Notice is hereby given that Drax Power Limited of Drax Power Station, Drax, Selby YO8 8PH (the "Applicant") proposes to make an application (the "Application") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the installation and operation of post combustion carbon capture technology to capture carbon dioxide from up to two existing 660 MWe biomass power generating units at the Drax Power Station (Unit 1 and Unit 2).

The Proposed Scheme would comprise of:

- Up to two carbon capture plants (one per existing biomass unit), each made up of: a flue gas pre-treatment section (to include up to two gas / gas heat exchangers and one quench column), one absorber column, a solvent regeneration system (to include up to two regenerators), rich solvent / lean solvent heat exchangers, and ancillary systems related to the carbon capture process;
- Common plant elements (used by one or both carbon capture plants) including modification to the existing cooling system and distribution of cooling water to the Proposed Scheme, modification to the existing biomass power generating units (Units 1 and 2) for extraction of steam and new infrastructure to meet required process conditions for distribution of steam to the Proposed Scheme, solvent storage and make-up system, carbon dioxide compression and processing plant, and carbon capture wastewater treatment plant;
- Road modifications;

NOTICE OF PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR A DEVELOPMENT CONSENT ORDER (DCO) FOR THE DRAX BIOENERGY WITH CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE PROJECT

1. Notice is hereby given that Drax Power Limited of Drax Power Station, Drax, Selby YO8 8PH (the "Applicant") proposes to make an application (the "Application") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the installation and operation of post combustion carbon capture technology to capture carbon dioxide from up to two existing 660 MWe biomass power generating units at the Drax Power Station (Unit 1 and Unit 2).
2. The Proposed Scheme would comprise of:
 - Up to two carbon capture plants (one per existing biomass unit), each made up of: a flue gas pre-treatment section (to include up to two gas / gas heat exchangers and one quench column), one absorber column, a solvent regeneration system (to include up to two regenerators), rich solvent / lean solvent heat exchangers, and ancillary systems related to the carbon capture process;
 - Common plant elements (used by one or both carbon capture plants) including modification to the existing cooling system and distribution of cooling water to the Proposed Scheme, modification to the existing biomass power generating units (Units 1 and 2) for extraction of steam and new infrastructure to meet required process conditions for distribution of steam to the Proposed Scheme, solvent storage and make-up system, carbon dioxide compression and processing plant, and carbon capture wastewater treatment plant;
 - Road modifications;
 - An Environmental Mitigation Area; and
 - Other works associated with the Proposed Scheme including site drainage, security infrastructure and site lighting infrastructure, as well as an area for temporary construction laydown.
3. The Site is approximately 290ha and comprises of the Drax Power Station Site, an Environmental Mitigation Area (the land to the north of Drax Power Station that may be used for environmental mitigation for the Proposed Scheme), and the Laydown Area to the east of Drax Power Station (temporary area required during the construction phase of the Proposed Scheme for the short-term storage of materials and temporary locations of construction offices, warehouses, workshops, open air storage areas, parking and related activities, which will be reinstated to its original state following demobilisation).
4. As an extension to an existing generating station with capacity of more than 50 MW, the Proposed Scheme is classed as a "Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project" under Section 14(1)(a) of the Planning Act 2008. The Applicant must therefore apply to the Secretary of State for a DCO, in order to construct, operate and maintain the Proposed Scheme.
5. The Application will seek the authorisation of the Proposed Scheme through the DCO. The DCO will include powers required to construct and operate the project including compulsory acquisition powers for the permanent acquisition of land and / or rights over land. The DCO may also include (if required) powers for the temporary occupation of land, the extinguishment or overriding of easements and other rights over or affecting land required for the Proposed Scheme, the application and / or disapplication of legislation relevant to the Proposed Scheme, highway powers and tree and hedgerow removal, amongst other matters.

Environmental Impact Assessment

6. The Applicant has notified the Secretary of State in writing under Regulation 8(1)(b) of The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the 'EIA Regulations') that it proposes to provide an Environmental Statement ("ES") in respect of the Proposed Scheme. The Proposed Scheme is therefore 'EIA development' for the purposes of the EIA Regulations and an ES will form part of the Application for the Proposed Scheme.
7. The ES will provide a detailed description of the Proposed Scheme and its environmental effects, as well as other matters required by the EIA Regulations. The Applicant has prepared a Preliminary Environmental Information Report ("PEIR"), which sets out the Applicant's preliminary view of the likely significant effects of the Proposed Scheme based on the assessment undertaken to date as well as a non-technical summary of the PEIR. RESTAURANT DUE TO REOPEN AMID FIRE INVESTIGATION

The owner of a popular local restaurant that was devastated by fire in December of last year has announced plans to reopen in 2022.

