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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of Statement of Commonality

This document provides the Examining Authority (ExA) with an overview of the position of each Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) between Awel y Môr Offshore Wind Farm Limited (the 'Applicant') and the Interested Parties (IPs) (see Annex H of Rule 6 Letter PD-007) in relation to Awel y Môr Offshore Wind Farm (hereafter referred to as 'AyM') at Deadline 3. This document will be updated and submitted at relevant Examination deadlines outlined in the Examination timetable.

1.2 Structure of this Statement of Commonality

2 Approach to capturing commonality

2.1 List of Commonality

Table 1 provides the list of SoCGs that have been requested by the ExA in the Rule 6 letter issued on 23 August 2022 and the Applicant's approach to capturing commonality.

2.2 Letters of Comfort and Position Statements

- In some instance, Letters of Comfort (LoC) and Position Statements (PS) are being prepared instead of a full formal SoCG, with agreement from the IPs. This is because the matters on which some IPs are interested in are limited in scope (e.g. substantive matters are either agreed or can be addressed post-consent through crossing and/or proximity agreements) and so the LoCs in these cases are considered to be more appropriate than a SoCG in order to capture status of discussions. Where a LoC or PS is being prepared instead of a SoCG, this is detailed in Table 1.
- A PS is substantively the same as a SoCG but follows a simpler format to allow each party to identify the issues pertinent to (for example) their commercial interests and to determine the level of detail to put before the ExA pending the conclusion of commercial discussions, which are being progressed outside the DCO process and may pertain to commercially sensitive information. The PSs will be updated in the same way as a SoCG, with updates provided to the ExA at relevant deadlines.

2.3 Statements of Common Ground

At the point of Deadline 3, the Applicant is progressing SoCGs with IPs and has been able to submit an additional seven SoCGs at Deadline 3, alongside the one SoCG that was submitted at Deadline 2. Where SoCGs have not been submitted, the Applicant has been in communication with the relevant IP and is actively working towards submitting an initial SoCG at Deadline 3a or Deadline 4.

Gwynt y Môr Offshore Transmission Owner (Gwynt y Mor OFTO)	The Applicant notes that the ExA has not requested a SoCG with Gwynt y Môr OFTO, with whom a cable crossing and cable proximity agreement is required. The Applicant understands that Gwynt y Môr OFTO is content to continue commercial discussions and therefore does not consider a SoCG necessary.

5 Additional commentary

5.1 Deadline 1

The Applicant has not been in a position to provide initial SoCGs to the ExA at Deadline 1. However, initial SoCGs have been issued to all parties (except where noted above in Table 2 and are actively engaging positively with all IPs identified). The ExA should be confident that, whilst the Applicant has not provided initial SoCGs at Deadline 1, that outstanding matters are being discussed with the relevant IPs, and an update will be provided at subsequent deadlines. As noted in Section 8 of the Preliminary Meeting Note (EV-008), the Applicant advised that submissions of SoCGs at Deadline 1 are not generally considered to be helpful unless it has been agreed with the IP. It is also noted that the LPAs present at the Preliminary Meeting were in agreement with this position.

5.2 Deadline 2

- 12 The Applicant has been progressing SoCGs with parties since Deadline 1. The Applicant has re-contacted all parties to progress SoCGs and hopes to be able to submit progressed SoCGs at Deadline 3.
- The ExA should be confident that, whilst the Applicant has not provided a complete set of initial SoCGs at Deadline 2, outstanding matters are being discussed with the relevant IPs, and an update will be provided at subsequent deadlines.

5.3 Deadline 3

The Applicant is pleased to be progressing with the SoCGs and has submitted seven SoCGs into the Examination at this deadline, in addition to the SoCG with MCA submitted at Deadline 2. The Applicant is making good progress with other SoCGs yet to be submitted and is engaging with IPs to ensure these can be submitted as soon as practical for both parties. The Applicant is also continuing discussion in regard to topics under ongoing discussions and hopes to be able to submit updated SoCGs at subsequent deadlines once positions have been reached.



6 Final positions

- 15 These will be completed and submitted to the ExA at the relevant deadlines that final positions are reached with IPs.
- 16 At Deadline 3, the Applicant is not in a position to report on the final positions of any IPs with SoCGs.
