

1. Kexby Lane East	
Why the change was proposed	Transport and access requirements.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to safely access the construction compounds.



2. Kexby Lane West	
Why the change was proposed	Transport and access requirements
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to access the construction compounds safely.



3. Within site – adjacent to main construction access	
Why the change was proposed	Due diligence.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been adjusted to align with the ownership and field boundary.



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Engineering and feasibility.
The Order Limits have been changed to allow for connection to an existing water main along the A156 – enabling provision of a water supply directly to the sub-station and battery storage facility.
The exact point of connection is still to be determined and will be confirmed in the detailed design.







6. A156 – 1500 (Stow Park Road) / Littleborough Road junction Why the change was proposed Description of change The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate highway improvements at this junction. This is to accommodate abnormal indivisible loads travelling to the Solar and Energy Storage Park (north) and the Grid Connection Corridor (south).



7. A156 South of Marton (northern extension)	
Why the change was proposed	Transport and access requirements.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to access the proposed Grid Connection Corridor safely.



8. A156 South of Marton (southern extension)	
Why the change was proposed	Transport and access requirements.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to access the proposed Grid Connection Corridor safely.



9. Land south/east of Broad Lane and Headstead Bank		
Why the change was proposed	Engineering and feasibility.	
Description of change	The Order Limits have been widened to follow the field boundaries, which will allow flexibility for installation of the 400kV cable connections from Gate Burton Energy Park to the substation.	



10. Headstead Bank/Town Street, Cottam

Why the change was proposed

Transport and access requirements.

Description of change

The Order Limits have been changed to allow for abnormal indivisible loads accessing the Grid Connection Corridor. Improvements may need to be made along this stretch of road to enable access for larger vehicles.



11. Cottam Road (eastern extension)

Why the change was proposed

Transport and access requirements.

Description of change

The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to access the proposed Grid Connection Corridor safely.



12. Cottam Road (western extension)

Why the change was proposed

Transport and access requirements.

Description of change

The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to access the proposed Cable Connection Corridor safely.



13. Green Lane/Rampton Road Junction

Why the change was proposed

Transport and access requirements.

Description of change

The Order Limits have been changed to allow for abnormal indivisible loads accessing the Grid Connection Corridor.

Improvements may need to be made to the junction to enable access for larger vehicles turning.



14. North of Cottam Substation	
Why the change was proposed	Engineering and feasibility.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to enable the grid connection into Cottam Substation.



15. Marton Road	
Why the change was proposed	Transport and access requirements.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been changed to accommodate the potential for areas of vegetation removal along the highway. This will ensure there is sufficient visibility for vehicles to safely access the site.



16. Land south of Park F	arm
Why the change was proposed	Due diligence.
Description of change	The Order Limits have been adjusted to align with the ownership and field boundary.

Appendix I-2

Targeted Consultation Methodology and Rationale



Gate Burton Energy Park Targeted Consultation - 3 Nov to 13 Dec 2022 Methodology

1. Overview

- 1.1 Gate Burton Energy Park Ltd ('Gate Burton) carried out Stage Two 'statutory consultation' in accordance with the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008) in relation to the Scheme between 22 June and 5 August 2022. The aim of this consultation was to consult local communities, statutory consultees and other stakeholders on how the proposals for the Scheme had evolved since the early-stage proposals presented during the initial Stage One non-statutory consultation which took place earlier in the year (Jan-Feb 2022).
- 1.2 Stage Two consultation took place in accordance with the requirements of the PA 2008 and invited representations on the refined proposals for the Scheme including:
 - The indicative design for the solar energy park;
 - The route of the electrical connection from the solar energy park to Cottam substation;
 - The preliminary environmental effects of the Project (detailed in a Preliminary Environmental Information Report) and proposed mitigation; and,
 - · Any other issues/topics consultees felt we should consider.
- 1.3 Subsequent to Stage Two consultation closing in August 2022, we are carrying out a further stage of targeted consultation on our proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park in relation to a number of minor additions to the boundary for the Scheme the indicative Order Limits.
- 1.4 The reasons for these additions relate to the engineering and construction of the Scheme. We have also adjusted the indicative Order limits in a number of places so they now follow field and land ownership boundaries. The targeted consultation is intended to give consultees the opportunity to comment on these localised additions to the indicative Order Limits.

