

Human Rights to a continued life, that is already enjoyed by many members of the public over decades are being proposed in this industrial development.

This solar development and Bess complex is an invasion upon people's lives and is an attack on the human rights of the public living in/hear the vicinity planned for development, and wider field of people wanting holiday or day trips out in the country for walks and mental wellbeing.

Throughout this consultation people have made their objections very clear, therefore I would list just some items people have a right to continue receiving as has been their privilege to have been granted for many years and an expectation of life expected for the future.

- Individual right to not have the mental impact of the stress and strain of an onerous 1900 acre proposal be forced upon them, for an inappropriate development, delivering power gains well under the boiler plate specified as the maximum possible, which removes the argument in favour of any kind of approval,?
- Distress and loss of tranquillity in an area of beauty, noise and building work and traffic impact on the public for up to 3 years!
- Removal of various local walks for miles, a right already in place and enjoyed as tranquillity of the residents and visitors, mental and enjoyment impact
- Horse-riding curtailed, this is a pleasure enjoyed within this area of countryside, a right held for many years, how can parts of this be unfairly taken away?
- Wildlife severely impacted regardless of any assessment this is clearly going to happen over 1900 acres, loss of many mammals, birds in our gardens, owls, woodpeckers, Red Kites, mink, deer, Hares, etc to name just a few. What is the count survey of current wild life and expected impact/mitigation to preserve our country heritage for all.
- What is the impact to bees over a vast loss of natural pollen accessibility, and wider impact to pollination that allows humans to grow products... a right to UK grown food ?
- Roads congested as they are not at a level of repair or size for that matter that can carry this project, impact to people's country lives for 3 years
- Installation of BESS facility and fire dangers, plus numerous panels with buzzing, causing stress for some people living in the area and adding to stress that if not approved would continue as it is currently, why should our lives/rights be impacted to this degree when we have chosen a life choice to live within villages, not within built up areas ?
- Human rights of equipment suppliers (e.g. panels), has this been assessed and what will be done to ensure compliance throughout life time of project if approved ?.
- Human right impacted in that people chose to live in the areas of proposed development, a country life location has been chosen, money spent to achieve this lifestyle, Bess risks not present, quiet villages little traffic, panoramic views of countryside everywhere good for body and mind. Why should our rights be impacted and be taken away in so much of how we live and enjoy our current lives ?

In summary if these panels were installed elsewhere rooftops, beside roads, fence panels etc, then yes we would have some impact to housing but not the invasion on our existing rights that many people cherish currently, and never had a view of it changing on this scale.

Therefore, I would hope any decision would weight these points heavily in our favour to get the solar panel industrialisation rejected.
