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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. PURPOSE OF THE STATEMENT OF COMMON GROUND

- 1.1.1. A Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) is a written statement produced during the application process for a Development Consent Order (DCO) and is prepared jointly by the applicant and another party.
- 1.1.2. Paragraph 007 of the Department for Levelling Up, Ministry for Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) Guidance entitled 'Planning Act 2008: Examination stage for Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects' (30 April 2024) (hereafter referred to as MHCLG Guidance)¹ describes a SoCG as follows:
 - "A Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) is a written statement prepared jointly by the applicant and another party or parties, setting out any matters on which they agree, or indeed disagree. A SoCG helps to ensure that the evidence at the examination focuses on the material differences between the main parties and therefore makes best use of the lines of questioning pursued by the Examining Authority".
- 1.1.3. This SoCG has been prepared in accordance with the MHCLG Guidance¹. The aim of a SoCG is to assist the Examining Authority in examining the DCO by providing an understanding of the status of discussions or negotiations between the applicant and the other party. The effective use of SoCG aid an efficient examination process.
- 1.1.4. A SoCG may be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate either prior to the start of or during an Examination and is updated as necessary or as requested during the Examination.
- 1.1.5. This SoCG has been prepared by WSP UK Limited on behalf of Cory Environmental Holdings Limited ('the Applicant'). It accompanies the application for a DCO ('the DCO Application') in relation to the Cory Decarbonisation Project in Bexley, London. The DCO Application has been made in accordance with Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) and submitted to the Secretary of State ('the SoS') for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ).
- 1.1.6. The DCO, if granted, would authorise the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the Cory Decarbonisation Project (the 'Proposed Scheme'). The Proposed Scheme is to be located at Norman Road, Belvedere in the London Borough of Bexley (LBB) (National Grid Reference/NGR 549572, 180512).
- 1.1.7. The Proposed Scheme is described in **Chapter 2: Site and the Proposed Scheme** (Volume 1) of the **ES (APP-051)** and includes:
 - The Carbon Capture Facility (including its associated supporting plant and ancillary infrastructure);
 - A Proposed Jetty to allow for export of the captured carbon by vessel;

- A Mitigation and Enhancement Area;
- Temporary Construction Compounds; and
- Utilities Connections and Site Access Works.

1.2. INTRODUCTION TO MARINE MANAGEMENT ORGANISATION

- 1.2.1. This SoCG has been prepared between Marine Management Organisation and the Applicant (jointly referred to as the Parties) in relation to the DCO Application. The Marine Management Organisation is responsible for regulating and licensing activities in English waters to protect the marine environment.
- 1.2.2. As the Proposed Scheme involves works extending into the River Thames, mandatory consultation with the Marine Management Organisation has been undertaken. Advice and consultation responses are typically provided as part of non-statutory consultation and engagement, in response to the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Scoping Report², as part of statutory consultation (including on the Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR)³ and as part of participation in the Examination process.

1.3. STATEMENT OF COMMON GROUND STRUCTURE

- 1.3.1. Section 2 summarises all engagement to date of relevance to this SoCG and Section 3 details whether matters are Agreed, Not Agreed or Under Discussion between the Parties.
- 1.3.2. In respect of matters relevant to the Proposed Scheme, but not referred to in this SoCG, Marine Management Organisation has no further comments to make at this point. It may have further or additional comments to make, particularly if further information about the Proposed Scheme becomes available.
- 1.3.3. The SoCG is a document that will evolve during the Examination stage and will conclude with a version that confirms the Parties' positions on relevant matters before the close of the Examination.

2. RECORD OF ENGAGEMENT

2.1.1. A summary of the meetings and correspondence that has taken place between the Applicant and Marine Management Organisation in relation to the Proposed Scheme is outlined in **Table 2-1** below. There has been email correspondence between the Parties to discuss the sharing of information, arrangement of meetings and to share comment on draft documentation, but this table reflects the key meetings and emails of note that have taken place between the Parties.

3.1. TERMINOLOGY

3.2. MATTERS AGREED

3.2.1. **Table 3-1** below details the matters Agreed between the Marine Management Organisation and the Applicant.

S42 Response Letter (email)	 The MMO highlighted the following points from their Section 42 response: The MMO considered the information presented in the baseline and impact assessment for benthic ecology to be adequate (Section 1.1 of the Section 42 response). The MMO agreed with the mitigation measures presented for benthic ecology (Section 1.3 of the Section 42 response). The MMO has agreed with the Applicant's approach to considering the South East Inshore Marine Plan. Each relevant technical chapter of the Environmental Statement (APP-043) reflects this consideration, and an assessment of compliance with the South East Inshore Marine Plan is provided in the Planning Statement (APP-040).
Marine Sediment Sampling	The Applicant completed the sediment sampling in December 2024 in accordance with the Marine Sample Plan (Case Reference: SAM/2024/00042). During the meeting on the 19 th February 2025 the Applicant described their approach to the analysis of the results of the completed sediment sampling and the MMO agreed with this approach. Following the meeting on 19 th February 2025, the Applicant submitted the Sediment Sampling Technical Note to the MMO which presents the findings of the sediment sampling, and provides the outstanding information requested by the MMO. The MMO agreed that a Technical Note would be appropriate and acceptable. This note (REP5-031) has been considered by the MMO, and further to discussions with the Applicant, and the matters set out in this SoCG, the MMO is content with its contents and conclusions.