2. Approach to consultation

2.1 In determining how to consult on the localised changes we have had regard to paragraphs 73-77 of the PA 2008 DCLG pre-application guidance with para 73 setting out as follows:

"Applicants are not expected to repeat consultation rounds set out in their Statement of Community Consultation unless the project proposals have changed very substantially. However, where proposals change to such a large degree that what is being taken forward is fundamentally different from what was consulted on, further consultation may well be needed. This may be necessary if, for example, new information arises which renders all previous options unworkable or invalid for some reason. When considering the need for additional consultation, applicants should use the degree of change, the effect on the local community and the level of public interest as guiding factors."

- 2.2 The changes proposed are minor and the Scheme has not changed 'very substantially', therefore there is no requirement to repeat consultation on the Statement of Community Consultation.
- 2.3 The localised changes are minor therefore para 75 is relevant:

75. If the application only changes to a small degree, or if the change only affects part of the development, then it is not necessary for an applicant to undertake a full re-consultation. Where a proposed application is amended in light of consultation responses then, unless those amendments materially change the application or materially changes its impacts, the amendments themselves should not trigger a need for further consultation. Instead, the applicant should ensure that all affected statutory consultees and local communities are informed of the changes.

76. In circumstances where a particular issue has arisen during the preapplication consultation, or where it is localised in nature, it may be appropriate to hold a non-statutory, targeted consultation. A developer's Statement of Community Consultation should be drafted so that it does not preclude this approach. A more bespoke approach can be adopted, which may allow developers to respond with more agility to the issue at hand. If adopting this approach, the emphasis should be on ensuring that relevant individuals and organisations are included.

- 2.4 Given the nature of the minor changes, and in context of PA 2008 DCLG pre-application guidance we do not consider that the 'proposed application changes to such a large degree that the proposals could be considered a new application' or that it 'materially change[s] the application or materially changes its impacts'.
- 2.5 We have therefore determined that while full re-consultation is not necessary the changes involve an extension to the Order Limits and additional Compulsory Acquisition Powers over those areas. We have therefore carried out a diligent enquiry process to identify the land interests potentially affected by the additional areas identified (see section 5.2.2) and are adopting a strategy to undertake a targeted consultation with those s42(1)(d) consultees as well as prescribed consultees, local authorities and the local communities in the vicinity of the changes.

When we will consult

- 3.1 The targeted consultation will run from 3 November 2022 until 13 December 2022 a consultation period of 41 days which exceeds the minimum period of 28 days as required by the PA2008. Postal strikes are planned for November 2022 so this period has been lengthened to ensure that all parties have a period of over 28 days to respond.
- 3.2 The consultation dates will be articulated on all literature and communications materials developed to support the targeted consultation, with the deadline for receipt of all submissions to the consultation being given specific prominence, along with information on how representations to the consultation can be made.

4. Who we will consult

- 4.1 Targeted consultation is being structured to provide the opportunity for the following consultees to provide any views and comments on the additional areas identified
 - Section 42(1) (a) and (b) consultees
 - Section 42(1) d consultees Persons having an interest in land affected by the additions to the proposed Order limits
 - · Local communities in vicinity of the changes
- 4.2 We will also issue a copy of the Section 48 notice to all Section 42 a and b consultees to ensure all parties have received this notice in accordance with Regulation 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.

5. How we will consult

5.1 Project website

- 5.1.1 The project website will be updated to provide information about the consultation and amendments being consulted on from 3 November 2022.
- 5.1.2 Details of the localised changes being consulted on (including maps) will be set out on a dedicated webpage, and an online feedback form through which consultees can provide representations to the targeted consultation will be provided.
- 5.1.3 The information about the consultation set out on the dedicated webpage will also be set out in a PDF document that will be available for people to view and download from the 'Documents' section of the website along with a PDF version of the feedback form. Printed copies of these documents will be made available on request.

