1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Overview

- 1.1.1 The Net Zero Teesside (the 'Project') Development Consent Order Application ('DCO Application') was submitted by the Applicants, Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage, to the Secretary of State on 19 July 2021. The DCO Application was accepted for examination on 16 August 2021.
- 1.1.2 The Project is a technically challenging, and complex 'first-of-a-kind' development. It is a critical part of a Track 1 carbon capture and storage cluster project, which the UK Government has identified as being important for the decarbonisation of the power and industrial sectors both in Teesside and nationally. The Project is effectively two projects in one an industrial decarbonisation project combined with a low-carbon dispatchable power station, located in an area where there are a large number of industrial and other developments (both existing and proposed).
- 1.1.3 Due to the Project's nature and scale, the extent of land interests within the proposed Order Limits and the potential to re-use existing infrastructure to reduce its construction effects, the DCO Application submitted in July 2021 necessarily included a degree of optionality. The Applicants have previously explained to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) the need to retain a degree of optionality within the Application, but have also been clear that their aim would be to reduce that optionality, if possible, in advance of the Examination as the project design is progressed. The options included in the DCO Application were consulted upon and assessed as part of the environmental impact assessment (EIA) for the Project.
- 1.1.4 Since submission of the DCO Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also continuing with detailed project development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality around certain elements of the NZT Project. This work has identified a number of changes that should be made to the Project. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). In addition, there are other minor changes or updates to the Project.
- 1.1.5 On 18 February 2022, the Applicants issued a letter (Document Ref. 7.3) [AS-043] formally notifying the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), acting on behalf of the Secretary of State, of their intention to formally request a change to the DCO Application and sought advice from the Examining Authority (ExA) on the procedural implications of doing so. The notification included a document entitled 'Notification of Proposed Changes to the NZT DCO Application' (the 'Notification Document') (Document 7.4) [AS-044].
- 1.1.6 The Notification Document confirmed that, as the proposed changes, taken together, may be considered to be material by the ExA, the Applicants would carry out non-statutory consultation on the proposed changes prior to making the formal change request. The Notification Document also confirmed that the consultation would be undertaken in accordance with PINS Advice Note 16: How to request a change which may be material (March 2018). The proposed approach to the non-statutory consultation was set out at Section 4.0 of the Notification Document.



1.2 The Purpose and Structure of this Document

- 1.2.1 This document 'the Proposed Changes to the NZT DCO Application Consultation Report' (the 'Consultation Statement') has been prepared to describe the non-statutory consultation that has been undertaken by the Applicants in respect of the proposed changes and how the responses received to that consultation have been taken into account. The Consultation Statement forms part of the formal change request that has been submitted to the ExA.
- 1.2.2 Paragraph 7 of Figure 3 of Advice Note 16 states that "where (proportionate) additional non-statutory consultation has been carried out (either voluntarily or at the direction of the ExA) a Consultation Statement confirming who has been consulted in relation to the proposed change should be submitted. Copies of any consultation responses received by an applicant should also be included with any request, as an annex."
- 1.2.3 The Consultation Statement has been prepared in order to satisfy the requirements set out above. The remainder of this document is structured as follows:
 - **Section 2: Proposed Changes** provides a summary of the rationale for the proposed changes including a brief description of each change.
 - Section 3: Legislative Context and Relevant Guidance outlines any legislation and guidance relevant to the consultation on the proposed changes.
 - Section 4: Applicants' Approach to Consultation sets out the Applicants' approach to
 consultation on the proposed changes and the Examining Authority's response to that
 approach.
 - Section 5: Consultation of Prescribed and Non-prescribed Persons describes how
 prescribed persons, relevant local authorities, statutory undertakers, landownership
 interests and other persons were consulted on the proposed changes.
 - **Section 6: Consultation of the Local Community** describes how the local community was consulted.
 - **Section 7: Consultation Responses** provides a summary of the consultation responses received and how the Applicants have had regard to these.



2.0 PROPOSED CHANGES

2.1 Overview

- 2.1.1 The proposed changes sought to the DCO Application are aimed at reducing optionality, land take and complexity, and respond to matters raised in the Relevant Representations or in discussions directly with Interested Parties. Their overall effect would therefore be positive in reducing the potential effects of the Project on Interested Parties and affected persons, reducing the number of issues to be considered in the Examination and simplifying both the Examination and decision-making processes.
- 2.1.2 There are three main areas of change to the Project being proposed as part of the formal change request as compared to the Project that was presented in the DCO Application submitted in July 2021. These are:
 - 1) the Gas Connection route for Work No. 2A has been selected;
 - 2) the CO₂ Gathering Network route from the north of the River Tees and across the River Tees forming part of Work no. 6 to the Power Capture and Compression (PCC) Site has been reduced in land area; and
 - updates have been made to land parcels across the Project due to further pre-front end engineering design (FEED) construction assessments and landowner discussions.
- 2.1.3 The above have resulted in 13 changes to the Project, which are summarised below. A more detailed description of the proposed changes is provided at Chapter 2 of the Environmental Statement Addendum Volume I (Main Document) (Document Ref. 7.8.1), which forms part of the change request.

2.2 Summary of the Proposed Changes

2.2.1 The proposed changes are described below in Table 2.1 below in terms of changes to the individual Work Number (Nos.) listed at Schedule 1 'Authorised Development' of the draft DCO (Document Ref. 2.1) and shown upon the Works Plans (Document Ref. 4.4). The Applicants are proposing 13 changes in total. The changes remain the same as those in the Notification Report, other than the Applicants have identified the opportunity to remove small additional extents of certain Works Nos. within the Teesworks site, alongside Changes 6 and 13.

3.0 LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT AND RELEVANT GUIDANCE

- 3.1.1 Section 3 of the Applicants' Consultation Report (Document Ref. 5.1) [APP-068] provided a summary of the legislative context for DCOs, including the legislative requirements and relevant guidance relating to pre-application consultation and publicity. There are no legislative requirements relating to consultation on changes proposed to an accepted DCO application.
- 3.1.2 Planning Act 2008: Guidance for the examination of applications for development consent (DCLG, 2015) explains at paragraphs 113-115 the considerations around consultation and engagement on material changes made post acceptance. Key is the need to be able to conduct a fair and reasonable examination, and it is noted that the introduction of material changes during the final stages of the examination period could in some instances mean that the examination would breach these principles.
- 3.1.3 PINS Advice Note 16 provides information to applicants about how to request a material change to an application after the application has been accepted and before the close of the Examination.
- 3.1.4 Paragraphs 3.3 to 3.5 of Advice Note 16 state:

"Before making a written request it is recommended that applicants consult all those persons prescribed in the PA2008 under section 42 (a) to (d) who would be affected by the proposed change (giving a minimum of 28 days). It is advised that if a targeted approach to the identification of those affected by the request to materially change the application is adopted then detailed justification should be provided why it is deemed unnecessary to consult all of the prescribed persons (For example, in the case of Statutory Undertakers, by confirming that the proposed material change would not affect their functions). If applicable, applicants should identify any newly prescribed persons i.e. those who were consulted in relation to the proposed material change but NOT in regards to the original application.

Consultation about the proposed material change may be done voluntarily by an applicant in advance of seeking procedural advice from the ExA if this would save time. If an applicant is unsure about how to proceed then it may seek the views of the ExA, via the Case Manager, as to the scale and nature of any non-statutory consultation exercise.

The ExA may request that further consultation is undertaken if it considers that the steps taken by an applicant have not been adequate to safeguard the interests of and/ or inform those potentially impacted by the material change."

- 3.1.5 Figure 1 of Advice Note 16 provides a summary of the process for making a request for a material change to an accepted application and this includes seeking advice from the ExA about the procedural implications of the proposed material change and about the need, scale and nature of consultation that the applicant may need to undertake.
- 3.1.6 Figure 3 of Advice Note 16 outlines information to include in a request to make a material change to an application after it has been accepted for examination. This includes:
 - "6. If the proposed change results in any new or different likely significant environmental effects, provision of other environmental information and confirmation that:

A. ...

B. any consultation bodies who might have an interest in the proposed changes have been consulted (reflecting the requirements of the EIA Regulations). It is recommended that

applicants submit copies of any responses received from consultation bodies with the change request. Applicants should identify those consultation bodies who were consulted on the proposed changes but NOT on the original application.

7. Where (proportionate) additional non-statutory consultation has been carried out (either voluntarily or at the direction of the ExA) a Consultation Statement confirming who has been consulted in relation to the proposed change should be submitted. Copies of any consultation responses received by an applicant should also be included with any request, as an annex."



