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Dear Sir, my reference number is and I am following up on previous correspondence regarding aviation safety and the Botley West solar development. I have previously provided articles on the subject published in the Woodstock and Bladon News . My concerns relate to the ever present danger of aircraft accidents on Bladon Heath having witnessed two with fatal consequences. On the first occasion I certified the three occupants of the aircraft deceased (to assist the ambulance service) and therefore feel justified in repeating these points. I understand that the local MP(CM)has forwarded my articles to the Department of Transport and I believe that they should also be shared with the Ministry for Defence. The dangers of solar panels in proximity to airports are well illustrated by the Schiphol Airport precedent in Holland, and must be taken seriously . Without expanding on the matter there is a further security perspective relating to Chinese technology adjacent to an important RAF base as the text below suggests. Lastly the denial that flocks of geese migrate from Blenheim lakes only to congregate on Bladon Heath before flying south over Oxford Airport is disingenuous. I have sent photographs of the birds to interested parties on a number of occasions. To repeat, there should be national guidelines on the proximity of solar sites to airports, not the random process currently undertaken on a case by case basis.
