In response to your email regarding the proposal for the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Project.

We have been residents of [REDACTED] the closest village to the project for over 50 years and live [REDACTED] the proposed site of the project, these are our reasons for objecting to the project.

The putrid smell from the waste during storage and movement before incinerating and during incineration preventing us from being able to go outside, have windows open, hang washing out, taking away our outdoor life in our own gardens and village.

The pollution from the incineration process as the government has now confirmed they are more polluting than coal fired power stations.

The Hydrogen storage !!

We lived in the village when the Flixborough disaster happened that was deemed the largest peacetime explosion and was then promised by the government they would never build another plant so close to Amcotts that had potential to blow the village up again.

The project is being built on flood plain land.

The tranquil village of Amcotts is already surrounded with six on shore wind turbine farms accumulating to 212 turbines that can be counted from our house.

We can see the solar powered farm across the river in front of our house.

Within a one mile radius from our house we have already got three power stations and with the proposal of Keadby3 that would be four, your project would make five. The village and surrounding area has over and beyond its share of energy projects, our countryside and our standard of living will be deteriorated.