4.0 THE APPLICANTS' APPROACH TO CONSULTATION

4.1 Overview

- 4.1.1 Section 4 of the Notification Document set out the Applicants' proposed approach to the non-statutory consultation on the proposed changes to the DCO Application. The proposed consultation was informed by relevant guidance, including that within Advice Note 16, in addition to the Applicants' experience of having undertaken several stages of pre-application consultation on the Project.
- 4.1.2 The Notification Document confirmed that the Applicants intended to carry out consultation to ensure that Interested Parties and other stakeholders and the local community, were made aware of the proposed changes and had the opportunity to make comments and representations on the changes in advance of the submission of the formal change request to the ExA.

4.2 Proposed Consultation

- 4.2.1 The Notification Document confirmed the following with regard to the proposed consultation:
 - Prescribed persons, including local authorities, statutory undertakers and persons with an interest in land affected by the Project and the proposed changes (and other non-prescribed persons previously identified who may be interested in the Project) would be consulted. Those consulted would be the same as those notified of the Application pursuant to Section 56 of the PA 2008, subject to any changes to the Section 56 notification list since August 2021. A letter would be sent to those persons accompanied by information on the changes and providing details of how to submit comments/feedback and a date by which to do so.
 - The local community would also be consulted on the proposed changes. The Applicants would hold two physical consultation events during the consultation period (assuming no public health restrictions were in place) at which information would be displayed on the proposed changes and people would be able to ask questions of members of the project team. Comments/feedback forms would be made available at these events, with the events being held at suitable locations within the vicinity of the Site.
 - The Applicants would hold at least one webinar during the consultation period.
 - The Applicants would deposit hard copies of the consultation materials and documents relating to the proposed changes at venues within the vicinity of the Site subject to the agreement of the organisations responsible for those venues.
 - The consultation would be publicised through notices in the national and local press, including the Telegraph, London Gazette, Lloyds List and Fishing News and at least one newspaper circulating within the vicinity of the Site. The notices would be published for one week.
 - Posters would be placed in public venues to further publicise the consultation and site notices would be placed around the Site.
 - The newspaper notices, posters and site notices would provide information on the consultation events, webinar and document inspection locations.



- The consultation would be publicised through the Project Website and social media platforms. All of the consultation materials would be available on the Project Website.
- People would be able to submit comments and feedback by Freepost and a dedicated project email address. A phone number would also be provided for people to contact the project team and request hard copies of the consultation materials and other documents.
- The Applicants would provide a period of at least 30 days from the start of the consultation for the submission of comments and feedback.
- 4.2.2 The Notification Document indicated that the consultation would begin during the week commencing 8 March 2022 and finish on 14 April 2022.
- 4.2.3 The Applicants' non-statutory consultation complied with or achieved all of the above, as set out in Sections 5 and 6 below.
- 4.2.4 The Notification Document stated that a Consultation Statement would be submitted with the formal change request, confirming who had been consulted in relation to the proposed changes and how they were consulted in accordance with Advice Note 16. The Consultation Statement would also set out the Applicants had taken account of any responses received to the consultation.

4.3 Examining Authority's Response to Proposed Consultation

4.3.1 The Examining Authority (ExA) provided a response to the Applicants' formal notification of their intention to formally request a change to the DCO Application on 24 February 2022 [PD-008]. In respect of the Applicants' proposed consultation the ExA's response is set out below:

"The ExA is aware of your stated intention to carry out non-statutory consultation on all proposed changes with all those consulted pursuant to Section 56 of the Planning Act 2008. As identified, this should include any changes to the Section 56 notification list since August 2021. You should give a minimum of 28 days for responses to your consultation, and newspaper and site notices should be posted. The ExA has no other comments to make on the indicative programme set out within section 6 of the Notification of Proposed Changes document.

When submitting the change request, it is recommended that you submit a statement encompassing a non-statutory consultation report setting out the detail and methodology of the undertaken consultation.

The scope of consultation activities set out in section 4.2 of the Notification of Proposed Changes document provides an appropriate basis for the non-statutory consultation. Please ensure that consultation responses are sent to you as the Applicant and not to the Planning Inspectorate."



5.0 CONSULTATION OF PRESCRIBED AND NON-PRESCRIBED PERSONS

5.1 Introduction

- 5.1.1 This involved consulting prescribed persons, including local authorities, statutory undertakers and persons with an interest in the land affected by the Project (those persons defined by Sections 42, 43 and 44 of the PA 2008), as well as certain other non-prescribed persons, on the proposed changes. Non-prescribed persons, included those persons who, although there was no duty to consult under the PA 2008, had previously been identified as being potentially interested in the Project or who had responded to previous consultations on the Project.
- 5.1.2 The consultation of these persons took place from 10 March 2022 and to 14 April 2022.

5.2 Who was consulted?

- 5.2.1 Prescribed persons, including relevant local authorities, statutory undertakers and persons with an interest in land affected by the Project (those persons defined by Sections 42, 43 and 44 of the PA 2008), and certain other non-prescribed persons, were consulted on the proposed changes.
- 5.2.2 The persons consulted were largely the same as those notified of the acceptance of the DCO Application pursuant to Section 56 of the PA 2008, subject to any changes to the Section 56 notification list since August 2021, following a review of that list by the Applicants' project team. The review of the list resulted in two persons being added, while a small number of persons were identified as no longer being affected by the Project as a result of the changes. Those persons were however still consulted on the proposed changes.
- 5.2.3 In total, 441 prescribed and non-prescribed persons were consulted on the proposed changes.

5.3 How were they consulted?

5.3.1 The prescribed (and non-prescribed) persons were consulted using the following methods.

<u>Consultation Letter & Consultation Documents</u>

- 5.3.2 The prescribed (and non-prescribed) persons were sent a Consultation Letter. The Consultation Letter was issued via Royal Mail First Class post on 14 March 2022. The Consultation Letter was also sent electronically by email on 14 March 2022 where email addresses had previously been provided or could be obtained. Of the 441 letters issued, 139 were also sent electronically.
- 5.3.3 A different Consultation Letter was sent to those persons who had been identified as no longer being affected by the Project as a result of the proposed changes (i.e. their land interests were no longer within the Order Limits).
- 5.3.4 The Consultation Letters set out the rationale for the proposed changes and also provided a description of the changes.
- 5.3.5 The Consultation Letters contained a secure 'fileshare' link, which allowed the following documents (the 'Consultation Documents') to be downloaded:
 - An Application Site Boundary Plan showing the changes to the Order Limits.
 - A Consultation Document setting out the rationale for the proposed changes, providing
 a description of the changes and information on how the environmental impact



- assessment (EIA) of the Project is likely to change. The Consultation Document also included detailed plans showing the proposed changes.
- The notice to be placed in national and local newspapers and other publications to publicise the consultation on the proposed changes.
- 5.3.6 The Consultation Letters also provided information on how the Consultation Documents could be accessed on the Project Website and how a hard copy or USB of the Consultation Documents could be obtained.
- 5.3.7 A List of those consulted can be found at **Appendix 5.1**. Copies of the two different Consultation Letters can be found at **Appendix 5.2**. Copies of the Application Site Boundary Plan, Consultation Document and notice can be found at **Appendix 5.3**.

Newspaper & Site Notices

- 5.3.8 A notice was published in national and local newspapers and other publications as follows:
 - The Daily Telegraph 10 March 2022.
 - London Gazette 10 March 2022.

- 5.3.9 The notice was broadly modelled on the Section 56 notice that was published in late October and early November 2022 to publicise the acceptance of the DCO Application. The notice provided a summary of the proposed changes and information on the consultation, including how to view and obtain copies of the Consultation Documents; the locations and dates for public information events; the locations where hard copy documents could be inspected; how to respond to the consultation and the deadline by which to do so. Copies of the published newspaper notices can be found at **Appendix 5.4**.
- 5.3.10 A site notice, including a plan showing the proposed changes to the Order Limits, was also erected at a number of locations around the Application Site Boundary, including within the vicinity of any unregistered parcels of land. The site notice was modelled on the newspaper notice. The site notices were inspected on a weekly basis on during the consultation period. A copy of the site notice and a plan showing the location of the notices can be found at **Appendix 5.5**.

Meetings with Interested Parties

- 5.3.11 Following the submission of the Notification Document to PINS in February 2022, the Applicants sought to meet with a number of Interested Parties with landholdings within or adjoining the Application Site (the 'Order Limits'). The meetings were used as an opportunity to provide an update on the Project and brief each party on the proposed changes to the DCO Application. These meetings will be documented in the Statements of Common Ground that are being prepared in conjunction with various Interested Parties.

6.0 CONSULTATION OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

6.1 Introduction

- 6.1.1 This involved consulting the local community within the vicinity of the Application Site.
- 6.1.2 The consultation took place from 10 March 2022 and to 14 April 2022.

