I am a resident being affected by the Botley West development (It will surround my house on three sides) and I am trying to submit responses but I am finding the process is not designed for members of the public as it has lots of acronyms and jargon that it is impossible to click through the submission.

Please could you capture my responses and feed these into the process

- As a temporary development, there needs to be a decommissioning fund to ensure that the panels can be removed and the land returned to farming. This should be in place before any works begin
- This needs to contain a break clause which allows the land to be reclaimed early and enable this fund to be used in the event of national food shortage given this is removing some of the best and most versatile land from important food production
- There ought to be full anti-money laundering checks as it is still not clear where this project finance is coming from
- All investors and suppliers also need to be vetted for anti-slavery and anti-bribery as it seems likely that these panels will be made in China w [REDACTED]
