**Planning Act 2008 and The Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010**

**Application by Mona Offshore Wind Limited (“the Applicant”) for an Order granting Development Consent for the proposed Mona Offshore Wind Farm (“the Proposed Development”)**

**REQUEST FOR INFORMATION**

1. The Secretary of State issued a letter to the Applicant on 30 May 2025 requesting confirmation that it had reached agreement with the DIO and BAE Systems regarding the wording of Requirement 23 for Warton Aerodrome Primary Surveillance Radar (“PSR”) as outlined in Table 1.1 of the Applicant’s response to the Secretary of State’s letter dated 12 May 2025. On 23 June 2025, BAE Systems sent a response to the Secretary of State concerning this request.
2. The Secretary of State requests that the **Applicant** provide information as set out below **by midday on 30 June 2025**:

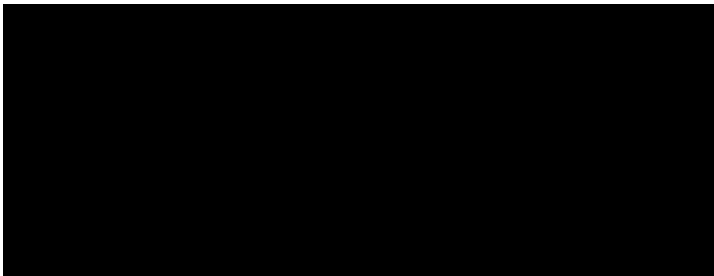
**PSR at Warton Aerodrome and Air Traffic Services (“ATS”) at the Warton and Walney Aerodromes**

3. In their letter dated 23 June 2025 BAE Systems provided their preferred requirements for the PSR at Warton Aerodrome and for the ATS at Warton and Walney Aerodromes.
4. The **Applicant** is requested to confirm that it has now reached agreement with the DIO and BAE Systems regarding the wording of these three requirements. If agreement has not been reached, the Applicant is requested to comment on the draft requirements provided by BAE Systems.