6.2 Who was consulted?

- 6.2.1 The local community within the vicinity of the Application Site was consulted on the proposed changes.
- 6.2.2 A number of methods were used to ensure that the local community were aware of the consultation, including newspaper and site notices; social media; the Project Website; and public information events, amongst other methods.
- 6.2.3 The methods used, notably the newspaper notices, ensured that the consultation was publicised across the Consultation Area (as detailed at Section 4 of the Consultation Report Document Ref. 5.1) that was used for the Stage 2 Consultation (July to September 2020) and subsequent update and additional consultation on the Project.

6.3 How were they consulted?

6.3.1 As stated above, the local community was consulted using a number of methods. These are described below.

Social Media

- 6.3.2 The consultation was publicised via social media as follows:
 - LinkedIn posts on 23 and 30 March 2022.
- 6.3.3 Twitter posts on 23, 29 and 30 March 2022. The posts provided information on the consultation, including the public information events and webinar (see below for further details).
- 6.3.4 Screenshots of the social media posts can be found at **Appendix 6.1**.

Project Website

- 6.3.5 The Project Website was updated in advance of the start of the consultation on the proposed changes. The following Consultation Documents were uploaded to the Website for people to download:
 - An example Consultation Letter.
 - An Application Site Boundary Plan showing the changes to the Order Limits.
 - Proposed Changes Overview Plan showing the location of the changes (Changes 1 to 13).
 - A Consultation Document setting out the rationale for the proposed changes, providing
 a description of the changes and information on how the environmental impact
 assessment (EIA) of the Project is likely to change. The Consultation Document also
 included detailed plans showing the proposed changes.
 - The notice to be placed in national and local newspapers and other publications to publicise the consultation on the proposed changes.



- 6.3.6 The Project Website provided information on the consultation, including how to view and obtain copies of the Consultation Documents; the locations and dates for public information events; the locations where hard copy documents could be inspected; details of a webinar to be held and how to respond to the consultation and the deadline by which to do so. The Website also included a link to an online SmartSurvey comments form that could be completed.
- 6.3.7 Screenshots of the consultation section of the Project Website can be found at **Appendix 6.2**.

Newspaper & Site Notices

- 6.3.8 As confirmed in Section 5, a notice was published in national and local newspapers and other publications as follows:

- 6.3.9 The notice provided a summary of the proposed changes and information on the consultation, including how to view and obtain copies of the Consultation Documents; the locations and dates for public information events; the location where hard copy documents could be inspected; how to respond to the consultation and the deadline by which to do so (see Appendix 5.4 for copies of the published newspaper notices).
- 6.3.10 A site notice, including a plan showing the proposed changes to the Order Limits, was also erected at a number of locations around the Application Site Boundary, including within the vicinity of any unregistered parcels of land (see Appendix 5.5 for a copy of the site notice and plan showing the location of the notices).

Public Notice

- 6.3.11 A notice was also displayed at the following public venues at the start of the consultation:
 - Redcar Library, Redcar & Cleveland House, Kirkleatham Street, Redcar, TS10 1RT
 - Stockton Central Library, Church Road, Stockton on Tees, TS18 1TU
- 6.3.12 The notice provided information on the consultation, including how to view and obtain copies of the Consultation Documents; the locations and dates for public information events; how to respond to the consultation and the deadline by which to do so. A copy of the notice can be found at **Appendix 6.3**.

Public Information Events

- 6.3.13 The Applicants held two public information events during the consultation period as follows:

- 25k Community Centre, Ayton Drive, Roseberry Square, Redcar, TS10 4LR 24 March 2022, 11am to 4pm
- 6.3.14 The public information events were intended to provide an opportunity for members of the local community to find out more about the proposed changes and to speak to members of the Project Team.
- 6.3.15 A number of Information Banners were displayed at the events providing information on the proposed changes and also how to respond to the consultation. Hard copies of the Consultation Documents were also available to inspect and hard copies of the comments form was available for people to complete at the event or take away to complete later and return by Freepost. A copy of the Information Banners can be found at **Appendix 6.4**.
- 6.3.16 One person attended the event at Lazenby; there were no attendees at the Redcar event.

Webinar

- 6.3.17 In addition to the public information events, the Applicants held a webinar on the proposed changes on 30 March 2022 at 11am to 12pm. The webinar could be joined via Microsoft Teams or phone, with the link and dial in details being published on the Project Website in advance.
- 6.3.18 The notices referred to the webinar and advised people to check the Website for the details of how to join.
- 6.3.19 Members of the Project Team provided a presentation at the webinar. A copy of the presentation can be found at **Appendix 6.5**.
- 6.3.20 The webinar was attended by three people. Questions were asked of the Project Team on the following topics:
 - The size and massing of the Power Capture and Compression (PCC) Site buildings and structures.
 - Construction and operation of the of CO₂ Gathering Network pipeline in the Sembcorp No. 2 Tunnel.
 - Risks associated with the compression and transport of CO₂.
 - What consideration has been given to future CO₂ storage options once the Endurance saline aguifer is full.

Document Inspection Locations

- 6.3.21 In addition to the public information events, the Applicants deposited hard copies of the Consultation Documents at the following public venues at the start of the consultation:

- 6.4.3 A copy of the comments form can be found at **Appendix 6.6**.

6.5 Responses to the Consultation

- 6.5.1 As confirmed above, after being publicised across the Consultation Area using a number of methods, one person attended the public information event at Lazenby on 23 March 2022; there were no attendees at the Redcar event on 24 March 2022.
- 6.5.2 Three people attend the webinar held on 30 March 2022.
- 6.5.3 No online comments forms were completed and no hard copy comments forms were received via Freepost.
- 6.5.4 Website analytics shows that Project Website traffic increased by 68% over the consultation period, with 76% of users visiting the consultation pages.

I write on behalf of the Applicants, Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage Limited, in respect of the Net Zero Teesside Project (the 'NZT Project').

The NZT Development Consent Order Application (the 'Application') was submitted by the Applicants to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), acting on behalf of the Secretary of State, on 19 July 2021. The Application was accepted for examination on 16 August 2021. The Application (Application Reference: EN010103) is currently in the pre-examination period prior to being examined by a panel of Examining Inspectors appointed by PINS (the 'Examining Authority').

Further details of the NZT Project are provided in the Application. The Application, which comprises an Application Form, draft Development Consent Order (DCO), Land Plans, Works Plans, other plans, drawings and maps, the Environmental Statement and its Non-Technical Summary, a Consultation Report and other documents, is available for inspection free of charge at the Documents tab on the PINS website via the following link:

Since submission of the Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also continuing with detailed project development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality included in the Application around certain elements of the NZT Project. This work has identified a number of changes that the Applicants are now seeking to make to the NZT Project. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). In addition, there are other minor changes or updates to the NZT Project.





The changes to the Application would reduce optionality, land take and complexity, and respond to matters raised in the Relevant Representations or in discussions directly with Interested Parties. Their overall effect would therefore be positive in reducing the potential effects of the NZT Project on Interested Parties and affected persons, reducing the number of issues to be considered in the Examination once it commences and simplifying both the Examination and decision-making processes.

In advance of seeking the approval of the Examining Authority to change the Application, the Applicants are carrying out non-statutory consultation on the proposed changes. We are writing to you in connection with this consultation as you were either notified of the acceptance of the Application pursuant to Section 56 of the PA 2008 in October 2021 or have subsequently been identified as a person who has an interest in land that is required for the NZT Project and included within the Application.

Since submission of the Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also continuing with detailed project development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality included in the Application around certain elements of the NZT Project. This work has identified a number of changes that the Applicants are now seeking to make to the NZT Project. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Overview

- 1.1.1 On 19 July 2021, Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage (the 'Applicants') made an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) under the Planning Act 2008 to the Planning Inspectorate (who considers such applications on behalf of the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy) (the 'DCO Application'). The DCO Application was accepted for examination on 16 August 2021.
- 1.1.2 The Applicants are seeking development consent for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Net Zero Teesside Project (NZT), including associated development (together the 'Proposed Development') on land at and in the vicinity of the former Redcar Steel Works site, Redcar and in Stockton-on-Tees, on Teesside (the 'Site'). The former Steel Works site, along with other land required for the Proposed Development, lies within the boundary of South Tees Development Corporation's (STDC) administrative area, and its main development site is now known as 'Teesworks'.
- 1.1.3 The Application is available on the Planning Inspectorate's website at:
- 1.1.4 Prior to the DCO Application being submitted to the Planning Inspectorate, the Applicants undertook multiple stages of preapplication consultation. The Applicants are grateful for the extensive feedback that has already been received from the local community, others with an interest in the Proposed Development and statutory consultees, including the local authorities. The feedback from these consultations was taken into account throughout the development of the proposals for the Proposed Development and in the finalisation of the DCO Application.
- 1.1.5 Due to the nature and scale of the Proposed Development, the extent of land interests within the proposed Order Limits and the potential to reuse existing infrastructure to reduce its construction effects, the DCO Application submitted in July 2021 necessarily included a degree of optionality. The Applicants have previously explained to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) the need to retain a degree of optionality within the DCO Application, but have also been clear that their aim would be to reduce that optionality, if possible, in advance of the Examination as the design of the Proposed Development is progressed. All the options included in the DCO Application were consulted upon and assessed as part of the environmental impact assessment (EIA) for the Proposed Development.