Omar Farooque of The Curry Leaf on Epworth's High Street has thanked the local community for its continued support and added: "We know you are all waiting for the reopening of Curry Leaf and we are so sorry for the long wait. We are looking into the New Year now and we hope to be closer to giving you a reopening date then."

The restaurant went up in flames in the early hours of December 8, 2020, and it took fire crews from Scunthorpe, Crowle and Epworth more than four hours to completely extinguish the fire.

The restaurant and the flat situated above it were badly damaged, and a joint investigation was launched by Humberside Fire & Rescue Service and Humberside Police to determine the cause of the blaze.

In early January of this year, two men were arrested in connection with the incident and released on police bail.

This week, a Humberside Police spokeswoman told the Epworth Times: "The investigation continues and the two men remain on bail."

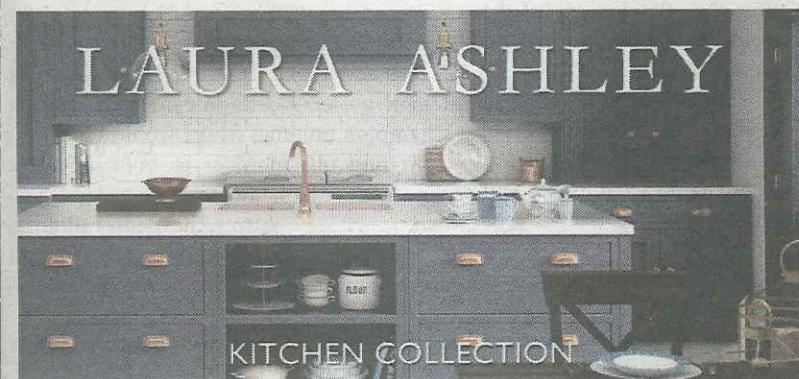

VOLUNTEER NEIL LANDS KNOCKOUT PUNCH AT AWARDS

The man who was a "key figure" in setting up Goole's Amateur Boxing Club has been honoured for his work in the HEY Smile Foundation Volunteer Awards 2021.

Neil Begbie was crowned the winner in the Community Volunteer Award category for his efforts in getting the boxing club off the ground over the last year.

The judges in the competition said that despite the standard of entries in this year's shortlist being "incredibly high", Neil stood out as a "real driving force" in the community after becoming a "key figure" in setting up a new boxing club from nothing.

Neil works part time with the Moorlands Community Charity's youth club and he says he jumped at the chance to do his bit to get involved with the boxing club.

He explained: "I have always been interested in working with young people. I have volunteered with the Scouts for many years and then I began working in the Moorlands youth club."

"When the charity began talking about getting involved with setting up the boxing club I thought it was a definite 'yes' from me and I decided I would do whatever it would take to make it happen."

"When the team were looking for



volunteers I signed up to help straight away."

The 37-year-old became instrumental in finding and securing a venue for the club, as well as seeking funding, purchasing equipment and recruiting coaches.

Moorlands Community Charity's CEO, Jacky Crawford said: "Neil has been instrumental in supporting the planning and delivery of Goole Amateur Boxing Club and we are so pleased he has been

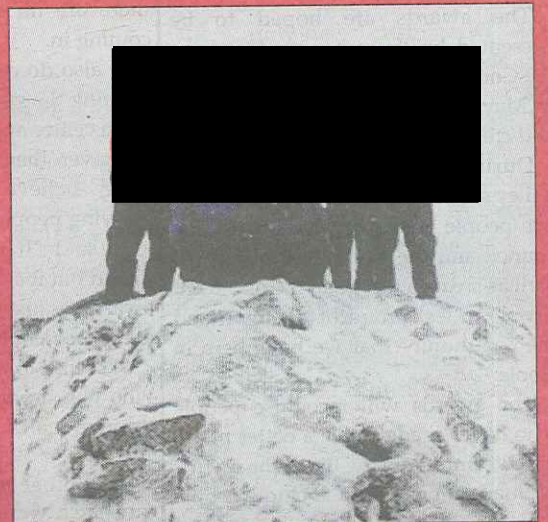
recognised for his efforts."

PROMISING CHEF DIES IN TRAGIC ACCIDENT

An 18-year-old chef who lost his life in a collision last month has been described as a "larger than life character" who "was destined for great things".

Tributes have been paid to Thomas Ferguson - a former Selby College student and chef at Loftsome Bridge Hotel.

The motorcyclist died on September 27 after colliding with a car on the A19 at Great Thirkleby at 6.20am.

Thomas was named by the coroner ahead of an inquest into his death.

