The SOS should bring this long-running farce to an end: immediately.

If PDVP is not competent to make accurate proposals on time then they are not to be trusted to build and run an enormous (and exceptionally ugly) Solar Power Station.

The problems involved in building the Electricity Sub Station and the river crossing of the electric cables further illustrate this incompetence and confusion. The proposal for a "Food Growing Area" is merely obfuscation to further confuse the Residents of the villages in this area. PDVP use every form of misleading information to confuse the people who live here. Boredom is used as a weapon to exhaust the residents.

PDVP proposal is countered by many sound arguments: the destruction of rural countryside and farming land is high on the list

CONCLUSION

The SOS should inform PDVP that they have run out of time. The project that they propose has been rejected by the people who live here and their democratically elected representatives. PDVPs technique of changing the arguments does not fool anyone anymore. The threat to green vegetation including hedges and the damage to birds and small animals is a major disadvantage. Their lies, including the lie that the threatened farm land is "Sub-standard". There is a danger to aircraft approaching Oxford Airfield. Most important to those who live here is the marring of the small Cotswold Stone villages threatened by the giant steel and glass structure (11 miles long and approximately one mile wide)

Please reject the PDVP proposal.