- 1.1.6 Since submission of the DCO Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also continuing with detailed design development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality around certain elements of the Proposed Development, notably the connections corridors. This work has identified a number of changes to the Proposed Development. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the DCO Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Proposed Development) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). In addition, there are other minor changes or updates to the Proposed Development.
- 1.1.7 The proposed changes would deliver refinements to the Proposed Development which in many cases reduce its impacts. However, before making a written change request to PINS, the Applicants are consulting the public, landowners and other stakeholders so that their views can be taken into account on the proposed changes. As part of making the change request, the Applicants will also submit a consultation report showing how they have had regard to the responses received to the consultation. It will then be for the Examining Authority (ExA) to decide if the changes can be made to the DCO Application before it is examined.
- 1.1.8 There are three main proposed changes to the Proposed Development when compared with that presented in the DCO Application submitted in July 2021:
 - the natural gas connection route (the 'Gas Connection') for Work No.
 2A has been selected;
 - the CO₂ Gathering Network route from the north of the River Tees and across the River Tees to the Power Capture and Compression (PCC) site (forming part of Work No. 6) has been reduced in land area; and
 - updates have been made to the land within the Proposed Development Order Limits arising from ongoing design work, construction assessments and landowner discussions.
- 1.1.9 From these three main changes, thirteen specific changes flow. These are described individually in Section 2.

Structure of this consultation document

- 1.1.10 This consultation document is structured as follows:
 - Section 2 of this consultation document gives an overview of the proposed changes described in terms of the Work Nos. as presented in the draft DCO;
 - Section 3 of this consultation document describes the potential for the proposed changes to alter the assessment of environmental effects as currently considered in the DCO Application; and

2.0 PROPOSED CHANGES

Overview

- 2.1.1 The Applicants are proposing thirteen changes in total, which are summarised in **Table 2.1** below. These changes affect the following Work Nos. in the DCO Application:
 - Work No. 2 (Gas Connection);
 - Work No. 3A (Electrical Connection New NZT sub-station);
 - Work No. 5A (Water discharge connection existing outfall) and Work No. 5C (pipeline to Bran Sands Wastewater Treatment Plant (WwTP);
 - Work No. 6 (CO₂ Gathering Network);
 - Work Nos. 9A, 9B, 9D, 9F (Laydown Areas); and
 - Work No. 10 (Access and Highway Improvements).
- 2.1.2 There are no changes to the following Work Nos. in the DCO Application:
 - Work No. 1 (Low Carbon Electricity Generating Station);
 - Work No. 3B (extension to Tod Point sub-station);
 - Work No. 4 (Water supply connection);
 - Work No. 5B (replacement outfall);
 - Work No. 7 (HP Compressor Station);
 - Work No. 8 (CO₂ Export Pipeline); and
 - Work Nos. 9C and 9E (Laydown Areas).
- 2.1.3 The changes to the Proposed Development to reduce optionality in respect of the Gas Connection and CO₂ Gathering Network are set out below. Full details of the options originally presented in the DCO Application submitted in July 2021 are set out in the Explanatory Memorandum (October 2021) (Document Ref. 2.2).

Gas Connection


- 2.1.4 As part of the DCO Application, three options for the Gas Connection (Work No. 2A) were included:
 - Option 1A (National Gas Grid (NGG) tie-in and new underground pipeline): natural gas will be supplied via a tie-in to the gas transmission network on the north bank of the Tees at Seal Sands with subsequent transport through a new 24" buried gas line. The new pipeline would cross the Tees within a newly constructed tunnel.
 - Option 1B (Trafigura tie-in and new underground pipeline): the outlet from a new NZT Above Ground Installation (AGI) could be routed into the existing, disused 24" Trafigura pipeline which runs between the



Teesside Gas Processing Plant (TGPP) on Seal Sands to the Navigator Terminal. At this location a tie-in will be constructed which then connects into the new 24" gas line and into the new tunnel and on to PCC Site.

- Option 2 (Sembcorp Pipeline Tie-In): the outlet from a new NZT AGI would be fed into the existing, disused 24" Sembcorp gas line which runs through North Tees. The existing Sembcorp pipeline crosses the River Tees and lands on the north bank of Dabholm Gut and runs on to the Wilton site on South Tees. At a point near the Bran Sands Wastewater Treatment Plan (WwTP), a new tie-in would be constructed which then connects via a new AGI into a new gas pipeline which would run to the PCC Site via a wayleave to the east of the Bran Sands WwTP.
- 2.1.5 During the period from May 2021 to February 2022, a combination of further engineering studies, on-site assessments and landowner and asset owner engagement has enabled the optionality for Work No. 2A to be refined, with the results of these refinements shown in Figure 2-1 below. The Applicants propose to select Option 2 (Sembcorp Pipeline Tie-In). The route of the tie-in pipeline and associated AGI are shown in Figure 2-1.

- 2.1.6 The 'New Build Options' comprising Work No. 2A Option 1A (NGG tie-in and new underground pipeline) and Work No. 2A Option 1B (Trafigura tie-in and new underground pipeline) for the Gas Connection are proposed to be removed from the Order Limits.
- 2.1.7 The optionality with respect to the Gas Connection will therefore be removed from the Proposed Development by the proposed changes. The removal of Work No. 2A Option 1A and Option 1B has the consequential beneficial impact of reducing the land requirements for the Proposed Development at the following locations:
 - next to Seal Sands Road (North Tees);
 - on the Navigator Terminals land (North Tees); and
 - on the south bank of the River Tees, in between the Tees and the PCC Site.

CO2 Gathering Network

- 2.1.8 As part of the DCO Application, two options were included for part of the CO₂ Gathering Network (Work No. 6):
 - Work No. 6 Option 1 (Bored Long Tunnel Direct to PCC): a connection via a bored tunnel from Seal Sands directly to the PCC Site (and shared with the Gas Connection if Option 1A or Option 1B were selected for the Gas Connection) and then below ground along the southern side of the proposed Teesworks Spine Road to the PCC Site.
 - Work No. 6 Option 2 (HDD and connection via Dabholm Gut): a connection installed using a horizontal directional drilled (HDD) bore from Seal Sands to the northern bank of the mouth of Dabholm Gut and then above ground along the northern bank of Dabholm Gut past Bran Sands WwTP and then north to the PCC Site.
- 2.1.9 As a result of the selection of Work No. 6 Option 2 (Sembcorp Pipeline Tie-in) for the Gas Connection, Option 1 (Bored Long Tunnel Direct to the PCC Site) has been de-selected. Building a new tunnel for the CO₂ pipeline on its own does not merit the construction risks and associated environmental effects.
- 2.1.10 The proposed changes therefore comprise two revised options for the CO₂ Gathering Network's crossing of the Tees (see **Figure 2-2**) below:
 - Work No. 6 Option 2 (HDD and connection via Dabholm Gut): the
 option of an HDD bore will remain within the DCO Application.
 However, a changed trajectory for the HDD bore used to allow the
 pipeline to cross the Tees now necessitates changing the direction
 that the HDD will be drilled and the pipeline pulled from; and
 - Work No. 6 Option 3 (Sembcorp No 2 Tunnel): this is a new option that makes use of existing infrastructure in an existing Tunnel across



the River Tees that is located within the existing corridor for the CO_2 Gathering Network (the 'Sembcorp No 2 Tunnel').

Changed HDD Trajectory (Option 2)

2.1.11 Further detailed engineering assessments have been carried out for the HDD across the River Tees. These have taken into account landowner, design and operational constraints in the area, current and future plans, plus existing asset infrastructure. The engineering study work has demonstrated to the Applicants that the HDD routing trajectory needs to be changed and that as a result of the trajectory change the launch site for the HDD now needs to be on the south side of the River Tees on land to the north of Dabholm Gut (previously it was on Navigator Terminals land to the north of the Tees). The exit point is now expected to be north of Navigator Terminals land (on land still within the Order Limits).

Introduction of Option 3 (Sembcorp No 2 Tunnel)

- 2.1.12 As a result of a combination of detailed engineering and constructability studies, on-site construction review and detailed discussions with the asset owner (Sembcorp), inclusion of this new option is now being proposed.
- 2.1.13 There are two reasons for including this further option, namely;
 - Sembcorp and the Applicants consider that there is sufficient space inside the tunnel for the construction and operation of the CO₂ pipeline and that the construction risks are manageable.
 - Use of the Sembcorp No. 2 Tunnel also presents a more sustainable solution that utilises existing infrastructure, and will therefore cause less disruption in the area compared to an HDD. The introduction of this option is proposed via the changes set out below and it is currently the Applicants' preferred option. Subject to final engineering assessments, which are anticipated to be completed by June 2022, and considering responses to the consultation, it is anticipated that this option will be preferred instead of Option 2 (the HDD).

