

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1 Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this Statement of Commonality

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Commonality (the Statement) has been prepared to provide the Examining Authority (ExA) with a summary of the latest position regarding the negotiation of Statements of Common Ground (SoCGs) between the Applicant, relevant statutory consultees and other parties in relation to Stonestreet Green Solar (the Project).
- 1.1.2 The Rule 6 Letter [PD-004] dated 22 October 2024 requires the submission of SoCGs to inform the ExA and all other parties on matters where there is agreement and where differences lie at an early stage in the Examination process. The Rule 6 Letter requests that these are accompanied by an Issues Tracker (this Statement) detailing the progression of discussions.
- 1.1.3 Annex D of the Rule 6 Letter identifies the following parties with which the Applicant has sought to develop SoCGs:
 - Ashford Borough Council (ABC) [RR-018];
 - Environment Agency (EA) [RR-086];
 - Historic England (HE) [RR-099];
 - Kent County Council (KCC) [RR-156];
 - National Grid Electricity Transmission PLC (NGET) [RR-203].
 - National Highways (NH) [RR-205];
 - Natural England (NE) [RR-206];
 - Network Rail Infrastructure Limited (NR) [RR-207];
- 1.1.4 This Statement is to be treated as an iterative document throughout the Examination and will be updated and submitted at subsequent deadlines to provide an up to date overview of the latest position on the SoCGs.

1.2 Structure of this Statement

- 1.2.1 This Statement is structured as follows:
 - Section 2 sets out the status of each SoCG;
 - Section 3 provides a summary of where agreement has been reached with each party;
 - Section 4 provides details of any steps to be taken to progress outstanding matters towards resolution.

2 Status of the SoCGs

2.1 Overview at Deadline 46

- 2.1.1 This section provides an overview of the progression of each SoCG at Deadline 46 and will be updated to reflect their current status at each Examination deadline.
- 2.1.2 Table 2-1 identifies the status of each SoCG, categorised as follows:
 - SoCG in draft where a SoCG has been drafted (with matters recorded as agreed, ongoing and not agreed) and is subject to further discussions to resolve any outstanding matters;
 - Final signed SoCG where a final position has been reached on all matters, as either agreed or not agreed positions.

3 Commonality

3.1 Summary

- 3.1.1 This section of this Statement provides a summary of the topics covered in the SoCGs submitted at Deadline 46. It shows where there is commonality in the matters discussed between the Applicant and the various parties, and shows where matters have reached a final agreed position.
- 3.1.2 Table 3-1 lists out the topics covered in each of the SoCGs and the status for each stakeholder, where applicable. Where a topic is not relevant to a particular party the cell has been greyed out.
- 3.1.3 The Rule 6 Letter requests that for areas under discussion, each party flags their estimation as to the likelihood that disagreement will remain by the closure of Examination, as set out below and in each individual SoCG.

4 Summary of Ongoing Positions

4.1 Overview

- 4.1.1 This section provides an overview of the matters identified in Table 3-1 that remain unresolved at Deadline 46 with each of the parties and sets out how the Applicant is intending to progress matters with those parties with the intention of reaching a final agreed position before the close of the Examination.
- 4.2 Ashford Borough Council (Doc Ref. 8.3.1(AB))
- 4.2.1 The Applicant has had a Planning Performance Agreement with ABC since May 2023, which has allowed for extensive engagement during the pre-application stage, and continued engagement in the Examination stage.
- 4.2.2 The Applicant has been in active discussions with ABC and the SoCG has been updated a number of times during the post submission stage. Agreement has been reached on a number of matters, with <a href="https://example.com/outstanding-matters
 - Need and principle of development (Table 2.1): ABC question the scale and size of the development. The Applicant has responded to these matters and ABC and the Applicant discussed these matters further on the 28 January 2025. It was agreed that ABC would consider the Applicant's response in due course. The Applicant is awaiting a response form ABC on this matter. ABC confirmed their disagreement on 31 March 2025.
 - Planning Policy (Table 2.2): ABC considers the Project does not comply
 with the relevant National Policy Statements (EN-1 and EN-3). The
 Applicant has responded to these matters and awaits ABC's response. ABC
 confirmed their disagreement on this matter on 31 March 2025.
 - Landscape Character and Visual Amenity (Table 2.3): ABC considers that
 the Project does not minimise impacts on the landscape as the Project is
 larger than it considers appropriate. The Applicant has responded to these
 matters and awaits ABC's response ABC confirmed their disagreement on
 this matter on 31 March 2025.
 - Cumulative Landscape Effects (Table 2-3): ABC contend that different effects should have been identified as compared to those which have been identified in ES Volume 2, Chapter 8: Landscape and Views (Doc Ref. 5.2(A)) [AS-012] and ES Volume 2, Chapter 17: Cumulative Assessment (Doc Ref. 5.2) [APP-041]. The Applicant has requested further clarification on this point and await ABC's response.
 - Schedule 2: Requirements: the Applicant has responded to the feedback provided by ABC, and all but one matters are now agreed. ABC are considering the updates to 19.(2)(d) (timescales) provided by the Applicant at Deadline 1 (10th December 2024). ABC confirmed their disagreement on



this matter on 31 March 2025.

