result of works and vehicle movements taking place in the same location as the operations of the Port (and their associated movements).
- 19. As such, whilst PoTLL acknowledges the Applicant's contention that there is a need for powers as a backstop to an Agreement not being able to be entered into at this time, if this position is maintained PoTLL seeks a requirement for its consent to the exercise of those powers (as well as its consent to the exercise of the other powers listed in the draft Protective Provisions included in its Deadline 2 submission) within the DCO.

Additional Environmental Information

- 20. As noted in its Deadline 4 submissions, PoTLL is generally content with the information presented in the Applicant's Environmental Statement Addendum [AS-0035], in the context of its concern that the Applicant's proposals should not put PoTLL in breach of its requirements in the Tilbury2 DCO.
- 21. However, PoTLL would comment that it should be ensured that there is certainty and clarity that the mitigation measures stated to be required are fully secured through the DCO and the certified documents. In particular, PoTLL notes that the Mitigation Tracker [AS-036] would appear to suggest that amendments need to be made to mitigation documents which have not yet been undertaken (e.g. to the Outline Ecological Management Plan).
- 22. PoTLL would also welcome clarity as to the statement in the Addendum and Mitigation Tracker that 'if reptiles are present within the western extent of the AIL access route, there is sufficient suitable habitat outside of the application site for reptiles to be relocated via phased clearance of vegetation prior to commencement'. If the suitable habitat outside of the application site is a reference to land owned by PoTLL, it would welcome discussion

- with the Applicant as to how this will be implemented, to ensure it is consistent with PoTLL's own requirements in respect of Port operations and under the Tilbury2 DCO and does not negatively impact on PoTLL in any way.
- 23. In a similar vein, as noted in its Deadline 4 submissions, PoTLL welcomes the proposal to add a new paragraph (4) to article 10 of the draft DCO to deal with the interaction of the works proposed to be authorised as a consequence of the Request with the Tilbury2 DCO. PoTLL set out suggested revised drafting for the new paragraph in its Deadline 4 submissions in order to obtain greater clarity and specificity as to the effect on the Tilbury2 DCO and looks forward to discussing that with the Applicant.

Conclusion

- 24. Further to all of the above, I can confirm that PoTLL will wish to speak at any Issue Specific or Compulsory Acquisition Hearings that the ExA wishes to hold in respect of the Request or the matters raised in this submission.

Environmental Information

We act for RWE Generation UK Plc in respect of the above matter. Please see below submission in respect of the supplementary environmental impact.

We note from the 'Environmental Statement Addendum – Alternative AIL Access' that it is proposed to infill approximately 140m of an interceptor drainage ditch on RWE's land. The addendum notes that "it is understood that the ditch that is a remnant of an interceptor channel located on the northern extent of the former coal stocking area. The drain channel is understood to be isolated and not linked or conveying water from the wider local drainage network."

The addendum further states that "subject to survey and detailed design, this section is therefore proposed to be infilled. Alternatively, if it were necessary to maintain a drainage flow, a diverted or culverted channel could be provided within the works area for this access road section. No adverse effects on hydrology or flood risk are predicted" and that "operational impacts and effects are considered to be unlikely with the highway surface water drainage system in place."

RWE would stress the need to ensure that thorough surveys and monitoring are undertaken to determine any impacts in terms of hydrology and flood risk in infilling this drainage ditch to ensure that drainage systems and flood risk on the RWE site are not adversely impacted as any such changes could have a detrimental impact on this important strategic site and the ability to redevelop it. It is also essential to ensure that this infilling does not cause any operational impacts in relation to the road. RWE would ask that the Applicant consults with RWE in relation to this matter and suitable alternative drainage must be provided if it is found to be required.

Thurrock Power Limited – Land Referencing Methodology

Identifying persons with an interest in land

Section 42(1)(d) requires the applicant to consult each person who is within one or more of the categories set out in Section 44 of the Act. The identification of these persons has been an ongoing process since October 2018 by the Applicant's land referencers Ardent.

For this purpose, the land was defined by reference to Section 41(2) of the Act as the land to which the proposed application relates. This includes all persons interested in land within the proposed Order limits which had been set at that point, to reflect what was considered at the time to be the land needed to fulfil the operational requirements of the Thurrock Flexible Generation Plant proposals and the areas of land that may need to be developed as a result.

These property owners were identified through land registry searches and land referencing questionnaires were issued to the owners. Where properties were unregistered, land referencing questionnaires were issued to The Owner to identify the correct contact details. Discussions were also held with various key landowner agents to identify residential properties which were within their client's ownership. Parties identified through this process are listed in Part 2b of the Book of Reference.