Other Refinement of the Order Limits

- 2.1.14 As part of the landowner engagement process there has been feedback provided to the Applicant on the wide width of corridors being proposed in the Order Limits. These concerns have been considered by the Applicants and where possible land is proposed to be removed from the Order Limits or redesignated from 'permanent rights' to 'temporary possession'.
- 2.1.15 The Applicants have carried out a series of Land Plans reviews with the new information gathered within the period June 2021 until January 2022, combined with further constructability information (from detailed engineering studies, site visits and land-owner meetings) and as a result have reduced either the land requirements or land rights sought in:
 - the CO₂ Gathering Network corridor around Billingham and Seal Sands;



- the CO₂ Gathering Network corridor to the south-east of the NWL Brans Sands WwTW facility;
- the Electrical Connection near Tod Point substation; and
- on the Teesworks site (existing outfall and other permanent and temporary land areas, including access routes and the power cable export route).
- 2.1.16 In addition to reducing the land requirements or extent of rights sought over land, the Applicants have also identified the need for a minor increase in the size of the proposed temporary construction and laydown area located off Seaton-Carew Road in the Seal Sands area.
- 2.1.17 These proposed changes are explained in the text that follows in terms of the effect on Work Nos. as defined in the DCO Application and as shown on the Works Plans (Document Ref.4.4). Where changes relate to a specific part of the Order Limits, these are shown on the plans at Appendix A. Potential changes to the environmental assessments included in the Environmental Statement, which accompanied the DCO Application (Document Ref. 6.2) are set out in Section 3 of this document.

Summary of the Proposed Changes

2.1.18 A summary of the proposed changes is provided in **Table 2-1** below:

3.0 POTENTIAL CHANGES TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS

Overview

- 3.1.1 The findings of the environmental assessments reported in the DCO Application will not substantially alter as a result of the changes to the Proposed Development summarised in Table 2-1 above. However, for certain topics, reassessment work is required to confirm that there will be no new or materially different effects in respect of that topic. Such confirmation will be provided when the Applicants submit the formal change request (please see Section 4 for information on the timescales for this).
- 3.1.2 For each proposed change to the Proposed Development, this section of the document provides information on how the environmental assessment is likely to alter as a result of the proposed changes and which topics are likely to be affected. This section also provides a preliminary assessment of whether each change is likely to be beneficial, neutral or adverse (compared to the current assessment in the Environmental Statement), and summarises the scope of any further assessment considered necessary. Where this further topic assessment identifies a change, the cumulative effects will also be considered.
- 3.1.3 The text below (from paragraph 3.1.7 onwards) describes each change and the main associated changes to the environmental assessment.

 Tables 3-1 to 3-13 provide a summary of the stages of the development which are affected by each Change and the nature of the effects of each Change to the Proposed Development.
- 3.1.4 Table 3-14 identifies the sections of the Environmental Statement (Document Ref. 6.2) and associated figures (Document Ref. 6.3) and appendices (Document Ref. 6.4) which will be updated to take account of the changes which are taken forward. Where an update to documents is considered to be required, a tick (✓) has been added and where no update is required, a dash (-) has been included. Updates to documentation are required to make the documents consistent with the Proposed Development (including the changes) or to update figures which are to be viewed in tandem with the chapters. In some instances, updates may be required because the proposed changes could result in an update to the assessment of effects.
- 3.1.5 The updated ES documents will be submitted when the Applicants submit the formal change request (Step 4).
- 3.1.6 A number of other DCO documents also require updating as a result of the proposed changes. This includes the Draft DCO (Document Ref. 2.1), Explanatory Memorandum (Document Ref. 2.2), Book of Reference (Document Ref. 3.1), Statement of Reasons (Document Ref. 3.2), Habitats



Regulations Assessment Report (HRA) (Document Ref. 5.13), and Electrical and Gas Connection Statements (Document Refs. 5.5 and 5.6). The Land Plans (Document Ref. 4.2), Crown Land Plans (Document Ref. 4.3), Works Plans (Document Ref. 4.4), Access and Rights of Way Plans (Document Ref. 4.5), PCC Facility Plans (Document Ref. 4.6), Gas Connection and AGI Plans (Document Ref. 4.7), Electrical Connection Plans (Document Ref. 4.8) and Water Connection Plan (Document Ref. 4.9) will also need to be updated. The updated versions of these DCO documents (in both clean and track change versions) will be submitted when the Applicants submit the formal change request (Step 4).

Change 1: Removal of Optionality for Work No. 2A Underground High-Pressure Gas Pipeline

- 3.1.7 This change will remove the need for a bored tunnel and the excavation of associated shafts at Navigator Terminals and Teesworks following the agreement for the supply of gas to the PCC Site from the existing Sembcorp pipeline at Bran Sands.
- 3.1.8 This change removes the requirement for construction of a pipeline through Seal Sands to connect with the NGG AGI at CATS. This also removes the requirement for excavation for gas pipeline construction along the northern side of Seal Sands Road and along the northern edge of Navigator Terminals.
- 3.1.9 Together, removing these options will reduce the volume of spoil requiring stockpiling at Navigator Terminals and transporting for re-use or off-site disposal. This will reduce associated Heavy Goods Vehicle (HGV) movements and the potential for associated dust generation. Removal of the new tunnel options will reduce noise impacts associated with shaft excavation and the use of generators required to power the micro-boring machinery. Whilst residential receptors are too distant from the tunnelling operations to be affected by noise, reducing noise generation will reduce potential impacts on wildlife (principally birds in the Teesside and Cleveland Coast SPA and Ramsar site).
- 3.1.10 The change is likely to be beneficial with a reduction in effects (i.e. less adverse), compared to those considered in the ES, during the construction phase. The change will not cause any change in the previously assessed effects during operation or decommissioning.
- 3.1.11 The environmental effects of the changes are summarised as:
 - reduced excavation of natural and potentially contaminated materials;
 - reduced dust generation;
 - reduced requirement for mobile generators;
 - reduced noise generation and potential impacts on Teesmouth and Cleveland Coast SPA/Ramsar/SSSI:



- reduced HGV and worker transport movements; and
- increased distance to receptors due to reduction in the Order Limits
- 3.1.12 **Table 3-1** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 1.

Change 2: Reduction in Optionality for Work No. 2B Above Ground Installations

- 3.1.13 The gas connection options all require construction of a new AGI adjacent to the National Gas Grid AGI at the CATS terminal. However, the deselection of Option 1B (Trafigura connection) for the Gas Connection removes the requirement to construct an additional AGI at Navigator Terminals to allow connection to the existing Trafigura pipeline.
- 3.1.14 Removal of this AGI reduces the need for the excavation of spoil, reduces associated HGV movements and spoil removal, reduces noise generation associated with construction, and reduces dust generation with similar effects to Change 1. The effect of removing this option is likely therefore to be beneficial during the construction phase.
- 3.1.15 The change is likely to result in a beneficial change during the construction phase, however, will not have any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.16 The environmental effects of the changes can be summarised as:
 - reduced excavation of natural and potentially contaminated materials;
 - reduced dust generation;
 - reduced noise generation and potential impacts on SPA/Ramsar/SSSI;
 - reduced HGV and worker transport movements; and
 - increased distance to receptors due to a reduction in the Order Limits.
- 3.1.17 **Table 3-2** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 2.

Change 3: Reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 3A Electrical Connection

- 3.1.18 This change removes land from Work No. 3A at Tod Point which is not required for construction. This will increase the distance to noise sensitive receptors from sub-station construction (as construction effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application). The effect of removing this option will therefore be beneficial during the construction phase.
- 3.1.19 The environmental effects of the changes will alter as a result of the increased distance to receptors through reduction in the Order Limits at Tod Point.
- 3.1.20 The change is likely to result a beneficial change during the construction phase, however, will not have any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.



3.1.21 **Table 3-3** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 3.

Change 4: Reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 5A Wastewater Disposal Works – Existing Outfall

- 3.1.22 This option is for the re-use and potential refurbishment of an existing outfall. As a result of confirming the location of the outfall it has been possible to reduce the size of the Order Limits in this area. As effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application, this change will increase the distance to noise sensitive receptors from any refurbishment operations. The effect of removing this option is likely therefore to be beneficial during the construction phase.
- 3.1.23 The change will not result in changes to the ES because the re-use of this existing infrastructure has already been assessed. The change is likely to result in a small beneficial change during the construction phase, however, will not have any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.24 **Table 3-4** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 4.

