1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose of this Document

- 1.1.1 This Statement of Commonality (the 'Statement') has been prepared on behalf of BSSL Cambsbed 1 Ltd (the 'Applicant') in respect of the application for development consent for the East Park Energy project (the 'Scheme'). An application for development consent for the Scheme was made on the 3rd October 2025, and subsequently accepted for examination by the Planning Inspectorate on 30th October 2025.
- 1.1.2 The Statement has been prepared to provide the Examining Authority (ExA) with a summary of the latest position of all Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) being prepared by the Applicant.
- 1.1.3 This Statement will be updated as required during the examination to reflect the progress that has been made on SoCGs.
- 1.1.4 This Statement is **Revision P02** and has been submitted at **Deadline 2**.

1.2 Document Structure

- 1.2.1 This Statement is structured as follows:

2.0 STATEMENTS OF COMMON GROUND

2.1 Approach to Statements of Common Ground

2.1.1 The Applicant began preparing SoCGs following acceptance of the application for examination. Each of the SoCGs being prepared has a consistent approach and structure, setting out:

- The role of the relevant organisation or interested party in the DCO process and a summary of consultation undertaken;
- The matters which are agreed, under discussion, or not agreed; and
- A signing sheet, to be completed once the SoCG is considered final.

2.1.2 The Applicant is preparing SoCGs with the following organisations as directed by the ExA in Annex B of the **Rule 8 Letter [PD-006]**:

- Local Authorities:
 - Bedford Borough Council;
 - Cambridgeshire County Council; and
 - Huntingdonshire District Council.
- Prescribed Consultees:
 - Environment Agency;
 - Historic England;
 - National Highways; and
 - Natural England.
- Statutory Undertakers:
 - National Grid Electricity Transmission.
- Other:
 - Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

4.0 SUMMARY OF PROGRESS

4.1 Introduction

- 4.1.1 This section of the Statement sets out a summary of the progress reached in achieving a final SoCG, as well as any principal remaining areas of disagreement and next steps to resolving them (if possible).

4.2 Summary of Progress

Bedford Borough Council

- 4.2.1 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with BBC at Deadline 2. The Applicant is continuing to consult with BBC and is not aware that there are any significant points of disagreement or an in-principle objection to the Scheme from BBC at this early stage in the Examination, but areas that require further clarification and discussion, particularly with regard to replacements undertaken during the operational phase of the Scheme, the assessment of ecological impacts, highways matters, and the content of the draft DCO.

Cambridgeshire County Council

- 4.2.2 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with CCC at Deadline 2. The Applicant is continuing to consult with CCC and is not aware that there are any significant points of disagreement or an in-principle objection to the Scheme from CCC at this early stage in the Examination, but areas that require further clarification and discussion, particularly with regard to replacements undertaken during the operational phase of the Scheme, the assessment of ecological impacts, highways matters, and the content of the draft DCO.

Huntingdonshire District Council

- 4.2.3 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with HDC at Deadline 2. The Applicant is continuing to consult with HDC and is not aware that there are

any significant points of disagreement or an in-principle objection to the Scheme from HDC at this early stage in the Examination, but areas that require further clarification and discussion, particularly with regard to replacements undertaken during the operational phase of the Scheme, the assessment of ecological impacts, and the content of the draft DCO.

Environment Agency

- 4.2.4 The Applicant is in regular dialogue with the Environment Agency and has submitted a first draft SoCG at Deadline 1. The Applicant is awaiting feedback from the EA on the Deadline 1 submissions, and expects to provide an updated SoCG at Deadline 3.
- 4.2.5 The Applicant understands that there are no principal areas of disagreement with the EA.

Historic England

- 4.2.6 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with Historic England at Deadline 1. Historic England is in continued discussion with the Applicant in relation to securing the long-term benefits from the Scheme, the archaeological mitigation strategy, and the assessment of impact on a number of designated assets. The Applicant expects to provide an updated SoCG at Deadline 3.
- 4.2.7 The Applicant notes there is some disagreement on the level of effect to two designated heritage assets, but that the extent of disagreement is reasonably narrow in planning terms.

National Highways

- 4.2.8 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with National Highways at Deadline 1. National Highways has requested additional survey and assessment of the A1 / B645 junction which the Applicant has undertaken and submitted at Deadline 1, and shared with National Highways in advance of Deadline 1. This assessment demonstrates there are no capacity issues with

the junction. The Applicant is awaiting feedback from the EA on the Deadline 1 submissions, and expects to provide an updated SoCG at Deadline 3.

Natural England

4.2.9 The Applicant has submitted a revised SoCG with Natural England at Deadline 2 with all matters agreed.

National Grid Electricity Transmission

4.2.10 The Applicant has submitted a draft SoCG with National Grid Electricity Transmission (NGET) at Deadline 2. Discussions relating to compulsory acquisition are ongoing.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

4.2.11 The Applicant submitted a final agreed and signed SoCG with Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service at Deadline 1, with no areas of disagreement.