Coastal processes, modelling and dredging	A meeting was held to discuss the MMO's response to the RR (RR-150) in regard to coastal modelling and dredging. The following matters were agreed:
	 Morphological Equilibrium Clarification: The Applicant agreed to include within the Errata Schedule (Document Reference 9.1) adjustments to the wording of the assessment regarding morphological equilibrium to reflect sediment settling accurately.
	 Cumulative Impacts: All parties agreed that there are no significant other projects impacting the area, and no issues were raised with the cumulative assessment (including in respect of underwater noise).
	 Wave Wash and Ship Navigation: It was agreed that the limited fetch lengths and unchanged ship navigation types mean that ship wash impacts are not anticipated.
	The MMO confirmed in their Deadline 1 Submission (REP1-035) that the Applicant has responded to previous concerns regarding coastal processes and the MMO has no further comments regarding this topic.
Benthic ecology, fish, and underwater noise	The underwater noise assessment considered a total of 15 piles installed per day, with a duration of 20 minutes per pile. The total duration of vibro-piling per day is to be confirmed as part of the detailed design and the MMO agrees that it will be able to consider this pursuant to the DML. The Applicant provided the MMO with a Table Technical Note on 17 th January detailing the sensitive migratory periods for fish utilising the Tidal Thames as part of the Applicant's
	Response to Interested Parties' Deadline 1 Submissions (REP2-019). In addition to this the Applicant also updated the wording in relation to mitigation measures for migratory fish in the updated Outline CoCP (AS-029). The MMO confirmed in their Deadline 4 Submission (REP4-

	037) that they have no further concerns regarding fisheries and fish ecology impacts in relation to the Proposed Scheme.
Shellfisheries	The MMO confirmed in their Deadline 1 Submission (REP1-035) that the Applicant has responded to previous concerns regarding shellfisheries and the MMO has no further comments regarding this topic.
South East Marine Inshore Marine Plan	The MMO confirmed in their Deadline 4 Submission (REP4-037) that the Applicant has detailed how the application is compliant with the relevant Marine Plan policies and has no further concerns regarding consideration of the South East Inshore Marine Plan.
Marine mammals assessment	The Applicant has provided clarifications to the MMO regarding the marine mammals assessment within Appendix 6-4: Underwater Noise Assessment of the Environmental Statement (Volume 3) (APP-084) (2% and 4%), detailed in Paragraph 2.6.6 of the RR (RR-150) to clarify and explain assessment percentages and the underwater noise assessment.
	The Applicant provided a written response to the comments made in the MMO's RR (RR-150) and additional comments received on the 9 th September within Table 5-2 of the Applicant's Response to Relevant Representations (AS-043).
	The MMO confirmed the aforementioned information would be reviewed on the 17 th January 2025, this position was re-confirmed within the meeting on the 19 th February 2025.

The Maintenance dredging for the Proposed Scheme is proposed to be covered under the Deemed Marine Licence at Schedule 11 of the Draft DCO. The MMO confirmed in their Deadline 4 Submission (REP4-037) that they were content with this approach.
Disposal of capital dredged material	The Applicant intends to dispose of capital dredged material on-land. As outlined within the Environmental Statement, dredging will be managed in accordance with relevant legislation and will be disposed of offsite (via vessel and only if dredged arisings are deemed suitable for this disposal method and conform with the permits for disposal sites). The removal of the construction dredged arisings will be undertaken by an appropriately licenced waste carrier. Should disposal at sea be a viable option for capital dredge, based the results of the ground investigations undertaken as part of the detailed design (and subsequent sediment testing, to be pre-agreed with the MMO), the Applicant will follow the procedures outlined in the Deemed Marine Licence. It is important to note that maintenance dredging is also included in the ambit of what is controlled in the DML, as it falls within the definition of 'licensed activity'. This includes the need for method statements and providing information, where relevant in regard to the location and quantities of dredged material disposed. The MMO agree with the proposed approach (i.e. likely disposal on-land) and with the procedures outlined in Schedule 11 of the Draft DCO for disposal at sea. On the basis of this, the MMO has no further concerns in respect of the Sediment Sampling Technical Note (REP5-031).

3.3. MATTERS UNDER DISCUSSION

3.3.1. No matters remain that are Under Discussion between the Marine Management Organisation and the Applicant.

3.4. MATTERS NOT AGREED

3.4.1. The MMO made its final comments on the DCO and DML at Deadline 5 requesting further changes to them. At Deadline 6, the Applicant has made some of the changes requested by the MMO, but not all of them (with an explanation as to why not), and is content to let the Secretary of State determine if the MMO's changes should be made.