Change 5: Reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 5C Wastewater Disposal Works – Pipeline Connections to Bran Sands

- 3.1.25 This change will increase the distance to noise sensitive receptors from construction operations associated with the wastewater pipeline connection to Bran Sands WwTP (as construction effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application).
- 3.1.26 The environmental effects of the changes will alter as a result of the increased distance receptors through reduction in the Order Limits at Bran Sands and Teesworks. The change is therefore likely to result in a small beneficial change during the construction phase, however, will not have any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.27 **Table 3-5** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 5.

Change 6: Change in Optionality for Work No. 6 CO2 Gathering Network

- 3.1.28 The change in environmental effects associated with the removal of the need to construct a long bored tunnel from Navigator Terminals direct to the PCC Site for use by the CO₂ Gathering Network, is the same as Change 1 above.
- 3.1.29 Narrowing the Order Limits for the CO₂ Gathering Network to the northeast of Bran Sands, at Teesworks and at Seal Sands and Haverton Hill will increase the distance to noise sensitive receptors from any construction operations (as construction effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application).
- 3.1.30 The change is likely to result in a beneficial change during the construction phase, however, will not have an any change in the



previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.

- 3.1.31 The environmental effects of the changes are summarised as:
 - reduced excavation of natural and potentially contaminated materials;
 - reduced dust generation;
 - reduced requirement for mobile generators;
 - reduced noise generation and potential impacts on SPA/Ramsar/SSSI;
 - reduced HGV and worker transport movements; and
 - increased distance to receptors through reduction in the Order Limits.
- 3.1.32 **Table 3-6** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 6.

Change 7: Change in the Means of Crossing the Tees Work No. 6 CO2 Gathering Network – Use of Existing Infrastructure

3.1.33 The introduction of a new option for the crossing of the Tees by use of the existing Sembcorp No 2 tunnel infrastructure by the CO₂ Gathering Network provides an alternative to the long tunnel (removed in Change 6) and the HDD (altered by Change 8 below). This change, compared to the options considered in the EIA, would remove the need for stockpiling and disposal and disposal of excavated spoil associated with tunnelling/boring. This would reduce HGV movements and the potential



for associated dust generation. Use of the existing tunnel infrastructure would also reduce noise impacts associated with boring / drilling. Whilst this change would mean that the Tees crossing would be constructed underground within the Sembcorp No. 2 tunnel, there would still be potential noise impacts associated with onshore pipe handling and stringing. These would be similar to those previously assessed as required for the construction of the above ground portions of the CO₂ Gathering Network at Navigator Terminals and along the Dabholm Gut. The effect of this change would therefore be neutral during the construction phase in relation to those topic chapters.

- 3.1.34 The use of the existing tunnel infrastructure is likely therefore to be beneficial overall, as it removes the requirement for an HDD crossing of the Tees but will need to be assessed in the construction, operation and decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.35 **Table 3-7** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 7.

Change 8: Change in the Means of Crossing the Tees - Work No. 6 CO2 Gathering Network - Change in the Trajectory and Direction of Drilling of HDD Bore

- This change affects Option 2 for the CO₂ Gathering Network crossing 3.1.36 the Tees using an HDD bore. Changing the trajectory of the HDD bore itself has no impact on the Order Limits. However, the change in trajectory requires a reversal of the direction of drilling of the HDD bore so that it commences from a launch point on land between Dabholm Gut and Bran Sands Lagoon and emerges at Navigator Terminals, rather than vice versa as currently assessed. This change will mean that the HDD drilling equipment will be located adjacent to the Bran Sands Lagoon. Whilst the Order Limits are not changing in this area, the operations adjacent to the Lagoon will change. The Lagoon is included within the Teesside and Cleveland Coast SSSI, SPA and Ramsar site for its use by birds. It will therefore be necessary to consider the environmental impacts of HDD operations in this location and whether there is the potential for them to cause noise or visual disturbance to bird species using the lagoon.
- 3.1.37 The reversal of the drilling directions means that pipe stringing operations will move from along the Dabholm Gut to North Tees along the northern edge of Seal Sands Road. This change will require the noise assessment to be reviewed and may also require measures to avoid disruption associated with the pipeline crossing over Seal Sands Road.
- 3.1.38 The change will also mean that traffic movements for HDD operations and pipe stringing will change from North Tees to South Tees (and *vice versa*). The change in the number of personnel on each side of the Tees is unlikely to be significant, however, the transportation assessment will be reviewed to test the significance of this change.
- 3.1.39 The effect of this change is anticipated to be neutral during the construction phase provided appropriate noise and visual controls are applied to protect the birds using the lagoon, and there would not be any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.40 **Table 3-8** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 8.

- 3.1.41 This change will increase the distance to noise sensitive receptors from any operations in the affected laydown areas (as construction effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application).
- 3.1.42 The environmental effects of the changes will alter as a result of the increased distance receptors through reduction in the Order Limits at laydown areas. The change is therefore likely to result in a beneficial change during



- the construction phase, however, will not have any change in the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.43 **Table 3-9** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 9.

Change 10: Minor Increase in the Order Limits for Work No. 9 Temporary Construction and Laydown Areas

- 3.1.44 This change will slightly increase the size of the proposed laydown area off Seaton Carew Road and therefore decrease slightly the distance to noise sensitive receptors from construction activities (as construction effects were measured from the Order Limits in the DCO Application). However, due to the small size of the change the effect is likely to be negligible.
- 3.1.45 The environmental effects of the changes will alter as a result of the increased distance receptors through an increase in the Order Limits at temporary construction and laydown areas. The change is likely to be neutral during the construction phase, however, this change will not alter the previously predicted effects during the operation or decommissioning phases.
- 3.1.46 **Table 3-10** provides a summary of which stage the change will affect and the environmental effects of Change 10.

With the fit-out now complete, work is underway to prepare the new vessel for sea trials.

Designed by SC McAllister & mounted PTOs. Co Ltd, the new build replaces

The vessel's centreline machinery consists of a Mitsubishi S12R-Z3 MPTAW main engine rated at 588kW @ 1,400rpm, a Heimdal 11.43:1 reduction gearbox and a fourbladed 2,900mm-diameter VP propeller. The main hydraulic system is driven off gearbox-

On 16 August 2021, The Planning Inspectorate (PINS) on behalf of the Secretary of State, accepted an application (the 'Application') by Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage Limited (the 'Applicants') whose registered offices are both Chertsey Road, Sunbury on Thames, Middlesex, TW16 7BP for a Development Consent Order under The Planning Act 2008 for the Net Zero Teesside Project (the 'Project'). The Application (Application Reference: EN010103) is currently in the pre-examination period prior to being examined by a panel of Examining Inspectors appointed by PINS (the 'Examining Authority').

The Project will be the UK's first commercial scale, full chain Carbon Capture, Usage, and Storage (CCUS) project and will initially capture up to 4 million tonnes (Mt) of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions per annum. The main elements of the Project include a new gas-fired electricity generating station with post-combustion carbon capture plant; gas, water and electricity connections (for the generating station); a CO2 pipeline network (a 'gathering network') for collecting CO2 from a cluster of local industries on Teesside; a CO2 compressor station (for the compression of the CO2) and a CO2 export pipeline. The CO2 captured from the electricity generating station and local industries will be compressed and then transported (via the export pipeline) for secure storage within the Endurance saline aquifer located 145 kilometres offshore from Teesside under the North Sea.

The Project involves land at and in the vicinity of the former Redcar Steel Works site, Redcar and in Stockton-on-Tees, on Teesside (the 'Site'). The former Steel Works site, along with other land required for the Proposed Development, lies within the boundary of the land controlled by the South Tees Development Corporation, which is now known as Teesworks.

The Net Zero Teesside Project is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development, as defined by The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.

Further details of the Project are provided in the Application. The Application, which comprises an Application Form, draft Development Consent Order (DCO), Land Plans, Works Plans, other plans, drawings and maps, the Environmental Statement and its Non-Technical Summary, a Consultation Report and other documents, is available for inspection free of charge at the Documents tab on the PINS website via the following link:

Since submission of the Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also continuing with detailed project development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality around certain elements of the Project. This work has identified a number of changes that the Applicant is now seeking to make to the Project. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). In addition, there are other minor changes or updates to the Project. The Applicants therefore intend to request a change to the Application.

In advance of seeking approval from the Examining Authority to change the Application, the Applicants are carrying out non-statutory consultation on the proposed changes. A consultation document, which includes environmental information, has been prepared, which explains the changes that are being proposed. The proposed changes are summarised below with reference to the relevant Works Numbers (Nos.) set out at Schedule 1 of the draft DCO and shown on the Works Plans:



Identifying Russian sanctions risk is industry responsibility, says UK



UK PORTS ARE struggling to identify the Russian-controlled entities and ownership links required to uphold sanctions levelled against Russian vessels.

