



RESPONSE TO REQUEST FOR INFORMATION ON BEHALF OF MOOIR
VANNIN OFFSHORE WINDFARM LIMITED

IN CONNECTION WITH THE Application by Morecambe Offshore Wind
Limited for an Order Granting Development Consent for the Morecambe
Offshore Windfarm Project

1. Introduction

- 1.1 This submission is provided on behalf of Moir Vannin Offshore Windfarm Limited (“**MVOWFL**”) in response to the request for further information dated 21 August 2025 issued by the Secretary of State (“**SoS**”) in respect of the application by Morecambe Offshore Wind Farm Limited (the “**Applicant**”) for an Order under the Planning Act 2008 (the “**Act**”) granting Development Consent for the Morecambe Offshore Windfarm Project: Generation Assets (the “**Project**”).

2. Response to request for information

- 2.1 In the request for information, the SoS requested that MVOWFL respond to the following question under the heading ‘Cumulative Effects Assessment’:

The Secretary of State notes that the application for Marine Infrastructure Consent for the Moir Vannin Generation Project was due to be submitted in July 2025. The Secretary of State invites the Isle of Man Government and Moir Vannin Offshore Wind Farm Limited to confirm whether any application has been made, and when any further environmental information relevant to the application may be made available. If further information is available now, the Applicant is requested to update the Cumulative Effects Assessment and In-Combination Assessment accordingly.

- 2.2 MVOWFL re-submitted its application for Marine Infrastructure Consent for the proposed Moir Vannin Offshore Windfarm (“**Moor Vannin**”) on 28 July 2025.
- 2.3 On Tuesday 26 August 2025, MVOWFL was informed that the application for Moir Vannin has been accepted by the Council of Ministers for examination.