5.2 Targeted communications

5.2.1 Section 42(1)(a) and (b) (prescribed consultees and local authorities)

- Will be provided with documents describing the minor additions to the proposed Order Limits comprising:
 - A covering letter providing details of the consultation process including links to updated information on the project website
 - Hard copy of Map of the Scheme showing the changes to the boundary
 - Hard copy of the Consultation Information Leaflet explaining the rationale for each change with additional maps
 - Hard copy of the targeted consultation Feedback Form
 - Section 48 Notice
- These documents will be issued by Royal Mail on or around 31 October 2022 to allow the beginning of targeted consultation launching on 3 November.

5.2.2 Section 42(1)(d) consultees - Persons having an interest in land affected by the changes

- We have undertaken a diligent enquiry process to identify the Section 42(1)(d) consultees, initially through title searches with the Land Registry. Land Interest Questionnaires were issued to the interests identified through Land Registry, desktop referencing and site visits have been undertaken to clarify interests in land where required.
- Will be provided with documents describing the minor additions to the proposed Order Limits comprising:
 - A covering letter providing details of the consultation process including links to updated information on the project website
 - Hard copy of Map of the Scheme showing the changes to the boundary
 - Hard copy of the Consultation Information Leaflet explaining the rationale for each change with additional maps
 - o Hard copy(ies) of Landownership Parcel Plans
 - Hard copy of the targeted consultation Feedback Form
- These documents will be issued by Royal Mail on or around 31 October 2022 to allow the beginning of targeted consultation launching on 3 November.

5.2.3 Local communities in vicinity of the changes

- We have identified selected local community areas within vicinity of the minor additions to
 the proposed Order Limits (approximately 600 addresses) and will issue a letter by Royal
 Mail informing the recipients of the minor additions and directing them to the Gate Burton
 Energy Park website for further information. See
 Appendix 1 for a plan showing the extent of the areas within which mailings will be targeted.
- In addition a copy of this communication will also be issued to individuals previously consulted as s42(1) (d)
- Parties representing the interests of those communities in vicinity of the changes will also be informed directly about the targeted consultation. These include:
 - Relevant district and county ward members (via LPA officers)
 - Relevant Parish Councils (noting these are also statutory consultees under s42(1)(a))
 - o Relevant Members of Parliament

See Appendix 2 for a list of the relevant community representatives identified.

The communication issued to all of these stakeholders will comprise:

- A covering letter providing details of the consultation process including links to updated information on the project website
- Hard copy of the Consultation Information Leaflet explaining the rationale for each change with additional maps
- Hard copy of the targeted consultation Feedback Form
- Printed communications will be issued on or around 31 October 2022 to allow the beginning of targeted consultation on 3 November 2022
- Individuals / organisations who have previously registered their details with us to receive
 project updates will also be notified by email when the project website goes live with
 information about the targeted consultation to advise them that new information is available
 and give them the opportunity to take part.

5.2.4 Media

 A press release will be proactively issued to local and regional media outlets on 3 November 2022 to advise them of the targeted consultation, where information about what is being consulted on can be found, and details of how views and comments can be submitted.

5.2 Providing feedback

- 5.3.1 Feedback to the consultation can be submitted online or in-writing by 23:59pm on 13 December 2022.
 - Online submissions can be made using the online feedback form on the project website. Emails received via info@gateburtonenergypark.co.uk during the targeted consultation period will also be considered as feedback.
 - Feedback can also be submitted in writing by requesting / printing out a copy of the feedback form and sending it back to FREEPOST GATE BURTON ENERGY PARK.
 Any letters received through this address over the consultation period will also be considered as feedback.
- 5.3.2 When a respondent submits feedback to the consultation online (either via the online feedback form or by email) an automated acknowledgement to confirm receipt will be issued direct.
- 5.3.3 Acknowledgement of submissions made offline (in writing or by completing a printed version of the feedback form) will be issued to respondents when their feedback has been received and processed.