Some ports have resorted to basic Google searches in a bid to protect themselves against potential sanctions breaches after the UK government confirmed that responsibility for unravelling the complex matrix of Russian ownership links sits with individual ports, not the government.

Despite an initial pledge by the UK Department for Transport to "support UK ports in identifying Russian ships" that fall within the scope of the port ban announced by transport secretary Grant Shapps on March 1, updated guidance issued by the DfT has confirmed that individual ports must now conduct their own due diligence.

The ban covers all ships "owned, controlled, chartered or operated by persons connected with Russia", effectively requiring ports to be able to identify often opaque beneficial ownership links across a potential fleet of over 6,000 vessels.

"Ports are endeavouring to take all reasonable steps they can using publicly and accessible commercially available data sources," said UK Major Ports Group chief Tim Morris.

However, Lloyd's List understands that several senior UK ports executives have voiced serious concerns regarding the ability of individual port authorities with very limited resources to be able to catch all Russian connections.



NET ZERO TEESSIDE

The Project will be the UK's first commercial scale, full chain Carbon Capture, Usage, and Storage (CCUS) project and will initially capture up to 4 million tonnes (Mt) of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions per annum. The main elements of the Project include a new gas-fired electricity generating station with post-combustion carbon capture plant; gas, water and electricity connections (for the generating station); a CO₂ pipeline network (a 'gathering network') for collecting CO₂ from a cluster of local industries on Teesside; a CO₂ compressor station (for the compression of the CO₂) and a CO₂ export pipeline. The CO₂ captured from the electricity generating station and local industries will be compressed and then transported (via the export pipeline) for secure storage within the Endurance saline aquifer located 145 kilometres offshore from Teesside under the North Sea.

The Project involves land at and in the vicinity of the former Redcar Steel Works site, Redcar and in Stockton-on-Tees, on Teesside (the 'Site'). The former Steel Works site, along with other land required for the Proposed Development, lies within the boundary of the land controlled by the South Tees Development Corporation, which is now known as Teesworks.

The Net Zero Teesside Project is an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) development, as defined by The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.

Since submission of the Application, the Applicants have continued to engage with Interested Parties with a view to addressing their comments and agreeing common ground, while also

continuing with detailed project development. This has included progressing further work on the optionality around certain elements of the Project. This work has identified a number of changes that the Applicant is now seeking to make to the Project. The changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the Application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in land take (or a reduction in the powers sought over land). In addition, there are other minor changes or updates to the Project. The Applicants therefore intend to request a change to the Application.

In advance of seeking approval from the Examining Authority to change the Application, the Applicants are carrying out non-statutory consultation on the proposed changes. A consultation document, which includes environmental information, has been prepared, which explains the changes that are being proposed. 

Leah's Law campaign to be raised in Parliament

A DEVASTATED mother's campaign to outlaw the ability of under-16s to consent to taking illegal sub-stances is heading for Parliament. Leah's Law is due to be debated

in the Commons next month. Leah Heyes, from Northallerton, was 15 when she died after taking ecstasy supplied by two teenagers.

Her mother, Kerry Roberts has been campaigning for Leah's Law to increase sentences in the hope of detering dealers, and make under-16s unable to consent to taking illegal substances.

She wants to prevent any other family from suffering the night-mare hers has gone through, and started an online petition, which has collected more than 8,500 signatures. Now Thirsk MP Kevin Hollinrake has taken up the campaign and is on the list to introduce Leah's Law as a ten minute rule bill in Parliament next month.


This means he can deliver a ten-

minute speech, with the opposition getting the chance to respond before a vote to see if it should go further.

Ms Roberts said: "I was overwhelmed, it is such a positive move forward, there is still a really long way to go, but it is a really signifi-

cant first step.
"To get it raised in Parliament is an important development. For Leah's story to be told in the Commons is huge.
"I just can't bear the thought of

another parent going through what we have been through. Law and education that is what we need, to stop young people dying.

longer sentences are needed."

In a remarkable alliance, Kerry

has been working with Tammy Kirkwood, the mother of one of the teenagers, who supplied the drugs which killed Leah, to raise awareness of the dangers of drugs, particularly ecstasy, also known as MDMA. Tammy supports Leah's Law and is also calling for support from the government to help youngsters like her son Connor, who was groomed from the age of 14 through County Lines drug sup-

Mr Hollinrake said the prison sen-

tences given to the dealers who supplied Leah were not tough enough. He added: "It was a terribly tragic

case and I think Kerry's campaign is really commendable. The least I can do as a local member of Parliament is support her efforts and I think what she's campaigning for is fair and reasonable.

"I think there's greater responsibility and a greater potential impact when you sell to children and that's something that needs high-

1 Executive Summary

- 1.1 South Tees Development Corporation (STDC) maintains its in-principle support of the proposals promoted by Net Zero Teesside Power Limited and Net Zero North Sea Storage (NZT). STDC broadly supports the proposed changes to the proposed Net Zero Teesside Development Consent Order application (the Application). However, STDC would observe that due to the level of detail in the consultation materials, it remains unclear which Development Consent Order (DCO) land plots are being removed and / or where land rights being sought may be changing. Similarly, the environmental effects of the changes are unclear to STDC until sight of the updated Environmental Statement chapters. STDC reserves the right to comment on these matters further once formal application document changes have been submitted to the Examining Authority.
- 1.2 More generally, whilst the changes go some way to addressing some of the concerns raised in STDC's Relevant Representation, it should be noted (for the avoidance of doubt) that, except where specifically stated in this response, STDC's Relevant Representation remains unresolved and remains a matter for examination. Key to this is the concern that the proposals have the potential to act as an impediment to other regeneration proposals on the Teesworks site, preventing the benefits of the Freeport designation from being maximised.
- 1.3 STDC is maintaining ongoing discussions with NZT on the concerns raised in its Relevant Representation, although a number of the changes discussed between the parties have not featured in the current consultation materials.
- 1.4 Accordingly STDC's position remains that further changes to the Application (i.e. in additional to those already proposed) are required by NZT to satisfactorily address STDC's concerns regarding the impact on the regeneration of the Teesworks site. STDC requests that NZT brings forward these further changes to the Application as soon as possible, such that they can be considered by the Examining Authority and incorporated within the timescales of the DCO examination process. Despite in-principle support, STDC continues to object to aspects of the NZT proposals, as set out in STDC's Relevant Representation.

2 Responses to Proposed Changes

2.1 The following table sets out STDC's response to each change proposed by NZT.

Proposed Change Number	Description	STDC response
1	Removal of optionality for the Gas Connection by removal of both 'new build' options - Option 1A and Option 1B (i.e. removal of the long tunnel between North Tees and the Power Capture and Compression (PCC) site) resulting in a reduction in the Order Limits. There will also be a reduction in land take elsewhere following pre-Front End Engineering Design (pre-FEED) and landowner consultation for the selected Gas Connection – Option 2 (Sembcorp Pipeline Tie-In). (Work No. 2A)	STDC supports the reduction of the Order Limits and selection of the Sembcorp Pipeline option. This addresses the concerns raised in STDC's Relevant Representation (see para 4.6 to STDC's relevant representation [RR-035]). STDC notes that this change also clarifies that NZT will not have powers to construct two gas pipeline connections — a discrepancy referred to in paragraphs 6.7-6.8 to STDC's Relevant Representation. Although STDC welcomes the reduction in the amount of land required for the Application, STDC notes the absence of plot information within the consultation materials. STDC had expected to see information on which plots NZT proposed to remove from the scope of the Application, and which plots (if any) will be subject to a reduction in powers. The plans included with the consultation materials contain insufficient detail for STDC to fully understand the proposed impact on STDC land. STDC requires detailed plot information in order to understand the impact of the proposed changes. STDC understands that there will also be a reduction in land take elsewhere following FEED and landowner consultation. STDC awaits confirmation from NZT on which specific plots are subject to change in the DCO Application. STDC require further details from NZT on the waste storage implications of removing these options. STDC expects to review such information as part of the formal change request but requests early access to such information.

