Dear Simon,

I hope all goes well with you.

I thought I would write to you about something we spotted in Historic England`s Deadline 6 submission (para 2.2); that ICOMOS international is producing another report for the Examination.

There is no indication from HE as to what this additional report is going to cover. It would be surprising if HE does not know this as it is likely to have been involved in the discussions which led to it being commissioned.

No indication is given, either, as to when it will be produced, other than "before the end of the Examination". Again, it seems likely that HE would have discussed this with the ICOMOS staff doing the drafting. They would certainly have been able to do that.

The report will probably contain information that will be relevant to those IPs, such as BYG, who would like to cover the setting of the WHS in their Closing Statements. However, if the normal process for putting documents into the Examination is followed, the report would - at best - become an annex to a Deadline 7 representation from HE. That would of course mean that no other party would be able to comment on it before the end of the Examination, or to deal with it in their Closing Statements.

Given the importance of the issue to consideration of the BWSF project, this would be extremely unsatisfactory.

We think it would help if ExA could clarify how this new ICOMOS report is going to be dealt with. If we are not going to see it before D7 we will have to produce our Closing Statements without it. Clearly, no responsibility would attach to the ExA for that, but it would be an unfair breach of the reciprocation enjoyed so far by all participants in the Examination.

We respectfully suggest that the situation could be improved if the ExA were first to ask HE to clarify immediately what brief ICOMOS is working to, and what issues the report will address; then to confirm the report will be submitted to the ExA by, say, 3rd November. It could then be published in reasonable time for all parties to make representations about it at D7 and in their Closing Statements.
