

I object to the proposed Sunnica scheme for the following reasons:

- A. The Battery Storage System has not been tested on such a large scale. I fear for what may happen if an accident should occur. Some of the batteries seem very close to population centres and schools.
- B. Sunnica seem unwilling to specify the panels and BESS's they will use. Will it be the best or the cheapest? How long will it be viable for economical use? Who will be financially responsible for decommissioning or refitting the site? I understand that some of these, and similar questions, can only be answered in the future. But, how much confidence can be placed in Sunnica when they avoid answering questions that they should be able to?
- C. The Lorries carrying the panels will be large and many. The routes locally are categorised as B & C roads. Our home is very close to the roadside in Worlington, the massive increase in the number large lorry movements will significantly affect our quality of life and local journey times.
- D. We moved to a small, rural village in the beautiful Suffolk countryside. Sunnica want to move our house from that countryside in to a power station, a very industrial landscape. We enjoy the countryside location of our home, both on foot and by bicycle. This will all come to an end if Sunnica are successful. It will certainly have a negative effect on the value of our property.
- E. I whole-heartedly support the move to green energy production, but cannot help feeling that, whilst part of the proposal is energy generation, a whole lot more seems to be about energy trading. The storage of energy in the batteries, gathering it from the grid, when it is cheap, during times of surplus. Then, selling it back to the grid when demand is high. This does not feel very 'green'. It would seem to be far better, and more cheaply, done by the state.
- F. I have tried to identify some local benefits from the proposal. I don't think there will generate many local jobs, if any. I don't think our electricity will be any cheaper. Any screening around the sites will take many years to be effective. I can't imagine how the proposal will enhance the village, and its surroundings, in any way.