5.4 Information services

- 5.4.1 Our project community relations team will continue to operate the dedicated Project freephone enquiry line 0800 860 6259 (9am-5pm Mon-Fri), email (info@gateburtonenergypark.co.uk) and freepost address (FREEPOST GATE BURTON ENERGY PARK) throughout the defined consultation period.
- 5.4.2 Through these channels people will be able to speak to a member of the community relations team to ask questions and request information available.
- 5.4.3 Requests for consultation information or general information on the Scheme to meet specific requirements (such as Braille or foreign languages or for those with literacy difficulties) will be considered on a case-by-case basis so we can establish how best to provide the information required.



Plan showing indicative order limits presented during statutory consultation with additional areas indicated





Project overview

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The solar energy park

The main elements of the energy park comprise the solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, the battery energy storage system (BESS) infrastructure and an onsite substation.

The PV panels will convert the sun's energy into electricity for storage on-site, then being exported to the grid via a cable connection.

The principal components comprise:

- · Solar photovoltaic (PV) panels and modular ground-mounting structures
- Supporting infrastructure inverters, combiner box, transformers converting
 the direct current to alternating current and stepping up the voltage so it can be
 exported to the national grid
- On-site substation to export electricity from the energy park to the national grid; including a control building with an office, welfare space and storage
- Abattery energy storage system (BESS) storing electricity on-site then releasing it into the national grid when it's needed most. It may also enable energy to be imported from the national grid so it can be stored until it is needed
- On-site cables connecting the solar PV modules and energy storage system to inverters which, in turn, connect to the transformers
- Fencing enclosing the operational areas of the site, with security measures including pole mounted internal facing closed circuit television (CCTV) around the site perimeter
- Access tracks to the site during construction and for routine maintenance when the energy park is operational
- New planting around the site perimeter and within the solar PV area to enhance biodiversity and improve the landscape

In addition

- During construction in addition to the main construction compound, up to three temporary construction compounds will be required, as well as temporary roadways, to enable access to all the land within the energy park boundary
- Opportunities for landscaping and habitat management will be explored in areas around the energy park equipment and other land within the DCO site to contribute to achieving Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG)

Our updated concept masterplan shows our current indicative proposals for the design and layout of the solar energy park.

Additional project design factors

Solar PV and energy storage technologies are rapidly evolving. The parameters of the DCO application we submit will therefore maintain the flexibility to allow us to use the latest technology available at the time of construction subject to consent being granted.

Our DCO application will however seek a consent that restricts those aspects of the solar energy park which have potential environmental impacts including:

- Height of the solar panels
- Dimensions of infrastructure such as the BESS and on-site substation
- Location of solar panels in the energy park



Connecting into the National Grid

The electricity generated by the energy park will be exported into the existing national electricity transmission system at National Grid's Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire.

For our initial Stage One Consultation we identified three broad corridor options in which an electrical connection between the energy park and Cottam substation could potentially be routed. We undertook technical assessment of the different constraints within each of these corridors based on the possibility of building the connection using overhead lines and underground cable.

Our preferred connection corridor

The findings from our technical assessments, together with feedback submitted to that first consultation, informed our selection of the southernmost route option as our preferred connection corridor for the project.

Within this southern corridor we are proposing to build much of the connection into the substation using underground cable.

Further to seeking feedback on this option as part of our Stage Two Consultation, we are continuing to refine this corridor ahead of submitting our planning application later this year.

Why we chose this route

The findings from our technical assessments and feedback to non-statutory consultation determined:

- A preference for underground cable due to lower visual effect and less intrusion in the area
- The identification of ecological and heritage sites which would rule out certain areas

The combination of a preference for an underground cable together with the extent of known beneath-ground archaeological assets ruled out two of the three corridor options we considered.