		STDC notes from the Planning Inspectorate's <u>Advice Note Sixteen: How to request a change which</u> <u>may be material</u> that NZT will be required to provide detailed information once they apply to make the material change request to the Planning Inspectorate. STDC expects this information to be shared in advance of any formal application.
2	Reduction in optionality for the Gas Connection has resulted in the removal of the Above Ground Installation required for Option 1B (Trafigura tie-in and new underground pipeline). This results in a reduction in the Order Limits. (Work No. 2B)	STDC notes that this change is made as a result of NZT's decision to adopt Gas Connection Option 2 (Sembcorp Tie-in) as the preferred gas connection route. STDC therefore supports the removal of this option and reduction in the optionality of the scheme.
3	Reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 3A Electrical Connection by removal of the STDC Substation at Tod Point and a reduction in land take following landowner consultation. (Work No. 3A)	STDC welcomes the reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 3A and the removal of the STDC sub-station at Tod Point. As made clear in STDC's Relevant Representation (see para 4.18.6), STDC is concerned that the proposals could cause failure to the STDC high voltage system. STDC had been expecting a greater level of detail about the changes within the consultation materials. It is unclear to STDC to what extent this reduction in the Order limits deals with STDC's concerns around plots at Tod Point (plots 540a, 540b, 540c, 393a and 393b). STDC's concerns about the impact of the NZT proposals on STDC's ability to service other major developments on the wider Teesworks site remain, and the impact on STDC's private wire network remains a key issue for STDC. Although STDC supports the reduction in compulsory acquisition powers, STDC awaits confirmation from NZT on which specific plots have been reduced in scope,

		the extent of powers sought, and the implications on the nearby parcels of land surrounding the substation.
4	Reduction in the Order Limits for Work No. 5A (repair and re-use of the existing water discharge infrastructure to the Tees Bay) – to cover the physical extent of the existing outfall and its direct routeing to the PCC site only. (Work No. 5A)	STDC will need to review the detailed DCO plans to understand the impact of this change on its land. However, as it stands, the proposals continue to present an impediment to other development proposals at the Teesworks site. STDC understands that NZT is now proposing to use the existing outfall tunnel which forms part of STDC's land. However, use of the outfall would sterilise a substantial part of the Teesworks site on which STDC is advancing other proposals of national economic importance. STDC's position is that an alternative option exists for the alignment of the outfall works which will limit the impact on the above-mentioned land. STDC therefore requests that NZT discuss this matter further with STDC to identify and bring forward a change to the Application which will avoid STDC's adjacent land being unnecessarily sterilised. STDC notes that the draft DCO proposes to transfer the benefit of Work No. 5A to STDC. STDC reserve their right to standard protections for their apparatus including through an asset protection agreement once further details are provided on this change.
5	Reduction in the order limits for Work No. 5C (new wastewater pipelines between Bran Sands Wastewater Treatment Plant and Generating Station) – connection to Bran Sands to reflect a reduction in land take following landowner consultation. (Work No. 5C)	STDC welcomes any reductions to the scope of the Order limits.

6	Change in optionality for Work No. 6 by removal of Option 1 (Bored Long Tunnel Direct to the PCC site) for the CO2 Gathering Network (see also Change 1 for the Gas Connection) resulting in reduction in the Order Limits. It also includes a reduction in other land areas of Work No. 6 following pre-FEED design and landowner consultation. (Work No. 6)	STDC supports the decision to narrow the CO2 gathering network at Teesworks. STDC believes that this resolves the ambiguity within the application documents, as discussed in paragraphs 6.4-6.10 to STDC Relevant Representation, However, the consultation materials do not make clear which STDC plots are being removed from the scope of the draft DCO and which are subject to changes in extent of powers. STDC reserves the right to make further comments once the information becomes available.
7	A change in the means of crossing the Tees within the Order Limits for Work No. 6 CO2 Gathering Network to include Option 3 (Sembcorp No 2 Tunnel). (Work No. 6)	STDC supports the use of the existing Sembcorp utility corridor and is supportive of this change. This resolves the omission in the DCO application which did not adequately consider the Sembcorp tunnel as an option (see paragraph 6.9 to STDC's Relevant Representation).
8	Change in the means of crossing the Tees in the Order Limits for Work No. 6 CO2 Gathering Network (Horizontal Direction Drilling ('HDD') crossing) as part of Option 2 (HDD) to change the direction of HDD drilling (from Dabholm Gut to North Tees, rather than vice versa) following pre-	STDC notes the change in the means of crossing the Tees. STDC welcomes any reductions to the scope of the Order limits, but will need to review the detailed draft DCO plans to see if STDC land is impacted by the change.

STDC require NZT to address STDC concerns here as reasonable alternatives exist (see paragraph 4.18.1 to STDC's relevant representation).



We carried out several stages of consultation on Net Zero Teesside (NZT) between Autumn 2019, when we introduced NZT to the local community, to January 2021, when we provided an update on changes made to the Project. After each stage we reviewed the comments received from the local community and other stakeholders and undertook further work.

In July 2021 we submitted a Development Consent Order (DCO) application for the construction and operation of the onshore elements of NZT to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), a government agency, that administers the development consent application process on behalf of the relevant Secretary of State – in the case of NZT this is the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy.

On 16 August 2021 PINS formally accepted our DCO application for examination. The Secretary of State will make the final decision on whether to grant development consent for the onshore elements of NZT.



The DCO process

NZT is defined as a 'Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project' (a 'NSIP') under Section 35 of The Planning Act 2008. Therefore, before the onshore elements of NZT can be built, we need to apply for and obtain development consent from the Secretary of State for Business. Energy and Industrial Strategy under Section 37 of the Act. Development consent for a NSIP is granted in the form of a Development Consent Order (a 'DCO').

The offshore elements of NZT will be subject to separate consent applications, which are being progressed by the Northern Endurance Partnership (NEP), of which NZT is a part. This will involve the captured carbon dioxide being transported to and stored in the Endurance carbon store – a saline aquifer – which lies approximately 145km offshore from Teesside in the southern North Sea.

Consultation is a key part of the DCO process and it is a statutory requirement of The Planning Act 2008 to consult people living within the vicinity of the development being proposed and to take their views into account in preparing an application for development consent. Our DCO application includes a Consultation Report that details what was done to consult the local community (and other stakeholders and interested parties) and how people's views were taken into account.

We are currently at the pre-examination stage of the DCO process, following the decision by PINS on 16 August 2021 to accept our DCO application for examination. The Relevant Representations that have been submitted by interested parties to PINS during the pre-examination period can be viewed at the Relevant Representations tab on the PINS website:

We expect the examination of our DCO application to start in May 2022. The examination will be run by a panel of three independent inspectors, known as the Examining Authority, who will examine the DCO application on behalf of the Secretary of State. The examination must be completed within a period of six months (likely to be around November 2022) and within three months of the end of the examination, the Examining Authority will need to produce and submit a recommendation report to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State will then have three months to decide whether to grant development consent for NZT. We expect to receive a decision from the Secretary of State in Quarter 2 2023.

Since submission of the DCO application, we have continued to engage with interested parties with a view to addressing the comments made in their relevant representation and to agree common ground, while also continuing with detailed project development. Through this work we have identified a number of changes that we consider it would be beneficial to make to the project and the application. The proposed changes relate primarily to the optionality included in the application (particularly around the connection corridors for the Project) and a reduction in the land required for the project.

Welcome

The Net Zero Teesside Project (NZT) will be the UK's first commercial scale, full chain Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage (CCUS) project, and has the potential to capture up to 10 million tonnes (Mt) of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions per year, the equivalent to the annual energy use of up to 3 million homes in the UK. NZT will therefore make a significant contribution toward the UK reaching its net zero greenhouse gas emissions target by 2050.



NZT is being promoted by Net Zero Teesside Power Limited (NZT Power) and Net Zero North Sea Storage Limited (NZNS Storage). NZNS Storage comprises bp, Equinor, National Grid, Shell and Total, with bp leading as operator. The DCO application process

We are currently at the pre-examination stage of the DCO application process, following the decision of the Planning Inspectorate on 16 August 2021 to accept our DCO Application for examination.

Following the end of this consultation, we will review the comments received and produce a Consultation Report setting out how those comments have been taken into account. We will submit the Consultation Report with our formal request to make changes to the DCO Application toward the end of April 2022. A decision will then be made on whether to accept the changes.

The examination of the DCO Application is expected to start in May 2022. The examination will be run by a panel of three independent inspectors, known as the Examining Authority, who will examine the DCO Application on behalf of the Secretary of State. The examination must be completed within a period of six months (likely to be around November 2022) and within three months of the end of the examination, the Examining Authority will need to produce and submit a recommendation report to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State will then have three months to decide whether to grant development consent for NZT. We therefore expect to receive a decision from the Secretary of State in Quarter 2 2023.



- The Net Zero Teesside Project (NZT) will be the UK's first full chain Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage (CCUS) project
- It could capture up to 10 million tonnes (Mt) of carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions per year
- NZT includes:
 - a new gas-fired power station with carbon capture technology and connections for gas, water, electricity;
 - a CO₂ pipeline network connecting to industries in the area; and
 - a compressor station and a CO₂ transport pipeline running offshore for permanent storage at a suitable offshore geological site under the North Sea.
- The Project is anticipated to become operational after 2026
- We have submitted an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) for the onshore works. Offshore works will be consented separately.






What is CCUS?



CCUS is a proven and safe process that removes CO_2 from emissions, for example from a power station or chemical manufacturing installation, and then compresses the CO_2 so that it can be safely transported to secure underground storage sites. It is then injected into layers of solid rock several kilometres underground, where the CO_2 is stored, preventing it from being released into the atmosphere.