Leading the tributes, Liz Ridley, Deputy Principal at Selby College, said: "We are deeply saddened to hear the news of the death of our former student Thomas. He recently finished his Level 2 Hospitality and Catering course with us, which he was carrying out whilst working as a chef at Loftsome Bridge Hotel.

"Thomas was a larger than life character and was destined for great things. Our thoughts are with his family and friends during this difficult time."

Adrian Dawes, Subject Lead - Hospitality and Catering at Selby College - added: "Thomas was a fantastic chef and had a great sense of humour. He was a hard worker and was always willing to help out his fellow course mates. He will be extremely missed by all."

The 18-year-old had three siblings, including half brother five-year-old Oliver, who "idolised" him.

Thomas' mum, Stacy Lees said: "In some ways he was a typical 18-year-old, going out to the pub with his friends and buying expensive aftershave.

"He was very hard working in his jobs and spent hours tinkering on his bikes, keeping them in pristine condition - constantly cleaning them.

"Also, a very caring person. Always available for his friends when they needed it, and always checking in on them to make sure they're OK."

Flowers, notes and motorcycle helmets in memory of Thomas have been left at Thirkleby Hall Caravan Park.

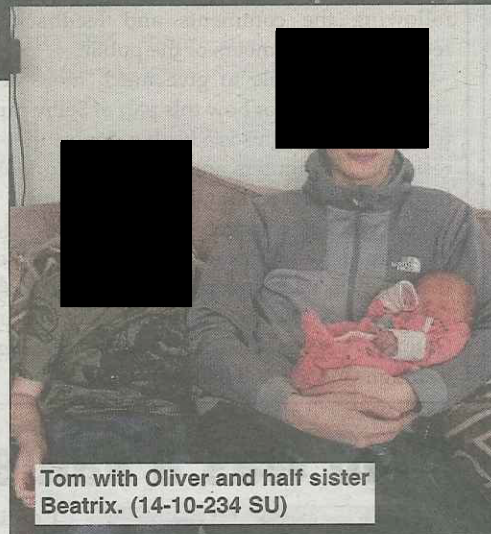
"Tom was one of the nicest lads you'll come across," Joe said.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR A DEVELOPMENT CONSENT ORDER (DCO) FOR THE DRAX BIOENERGY WITH CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE PROJECT

- Notice is hereby given that Drax Power Limited of Drax Power Station, Drax, Selby YO8 8PH (the "Applicant") proposes to make an application (the "Application") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") to authorise the installation and operation of post combustion carbon capture technology to capture carbon dioxide from up to two existing 660 MWe biomass power generating units at the Drax Power Station (Unit 1 and Unit 2).
- The Proposed Scheme would comprise of:
 - Up to two carbon capture plants (one per existing biomass unit), each made up of: a flue gas pre-treatment section (to include up to two gas / gas heat exchangers and one quench column), one absorber column, a solvent regeneration system (to include up to two regenerators), rich solvent / lean solvent heat exchangers, and ancillary systems related to the carbon capture process;
 - Common plant elements (used by one or both carbon capture plants) including modification to the existing cooling system and distribution of cooling water to the Proposed Scheme, modification to the existing biomass power generating units (Units 1 and 2) for extraction of steam and new infrastructure to meet required process conditions for distribution of steam to the Proposed Scheme, solvent storage and make-up system, carbon dioxide compression and processing plant, and carbon capture wastewater treatment plant;
 - Road modifications;

 - An Environmental Mitigation Area; and
 - Other works associated with the Proposed Scheme including site drainage, security infrastructure and site lighting infrastructure, as well as an area for temporary construction laydown.
- The Site is approximately 290ha and comprises of the Drax Power Station Site, an Environmental Mitigation Area (the land to the north of Drax Power Station that may be used for environmental mitigation for the Proposed Scheme), and the Laydown Area to the east of Drax Power Station (temporary area required during the construction phase of the Proposed Scheme for the short-term storage of materials and temporary locations of construction offices, warehouses, workshops, open air storage areas, parking and related activities, which will be reinstated to its original state following demobilisation).
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Environmental Impact Assessment

- The Applicant has notified the Secretary of State in writing under Regulation 8(1)(b) of The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (the "EIA Regulations") that it proposes to provide an Environmental Statement ("ES") in respect of the Proposed Scheme. The Proposed Scheme is therefore 'EIA development' for the purposes of the EIA Regulations and an ES will form part of the Application for the Proposed Scheme.
- The ES will provide a detailed description of the Proposed Scheme and its environmental effects, as well as other matters required by the EIA Regulations. The Applicant has prepared a Preliminary Environmental Information Report ("PEIR"), which sets out the Applicant's preliminary view of the likely significant effects of the Proposed Scheme based on the assessment undertaken to date as well as a non-technical summary of the PEIR.