While the cable may be required to be above ground in a number of locations along this preferred corridor (for example, joining Cottam substation, or aveiding archaeology), we have selected it as our preferred option on the basis that it enables the general design principle to underground the cable wherever possible while avoiding known archaeological sites.

It provides the best balance of minimising impacts on the environment and local communities while meeting the technical and constructability feasibility requirements.

Working with Island Green Power

Given the proximity of Gate Burton Energy Park to the proposed Island Green Power Cottam and West Burton solar projects, we have worked together to identify opportunities for a single shared grid connection area for the projects; the aim being to maximize opportunities for reducing overall environmental and social effects, in particular on communities in proximity to the grid connection corridor, and sensitive heritage and ecological receptors adjacent to the River Trent.

The outcome from this work has resulted in us together identifying a shared grid connection corridor.

Shared grid connection area

The shared connection corridor comprises an area in which we will locate our 400KV connection from Gate Burton Energy Park into Cottam substation, and Island Green Power will locate its 400kV connection to Cottam substation and its 132kV connection to West Burton.

Within this area, the installation of common elements (i.e., the cable ducts and associated installation activities) that would accommodate three cable connections in the future results in environmental and community benefit by reducing the amount of disturbance; in particular the level and frequency of construction activity.

Measures to reduce effects

We've carefully considered the findings from our ongoing assessments to gauge the potential impact the construction, operation and decommissioning of Gate Surron Energy Park could have on the landscape, environment and local communities.

Reducing or avoiding impacts to one of our top priorities. In developing our proposals for the project we have factored in a range of measures to minimize its effect against a range of different factors. These include but are not limited to:

This involves drilling underground rather than diging open trenches, helping to avoid disturbing priority or sensitive habitats.

We would store topsoil and construction materials outside of floodplain extents. Our drainage systems have been designed to ensure there will be no significant increases in food risk downstream, including climate change scenarios.

We are developing health and safety plans accounting for potential climate change impacts on workers.

Climate change

We have designed the grid connection route and the energy park to minimise impacts on significant heritage assets. We have minimised overall fand requirements to reduce the extent the project could affect known and potential outural heritage assets.

We are seeking to avoid known archaeological remains.

We will carry out archaeological survey work along our grid connection rouse and will share the survey results in an appropriate format and supporting archive.

Where required in areas of archaeological potential, we will install temporary physical protection during construction and documes oning works.

There are considered to be no significant residual effects for surface water, groundwater or flood risk during the construction, operation and decommissioning. The assessment will be reviewed and revised where necessary alward of submission.



We propose to minimise operational noise impacts by strategically locating the battery and energy storage system (BESS) compound to reduce the effect of noise impacts. Transformers will be housed in cabins to reduce noise emissions.

We have designed Gate Burton Energy Park to take into account the quality of agricultural land, We will limit impact on best and most versatic land as far as possible, and also minimise impacts on Public Rights of Way.

Biodiversity net gain

From 2023, all new developments including Gate Burton Energy Park will be required to demonstrate a net increase in biodisersity on site of at least ten per cent.

We pride ourselves on going above and beyond this baseline requirement and have pledged that all our new sites will deliver biodiversity net gain in excess of ten per cent.

While we are not yet at the stage in the development process to have an exact estimate of the biodiversity not gain for Gate Burton their great, we're currently averaging over 75 per cent, biodiversity not gain across our other new sites.



Construction, operation and decommissioning

Subject to consent being granted, construction of Gate Burton Energy Park could start in early 2025. We estimate it would take between two to three years to build, with the site potentially being operational from early 2028.

The operation of Gate Burton Energy Park is expected to be around 60 years, while decommissioning is expected to take between two to four years and would be carried out in phases.

12 October 2021: Low Carbon Limited has today confirmed that it is at an early stage in developing proposals for a new solar and energy storage park at a site near Gate Burton in Lincolnshire. With an anticipated generation capacity of 500 megawats (MM), the scheme could provide enough dean energy to power over 160,000 homes and avoid more than 100,000 of CO2 emissions every year.

