Dear Rivenhall Casework Team, I hope this email finds you well.

On the 05 February you sent across the attached message which you ask for our comment on by 06 March 2025.

In the suggested Correction Order the applicants are seeking two main things, these being:

Article 2(1) – Definition of "the 2006 Act"

The Applicant requests that this definition is omitted from the Order. This definition is not referred to in the made Order and so is no longer required.

Secondly, they wish to change the following wording in the DCO:

"approved variation" means any variation to the TCPA permission granted by the relevant planning authority pursuant to section 73 or section 96A of the 1990 Act, provided such works do not give rise to any materially new or materially different environmental effects to those identified in the environmental information;

And the suggestion is to substitute the above wording to this:

Article 2(1) – Definition of "approved variation"

a) The Applicant requests that this definition is substituted with the following text: "approved variation" means any variation to the TCPA permission granted before or after the date of this Order by the relevant planning authority pursuant to section 73 or section 96A of the 1990 Act, provided that: (i) the development permitted by such variation when carried out in conjunction with the authorised development does not give rise to any materially new or materially different environmental effects to those identified in the environmental information; or (ii) in the event that it does give rise to such environmental effects, an environmental impact assessment has been carried out in respect of those effects prior to the grant of the variation;

The applicants' solicitors set out their reason for asking for this change. Having given the matter due consideration ECC raise no objection to the applicants as suggested Correction Order.


