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# 1 Statement of Commonality: Introduction and Purpose

- 1.1 Photovolt Development Partners (PVDP), on behalf of SolarFive Ltd (the “Applicant”), submitted its application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) for the Botley West Solar Project (the “Project”) on 15 November 2024 (the “DCO Application”). The DCO Application was accepted for examination by the Planning Inspectorate on 13 December 2024.
- 1.2 Botley West is a solar farm located in parts of the administrative areas of West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC), Cherwell District Council (CDC) and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) and is within the county of Oxfordshire. Its renewable electricity generation output will be critical in helping deliver the Government’s commitments.
- 1.3 The Project has a total area of approximately 1,418 ha (see Location Plan [**AS-024**]), with the installation of solar panels across approximately 839 ha. The site location and size emerged following a site search undertaken by the Applicant, itself influenced by a number of planning, environmental, commercial and engineering factors. These factors are set out in Chapter 5: Alternatives considered of the Environmental Statement [**APP-042**].
- 1.4 A detailed description of the Project is provided within the Planning Supporting Statement submitted [**as updated at Deadline 1**].
- 1.5 This Statement of Commonality has been prepared to provide the Examining Authority (ExA) with the current position regarding the Statements of Common Ground (SoCG) between the Applicant and prescribed consultees, statutory undertakers and other interested parties (“other parties”).
- 1.6 The SoCG are working draft documents. They each comprise a record of consultation held with the relevant SoCG organisation to date as appropriate, and are designed to evolve, representing the ongoing nature of these discussions throughout the Examination period.
- 1.7 The Applicant is working to agree and submit final agreed versions of the SoCG before or at Deadline 7 of the Examination period.

## 2 Statements of Common Ground: Structure

- 2.1 To ensure consistency in the approach taken to documenting matters agreed, matters subject to further negotiation or matters not agreed, each of the SoCGs adopts a broadly standard format (unless expressly requested otherwise by Other Parties) in order to provide clarity to the Other Parties and ultimately the ExA.
- 2.2 Each SoCG has the following structure in addressing the following areas of common ground in relation to the Applicant Project Team's engagement with the respective organisations to date:
- Relevant submission documents and plans
  - Record of relevant correspondence to date
  - Matters that are agreed
  - Matters yet to be agreed
  - Matters that are not agreed

## 4 Statements of Common Ground: Summary of current position
