

I have read with and listened and watched others submissions

I am concerned that insufficient consideration has been given to the extent and value of the Roman settlement to the area of Great Staughton and not enough time or money has been earmarked to access the site and discover further the historical significance of the site.

The size of the overall projects is on an industrial scale and little consideration has been given at this stage as to the social impact of the development goes ahead, the area is not of outstanding natural beauty but it is a rural district within Cambridgeshire county and much of the community is dedicated to sustaining the countryside and keeping it in order for future generations.

The economics of the installation have not been fully explained, estimated costs of installation, the preventive maintenance costs, the dispersal of income, the derisory size of charitable local funding, and then the demolition costs at end of life, will there be land reinstatement costs and who will be responsible for those costs at the termination of the project, this project is being hastened through the system for its purported benefits to energy security, have those benefits been analysed and scrutinised to their fullest extent.

Can the planning consent be restricted to only installation of solar panels, and a condition inserted that no housing applications can be made on this site at termination by the land being referred to as grey, rather than green belt.

What are the opinions of Cambridgeshire county council Bedfordshire county council, Bedford town council Huntindonshire district council on this application are they allowed to comment at this stage.
