

For Dustin Dryden – PINS Public Hearing 08.10.25, in person.

I'd like to address the overall impact on essential secondary access to [REDACTED] as well as the issues of security and safety in and around that home; this appears not to have been given due – or any – consideration by the Applicant.

To date, there have been no discussions or negotiations with the Applicants regarding the rights they seek to acquire and the consequent effects on M Dryden's access to and from his home and farm.

In the absence of negotiations, I would like clarity around identification of the proposed mitigation by the applicants to ensure that (even if for safety reasons alone) his access and egress remains continuously and freely available throughout the duration of all and any works, as well as future operations.

I would hope that the ExA can assist to ensure that any information regarding Compulsory Acquisition of the rights sought (to lie cabling at ASP-7 & PA-3 & SCT-58 (APP-007/2.4/Sheet10) is actively provided by the Applicants – directly to Mr Dryden, so that he has an opportunity to comment.

Waiting for the Construction Traffic Management Plan, would be unfair to Mr Dryden in terms of the necessary forward planning required for the family and the farming activities of his company, Oxfordshire Estates.
