

I am submitting this response as an individual, and not on behalf of any other body.

To summarise, I wholeheartedly agree with the response provided by Cumnor Parish Council, and urge the Examining Authority to read their response in full.

1.1.5 - I am aware of three other projects in Cumnor which are significant enough to require consideration cumulatively with

the Proposed Development. These are the proposed National Grid substation, which is the subject of other questions, the Red House Farm solar power station, which is adjacent to this proposed development and is currently under consideration by Vale of White Horse District Council, and the floating solar power station on Farmoor Reservoir which Thames Water intend to build.

1.5.8 - I agree with Cumnor Parish Council that the uncertainty in the boundaries due to the scale of the maps and the thickness of drawn lines is a great concern, and causes several areas where exact impact cannot be assessed.

The Human Health assessment seems to imply that the impacted areas of the Vale of White Horse would only see impact from a substation, and not from arrays or cable corridors, however the plans say that all three would be in the area. There also seems to be confusion over whether the areas stated are parishes, parish wards, or district council wards, clarification on this matter would be greatly appreciated.

The apparent lack of engagement with Thames Valley Police is also a concern, particularly given the increased amount of crime being seen at similar solar installations elsewhere, and the fact that smaller applications decided by district councils have requested this engagement.
