

I would like to add to the considerable number of local residents who are against the proposal. Nobody can disagree with the need to generate renewables, but the sheer size of this scheme and the impact locally should mean that it doesn't go ahead. The grid connection at Burwell means that we have a high density of solar farms in the local area already, with considerable impact on the local landscape. it is of possible to graze sheep among the panels and sow the areas with wildflower mixes, but this is rarely done due to cost and labour.

Experience also shows that national infrastructure schemes are far less accountable to the local community than a scheme that is overseen by the local planning authority. Solar farms yes, Sunnica no.