- 4.2.3 The Applicant has sought and continues to seek an opportunity to discuss the outstanding matters with ABC. The Applicant looks forward to discussing the outstanding matters with ABC further.
- 4.3 Environment Agency (Doc Ref. 8.3.2(C))
- 4.3.1 Agreement has been reached on all matters and the SoCG was signed on 11 March 2025. A signed version of the SoCG has been provided by the Applicant at Deadline 4.
- 4.4 Historic England (Doc Ref. 8.3.3(C))
- 4.4.1 Agreement has been reached on all matters and the SoCG was signed on 11 March 2025. A signed version of the SoCG has been provided by the Applicant at Deadline 4.
- 4.5 Kent County Council (Doc Ref. 8.3.4(CD))
- 4.5.1 The Applicant has had a Planning Performance Agreement with KCC since May 2023, which has allowed for extensive engagement during the pre-application stage, and continued engagement in the Examination stage.
- 4.5.2 The Applicant has been in active discussions with KCC and the SoCG has been updated a number of times during the post submission stage. Agreement has been reached on a number of matters, with outstanding matters relating to the following topics:
 - Impacts to Public Rights of Way ('PRoW') (Table 2.3): The Parties are
 making constructive progress in resolving a number of detailed matters.
 Agreement in anticipated before the end of Examination. have agreed the
 majority of matters in relation to PRoW, but do not agree on the level of
 impact.
 - Heritage (Table 2.6): The Parties are continuing to discuss archaeological matters and progress will be reported at Deadline 57.
- 4.5.3 The Applicant will continue to discuss these matters with KCC and progress will be reported at Deadline 4. A signed version of the SoCG is anticipated to be submitted intobefore the end of Examination at Deadline 4.
- 4.6 National Grid Electricity Transmission plc (Doc Ref. 8.3.5(BC))
- 4.6.1 The Applicant has been in active discussions with National Grid Electricity Transmission plc ('NGET') and the outstanding matters are summarised as follows:
 - The Draft DCO (Doc Ref. 3.1(C)),3.1(F)) [REP5-003], including protective provisions: Discussions have been ongoing between the Applicant and NGET regarding the protective provisions since early 2023. The protective



- provisions have now been agreed and final discussions are being held in order to formalise the position. The version of the draft protective provisions as at the date of submission of the Application is included in Part 5 of Schedule 13 to the **Draft DCO (Doc Ref. 3.1(D)).3.1(F))** [REP5-003].
- 4.6.2 The Applicant will continue to discuss these matters with NGET and progress will be reported at Deadline 5.A signed version of the SoCG is anticipated to be submitted before the end of Examination.
- 4.7 National Highways (Doc Ref. 8.3.6(B))
- 4.7.1 Agreement has been reached on all matters. A signed version of the SoCG was submitted at Deadline 3.
- 4.8 Natural England (Doc Ref. 8.3.7(C))
- 4.8.1 Agreement on all matters was reached on 11 March 2025. A signed version of the SoCG has been provided by the Applicant at Deadline 4.
- 4.9 Network Rail Infrastructure Limited (Doc Ref. 8.3.8(CD))
- 4.9.1 The Applicant has been in active discussions with Network Rail ('NR') and the SoCG has been reviewed (see Appendix 1 for further details). The outstanding matters are summarised as follows: After further correspondence between the parties, the protective provisions included in Part 7 of Schedule 13 to the **Draft DCO (Doc Ref. 3.1)(F))** [REP5-003]) have been agreed.
 - The Draft DCO (Doc Ref. 3.1 (D)), including protective provisions: Discussions have been ongoing between the Applicant and NR regarding the protective provisions since early 2023. The version of the draft protective provisions as at the date of submission of the Application is included in Part 7 of Schedule 13 to the Draft DCO (Doc Ref. 3.1 (D)).
- 4.9.2 The Applicant will continue to discuss these matters with NR and progress will be reported at Deadline 5. A signed version of the SoCG is anticipated to be submitted before the end of Examination.
