My name is Mrs Jennifer Johnson and I also represent my husband Mr Michael Johnson. We live at [REDACTED] Hemswell, Gainsborough [REDACTED]. Our home is situated at the side of the A631, our boundary is 20 yards from the boundary of the proposed site and our house is 50 yards away. We have several issues with the proposed development.

1. This is very productive farmland. Lincolnshire is known as the breadbasket of the country. We know it to be productive because we watch the harvests every year. If we lose all of this land to solar, where will it be replaced? Abroad and we will be at mercy of other providers. We are an island nation and we should be self sufficient.
2. Our weather is not conducive to huge scale solar "farms ". We have some sun in the summer when we do not need the energy and very little sun in the winter when we do need it. As the government are committed to building thousands of new homes it makes sense to fit these with solar panels. Solar panels should be on rooftops not on the ground.
3. The government intend to pay the developers when electricity is not needed. This is pure greed for profit making by [REDACTED] and an absolute misuse of taxpayers money.
4. We will lose our beautiful wildlife as well as the scenery we love.
5. The roads will not be able to cope with the increase in traffic. The A631 is an extremely busy road with many bends. It is the road to the coast and in the summer the traffic increases greatly. We feel that we are going to have problems getting off our driveway and onto the road.
6. We would like to call for another health hearing. I suffer from [REDACTED] and feel that this will be made worse by the development.
7. The possibility of an accident is a very real concern to us. We are so close to the BSS that any fire or toxic fumes may present a real threat to us.
