Sunnica will close the icknield way bridleway between snailwell and A14 footbridge during construction which is the busiest part of the path used daily by walkers, dog walkers, cyclists and horse riders from the whole area .The loss of this community amenity is disastrous as there is no alternative (sunnica suggest using the road which has no footpath) and will affect people's health and wellbeing

Sunnica should not be allowed to develop nor excavate trenches between the 2 SSSI,s snailwell meadows and Chippenham Fen .These national and international unique sites will be ruined forever and the wildlife which has taken over50 years to establish and protect will be destroyed

A 3 storey battery storage unit (BSU) should not be allowed to be constructed on a green field site. The BSU 's have a history of catching fire, difficult to contain and give off lethal toxic fumes which would affect Snailwell, Chippenham and Newmarket residents depending on the wind direction at the time. Even if the chance is low residents will be worried about the potential affects leading to stress and physical and mental illness. The villages have a high % of older residents who will be adversely affected during and after the construction of the plant

21st century power plant in an 18th century landscape brings unacceptable disruption and health threat to 1000,s of residents in the 15 villages and the surrounding area over 2years , 6 days a week and 12 hours a day. Constant noise in quiet rural spots from machinery and vehicles , pollution from 1000 daily traffic movements, traffic congestion with excess traffic on narrow and twisting rural roads, Huge lorries breaking up the road surface and causing traffic chaos, Mud and debris everywhere . Its a totally outrages scheme and should not be allowed

The severance of the Icknield way footpath between snailwell and the A14 footbridge during construction is totally unacceptable . This busy path is used daily by large numbers of walkers , dog exercise walkers , horse riders and cyclists from all over the area . Sunnicas suggest using the snailwell road which is unacceptable as there is no footpath and is busy with fast moving traffic. The temporary loss of this valuable amenity will bring health and safety issues to all the current users

It is outrageous to construct panels and dig channels between 2 SSSI sites: chippenham fen, snailwell poor fen and meadows. These nationally and internationally important sites have been established and protected over 50 years. The loss of wildlife through construction noise and pollution and the disturbance to water courses which feed the rare plants is totally unacceptable and will be lost forever.

As well as existing solar farms there are further planning application for others in this area . This is taking out large areas of productive farming when we most need it . We build around 250000 new homes every year plus office and industrial buildings , why don't we install solar panels on these buildings . They will benefit from less expensive electricity and we will still have the agricultural land we sorely need . Germany produces 70% of its solar power from roofs , why cant planners insist that we do the same?