The extent of the land available to deliver the project is wholly contained within one site, located in the West Lindsay District near Gate Burton, Knaith Park and Willingham-by-Stow.

Mike Rutgers, Development Director at Low Carbon said: "The Government has set ambitious climate and energy targets to resch one zero by 2050. However, focus in recent weeks on energy price volatility and security of supply have highlighted just how critical it is for the UK to deliver on the transition to home grown renewable energy sources without delay.

"Low Carbon is therefore pleased to be bringing forward proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park which will deliver significant levels of renewable energy generation and contribute to securing the energy needs of Great Britain."

Preliminary work is currently being undertaken to identify the most appropriate areas of the site for development. It is also determining potential routies for the electrical connection from the energy park into the national grid at the existing substation at Cottam Power Station in Nottinghamshire.

The findings from this work will be shared through an initial public consultation, which it is anticipated will take place in early 2022, with further consultation then taking place at key stages in the ongoing project development process.

"We are at an early stage in the development process for this scheme," explains Rutgers. "As our proposals evolve, we are committed to consulting widely and effectively to ensure we strike the right balance of social, economic and environmental benefit.

"We want to deliver this project responsibly and engagement with the local community forms a critical element in ensuring we achieve this. We welcome the opportunity to meet with residents, business owners and other key stakeholders as the project progresses."

The amount of electricity Gate Burton Energy Park could generate means that it is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP). It will require a Development Consent Order (DCO) application to be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate. Effective consultation and engagement with all interested parties including local communities, authorities and interested organisations is central to the planning process for NSIPs.

Ultimately, consent will be determined by the Secretary of State at the department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS).

It is anticipated that the development process - through to DCO submission and then examination for Gate Burton Energy Park - will take between two and three years. Subject to achieving consent, construction would start no earlier than 2024.

Ultimately, consent will be determined by the Secretary of State at the department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS).





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

Gate Burton Energy Park has the potential to generate around 500 megawatts (MW) of renewable electricity – enough clean energy to power over 150,000 homes and avoid more than 100,000 tonnes of CQ emissions every year.

Having held an initial consultation earlier this year on emerging proposals for the project, Low Carbon continued to shape and refine its plans, taking into consideration all feedback received. These updated proposals were then presented during this second stage of statutory consultation to give people living and working in the area the opportunity to continue to inform and influence the project development procedure.

Over the course of the six-week consultation which closed on 05 August 2022, Low Carbon held five in-person events at local community facilities, held two virtual information events, and met with residents in properties neighbouring the site to understand first-hand their concerns and answer any questions.

Mike Rutgers, Development Director at Low Carbon said: "We are really grateful to all the people who took the time to take part in this consultation and would like to say a big 'thank you' to everyone who came along to events to speak with the team and provide us with their views on our proposals.

Cover the course of this consultation we've had some really constructive discussions and welcome the insight those conversations and subsequent feetback submitted to the consultation have provided. Feedback to the consultation covers a range of issues regarding the scheme, and we've also received some fantastic suggestions for projects and initiatives to consider supporting to benefit those communities nearest the site. We do also acknowledge that solar development stirs up strong feeling and we will bear that in mind as we continue to finalise our proposals.

While this is likely to be the last time Low Carbon consults on its proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park before submitting an application for development consent to the Planning Inspectorate, people will still have opportunity to contribute to the ongoing development process.

When the application is submitted, the Planning Inspectorate has 28 days to accept Low Carbon's application for Gate Burton Energy Park and decide if it will proceed to examination stage. Subject to the application being accepted, those wishing to be involved will need to register their interest with the Planning Inspectorate who will then keep them updated on opportunities to contribute.

Further to the examination stage concluding, the Planning Inspectorate will prepare a report for the Secretary of State for Business Energy and Industrial Strategy, who will make the final decision on this application. If approved, construction is anticipated as starting in 2025 at the earliest.

