Please note that by attending the event either in person or online you are agreeing to be filmed for the purposes of the online live stream of the event and the recording of the event which will get published on the <u>project webpage</u>. A limited number of seats will be available for observers who wish not to be filmed at the event. Please contact the case team to notify them if you prefer not to be filmed at the event. A transcript of the event will also be published on the <u>project webpage</u> after the event.

Any request to participate in a Hearing should include the following information:

- Name and unique reference number (found at the top of any letter or email from The Planning Inspectorate);
- email address (if available) and contact telephone number;
- name and unique reference number of any person/organisation that you are representing (if applicable);
- for blended events, confirmation of whether you will participate virtually or inperson;
- confirmation of the hearing(s) you wish to participate in, the agenda item(s) on which you wish to speak and/or brief details of the topic(s) that you would like to raise;
- for compulsory acquisition hearings, the plot number(s) of the relevant land provided in the book of reference and the land plans; and
- the examination library reference number (with paragraph/page number where appropriate) of any documents you wish to refer to.

Joining instructions for hearings will be issued by the case team via email shortly before the hearing dates.

Please contact the case team if you require any support or assistance to attend any Hearing, either virtually or in person.

If you simply wish to observe any of the hearings then you can either:

- 1. <u>Watch a livestream of the event</u> a link to the livestream will be made available on the project webpage shortly before the event is scheduled to begin; and/or
- **2.** Watch the recording of the event which will be published on the project webpage shortly after the event has finished.

Alternatively, you can attend the physical event at the venue to observe the proceedings; however, to ensure there is adequate seating capacity at the venue we request that you register your attendance to observe only by **Monday 22 September 2025** using the <a href="mailto:event\_participation-form">event\_participation form</a>. Please note that it may not be possible to participate on the day if you have not registered your wish to speak by **Monday 22 September 2025**.



## 2. Format of Hearings

All Hearings will be Blended events. Blended events allow attendance both in-person and virtually through Microsoft Teams. The Hearings will be live-streamed, and a link will be posted on the project webpage before the start of the event. ## 4. Procedure at Hearings

The Examination will principally be a written process, supplemented where necessary by various types of Hearings. Please refer to the <u>Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects:</u>

<u>What to expect at a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project event</u> as this provides important information about Hearing procedures.

The procedure to be followed at Hearings is set out in Rule 14 of the EPR. The ExA is responsible for the oral questioning of Interested Parties or Other Persons giving evidence and **will not allow cross-questioning** between parties.

All hearings are recorded. The recordings and transcripts will be made available on the <a href="mailto:project webpage">project webpage</a> as soon as practicable following the hearing. The recordings allow any member of the public who is interested in the application and the examination to find out what has been discussed at a hearing. It is therefore important to note that anyone speaking at the hearing will need to introduce themselves, including any organisation or groups that they represent, **each time they speak** to ensure that someone listening to the recording after the hearing is clear who was speaking.

As the recordings are retained and published, they form a public record that can contain personal information to which the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) applies. Please refer to our 'Privacy Notice' for further information. Participants must do their best to avoid making public any information which they would otherwise wish to be kept private and confidential. If there is a need to refer to such information, it should be in written form. Although this will also be published, personal and private content can be redacted or removed before it is made publicly available. Any person who is unclear on this point should ask the case team for guidance before they place personal and private information into the public domain. The Planning Inspectorate's practice is to publish the recordings and transcripts and retain them for a period of five years from the Secretary of State's decision on the development consent order (DCO). If you actively participate in the hearing, it is important that you understand that you will be recorded and that the recording and transcript will be made available in the public domain.

The evidence presented orally at hearings should be included in post hearing submissions and submitted at the relevant deadline in the <u>examination timetable</u>.

## 5. Accompanied Site Inspection (ASI)

At Annex A of this letter is the ExA's requested itinerary for the ASI, together with details of the arrangements for the visit.



In selecting the sites for an ASI, the ExA has had regard to the availability of public access alternatives, the need to enter onto private land and the necessity to gain a better understanding of an area if not already attained from earlier unaccompanied site inspections (USIs). A number of USIs have already taken place covering a proportion of those sites nominated by Interested Parties, and the ExA will be undertaking further USIs where possible and necessary in response to the site nominations.

## 6. Request under Rule 17

The applicant is requested to provide an updated compulsory acquisition tracker, land and rights negotiations tracker and book of reference at **Deadline 5**, providing up-to-date details that will assist in preparations for the Compulsory Acquisition Hearing scheduled for 8 October 2025.
