Procedural Deadline C Application by Sunnica Limited for an order granting development consent EN0100106

Further to your letter dated 31 August I am writing to provide you with the information requested for Procedural Deadline C.

Attendance at the preliminary meeting

Sunnica has completed the online form to confirm its attendance at the preliminary meeting on 28 September.

Accompanied site inspection (ASI)

Sunnica will attend the accompanied site inspection on 29 September and has prepared the draft itinerary as set out below and on the following pages.

In addition to preparing the below draft itinerary, Sunnica suggests the following arrangements for the ASI.

Meeting point

The ASI meeting point is at Red Lodge Sports Pavilion, Hundred Acre Way, Red Lodge, Bury Saint Edmunds IP28 8FQ at 09:00. Free parking and toilet facilities are available at the meeting point from which attendees will take transport (pre-arranged by Sunnica) to the morning ASI.

The transport will return attendees to the Red Lodge Sports Pavilion following the morning ASI and will depart from the same location for the afternoon ASI.

Attendees should make their own arrangements for travelling to and from the Red Lodge Sports Pavilion.

Greeting by the Ex A

Sunnica proposes that the Ex A welcomes and briefs attendees at the meeting point prior to departure to the inspection locations.

Lunch

A small supermarket and food outlets are located within walking distance of the Red Lodge Sports Pavilion at Bellflower Crescent.

Health and safety

Sunnica has provided a health and safety pro forma to the Planning Inspectorate separately to this draft itinerary.

While Government guidance no longer requires self-isolation in relation to testing positive for COVID-19, Sunnica requests that any attendees who feel unwell do not attend the site visit.

Sunnica will carry out a walk of the route prior to the visit and identify any potential trip hazards.

Sunnica will carry out a briefing at the start of the morning and afternoon ASIs. This will aim to ensure that visitors are aware of any potential health and safety issues.

The ASIs will involve walking through agricultural land and public rights of way. Those that are likely to find it challenging to walk significant distances on this terrain are advised to assess whether it is suitable to attend, either partially or in its entirety, the ASIs.

A first aid kit will be provided on the transport.

Clothing

While steel toe capped boots are not necessary, sturdy walking footwear will be required. The conditions in certain areas of the site will mean that wellington boots are recommended.

The ASI will involve exiting the transport and crossing local roads which have limited visibility. The morning ASI will also involve a visit to a working farm site. All attendees will therefore be required to wear high visibility jackets at all times during the ASI. Sunnica will provide the high visibility clothing.

Foliage adjacent to public rights of way can be of considerable height and therefore attendees are requested to choose clothing that keeps their arms and legs covered at all times when attending the ASI.

The ASI will involve a significant amount of walking. As such attendees are requested to dress appropriately for the weather.

Draft itinerary

The draft itinerary has been informed by the Ex A's request to attend several locations, as set out in procedural decision of 31 August.

Tables 1 and 2 set out the planned locations to visit during the ASI, approximate timings, and the information or plans that Sunnica considers to be relevant to each location. Sunnica will provide hard copies of these documents to attendees on the day of the ASI.

Figure 1 shows the path of the ASI around Sunnica West Site B during the morning ASI. The numbers correspond to those in the location column of Table 1.




Figure 2 – location plan for afternoon ASI

Figure 2 shows the path of the ASI through the Limekilns and around Sunnica West Site A during the afternoon ASI. The numbers correspond to those in the location column of Table 1.




Figure 3 – viewpoints and walking path for morning ASI

Figure 3 indicates the path to viewpoints within the field boundaries and on public rights of way during the morning ASI. The viewpoint letters correspond to those noted in Table 1.




Figure 4 – viewpoints and walking path for afternoon ASI

Figure 4 outlines the path to viewpoints during the afternoon ASI. The viewpoint letters correspond to those noted in Table 2.

The timings provided below are approximate and will depend on factors such as traffic and whether additional time is spent at a particular location.

Written submissions on the examination procedure

Sunnica supports the use of hybrid hearings and the ability for participants to attend the hearings either in person or virtually. Sunnica has a preference that it is able to attend all hearings in person and would prefer not to have hearings that are virtual only.

Sunnica has also considered the draft timetable at Annex C of your letter and has the following observations:

- 1. Responses to FWQ and written representations are to be submitted by Deadline 2 (11 November 2022) and responses to these submissions are required by 22 November 2022. Sunnica is anticipating that there is likely to be a volume of responses to Deadline 2 that would make meeting the 22 November deadline challenging. It is understood that the Ex A would want to see sight of responses to FWQ and the written representations in advance of the hearings scheduled for week commencing 5th December 2022. However, the timetable could accommodate a delay in responding to until 29 November 2022 without having subsequent delays in the timetable.
- 2. Second written questions are issued on 5th January 2023 and a response is required by Deadline 5 on 13 January 2023. The draft timetable provides 6 working days for a response which is a very compressed timetable. Sunnica requests that consideration is given to merging Deadline 5 and 6 so that all matters for these deadlines are responded to by 30 January 2023.
- 3. An updated guide to the application, book of reference, schedule of changes to the book of reference and an updated schedule of negotiations are due to be submitted at all deadlines from 1 to 8. It is not clear why these documents need to be submitted with such regularity. Could this be reduced to deadline 1, 2, 4, 6 and 8?

Response to relevant representations

In Sunnica's letter dated 30 August 2022 (AS-242) enclosing the changes request Sunnica said it would submit it responses to relevant representations on 16th September 2022. However, the comments of the Ex A in respect of these responses in its letter dated 8 September2022 are noted in terms of the Ex A only publishing the responses at Deadline 1 thereby removing the benefit of an early submission. On the basis of those comments Sunnica will submit its responses to relevant representations on Deadline 1, 19 October 2022.

Figure 1 – location plan for morning ASI
