Dear Sir,

I write to object to the proximity of the new proposed cable route for your Rampion 2 Project. We have a dementia care home on Wineham Lane and the cable route is close to the southern boundary of our property.

Our elderly residents, living with dementia, have the right to a peaceful existence in the home and within its grounds. Please do not allow for noise or visual disturbance to our residents. This would breach their basic human rights and we will be rigorous in defending this.

The peaceful, natural surroundings of the Home are an important consideration when residents and their families make the decision to choose our Home. Any disruption to this and to Wineham Lane could have a detrimental business impact, for which we would be seeking compensation.

We strongly believe that the cable route should be at least 100 metres further south from the current proposal, so it would have less of an impact upon our residents / business.

I hope you will give this full consideration, so as not to upset the peaceful existence of 50 individuals living with dementia.