Low Carbon launches additional phase of targeted consultation on proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park

Low Carbon is carrying out a further stage of targeted consultation on its proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park after making some localised changes to the project boundary.

The consultation will run from 03 November to 13 December 2022. During this time, Low Carbon is asking for views on a number of minor additions it has made to the project boundary – known as indicative Order Limits – which result in a small increase in land allocation.

"The minor nature of the additions does not have any material change on the proposals we consulted on over the summer", confirms Mike Rutgers, Development Director at Low Carbon. "Therefore while we're not conducting a full consultation, we're holding this additional phase of targeted consultation to give people living near to the additional areas the opportunity to provide their views and comments on the changes".

"The changes have been made for a number of reasons", he explains. "The majority relate to engineering and construction matters. For example, to accommodate the safe access of vehicles to the site during construction. In some instances, the indicative Order Limits have been adjusted to follow field or land ownership boundaries.

"In terms of next steps, we'll continue to refine the indicative Order Limits for the project in response to comments we receive during this stage of targeted consultation ahead of submitting our application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Planning Inspectorate," Rutgers adds. It is anticipated that we'll submit our DCO for Gate Burton Energy Park to the Planning Inspectorate in early 2023."

The Gate Burton Energy Park website gateburtonenergypark.co.uk has been updated to include information on the changes proposed and enable people to submit comments to the targeted consultation online. Alternatively people can submit their comments in writing (in a letter or feedback form). Information about the additions being consulted on is also available on request from the Project Community Relations Team (see below).

This is likely to be the last time Low Carbon consults on its proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park before submitting its DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate. However, people will still have the opportunity to contribute to the development process. Further to the DCO being submitted, the Planning Inspectorate has 28 days to accept Low Carbon's application for Gate Burton Energy Park and decide if it will proceed to examination stage. Subject to the application being accepted, those wishing to be involved can register their interest with the Planning Inspectorate who will then keep them updated on further opportunities to contribute.



Gate Burton Energy Park

Low Carbon is developing proposals to build a new solar and energy storage park, along with the infrastructure needed to export the electricity it generates onto the national grid.

Gate Burton Energy Park is proposed as being built on land near Gate Burton in Lincolnshire. The electricity the proposed energy park generates will be exported via a connection into the existing national electricity transmission system at National Grid's Cottam substation in Nottinghamshire.

The project is anticipated as having a generation capacity of around 500 megawatts (MV). This is equivalent to providing enough clean energy to power over 160,000 homes and avoid more than 100,000 tonnes of CO₂ emissions every year.

UK Government has set ambitious targets to reach net zero by 2050. The recently published Energy Strategy detailed the aim to increase the UK's solar capacity five-fold by 2035 - equivalent to around 70 gigawatts (GVI) total generation capacity. Gate Burton Energy Park would deliver a significant level of renewable energy generation and make a vital contribution to supporting our transition to a low carbon energy system while securing the energy needs of Great Britain.

The amount of electricity Gate Burton Energy Park could generate exceeds 50MW. It is therefore classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP). This requires us to submit an application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to the Planning Inspectorate.

We anticipate that the development process for the project through to DCO submission and then examination will take between two and three years. Subject to achieving consent, construction would start no earlier than 2025.

Where we are now

We are carrying out a further stage of targeted consultation on our proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park after making some localised changes to the proposals we consulted on for Stage Two Statutory Consultation which closed in August 2022.

Since carrying out Stage Two Statutory Consultation we have continued to review our proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park in light of all the feedback we received along with the findings from our ongoing assessments.

The outcome from this ongoing work has resulted in our making some minor additions to the boundary for the project – known as indicative Order Limits – which result in a small increase in land take, We are therefore h





This is likely to be the last time Low Carbon consults on its proposals for Gate Burton Energy Park before submitting its DCO application to the Planning Inspectorate. However, people will still have the opportunity to contribute to the development process.