Land referencing process

In October 2018 formal land referencing questionnaires were issued (sample questionnaire attached) to all identified affected parties within the Order limits. Telephone numbers and email addresses were provided on the letter which accompanied the land referencing questionnaires, allowing parties to make contact if they sought further information on the project.

This was followed by a further round of formal land referencing questionnaires for parties who were yet to respond in November 2018 and in July 2019. Where there was unregistered land within the Order limits, site notices were affixed (sample site notice attached) on or adjacent to the land in order to notify any unregistered interested parties of the project.

These notices were fixed on 23 October 2018 and again on 14th November 2018 and left in situ in advance of the statutory consultation exercise. Where there were unregistered properties, site visits on the above dates were conducted which involved visiting the land and where possible speaking with neighbours to assist in identification of interests. Referencing questionnaires were also hand delivered through the letter boxes.

The Common Land Register was obtained from Thurrock Council which identified parties who had an interest in the common land within the Order limits (incorporating both the freeholders and those persons with a right of common, or 'the commoners'). Ongoing discussions have also continued with the land agent acting on behalf of the owner of the common land.

In October 2018 a round of formal land referencing questionnaires was sent to statutory undertakers within the Order limits to determine the presence of any apparatus. The Applicant also conducted its own enquiries into utilities in the land through engineering consultants.

Where land remained unregistered and of unknown ownership, discussions were held between the Applicant and neighbouring landowners and land agents to assist in determining the land ownership. Where the land remains unknown, or any parties remain unknown, this has been noted in the Book oh Reference accordingly. The Applicant will continue to try to identify the missing interests and provide an updated Book of Reference during the examination process if applicable.

The above referencing activities were supported by desktop research through sources such as 192.com, BT Phone Book, Experian and Companies House checks to confirm registered addresses where companies are concerned.

The combination of the above land referencing activities produced a list of interests for the statutory consultation exercise under the Act.

In June 2019 a Land Registry Edition date check was carried out on all previously identified titles to verify the current registered proprietors and identify any changes in ownership that had occurred since titles were first downloaded. Further searches were also conducted with the Land Registry to identify if any previously unregistered land had recently been registered.

Throughout the scheme development and evolution of the Order Limits, where additional land was included within the scheme boundary, further land registry checks were conducted and contact made with registered owners through land referencing questionnaires (supported by contact via phone and email). Further statutory consultation letters were issued to those parties who were newly identified through the above processes and/or had recently taken an interest in land.

On 23rd January, prior to the application submission, a final edition date check was conducted with the Land Registry to identify any final changes to details. This search confirmed there were no further changes to the data already held by the referencing team and documented within the Book of Reference.

The consultee list has been cross checked against the Book of Reference (Document Reference 4.3). The list of Section 42(1)(d) consultees in the consultation report is not identical to the list of parties in the Book of Reference as, for example, there are many additional parties that were consulted who are no longer considered to be an affected party in the submitted Book of Reference. This is due to a combination of changes to the Order Limits removing their interest or changes to the ownership and occupancy of the land removing their interest. It is confirmed that all of the persons in the book of reference have been consulted and are included in the list of Section 42(1)(d) consultees.

Prior to the re-submission of the application, registered company addresses were checked on Companies House to identify any changes. Along with this, a review of the updated commons register was undertaken to identify any updates. On 8th April 2020, an edition date check was conducted with the Land Registry to identify any updates to registered title information. Once the DCO application had been accepted, a further Land Registry edition date check was conducted ahead of issuing the Section 56 notices, to ensure we had identified any new interested parties in order that they could be included in the process and register as an interested party.

In November 2020, a change application was made where there was a reduction of land required. The Land Plans and Book of Reference where updated in tracked changes to reflect this. At the start of

examination in February 2021, a second change application was made, with a further reduction in land. The Land Plans, Book of Reference and Compulsory Acquisition Schedule where amended in tracked changes and submitted. In March 2021, at Deadline 2 of the examination, a set of updated Land Plans and a tracked change version of the Book of Reference were submitted to reflect minor Order Boundary amends, the removal of Port of London Authority Land, and any changes in land interests.

Most recently, on 16th April 2021, a Land Registry Title Edition Date check was completed, which coincided with the material change application. The Red Line Boundary was increased with additional land parcels added to the Land Plans and Book of Reference. Title documents were also reviewed to ensure all parties with an interest in these new areas and from any existing title registers that had been updated, had been identified and included in the tracked change Book of Reference and Compulsory Acquisition Schedule.
