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# 1 Introduction

## 1.1. Purpose of this Document

1.1.1. This document has been produced to set out and record updates to Environmental Statement Application Documents submitted and accepted for Examination as part of the Development Consent Order (DCO) Application for Tween Bridge Solar Farm, comprising a solar photovoltaic (PV) array electricity generating facility, Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) and associated infrastructure (the “Scheme”) on 23rd September 2025

1.1.2. Since the start of the Examination process, updates have been made to the Environmental Statement (ES) and its supporting documents at both Deadline 1 and Deadline 2. The document references for these documents can be found in the Application Document Schedules for Deadline 1 [REP1-042] and Deadline 2 [REP2-084].:

- **Environmental Statement (ES) Volume 1 and Volume 2 (Chapters 0 to 18);**
- **ES Volume 3 (Appendices);**
- **ES Volume 4 (Figures); and**
- **Non-Technical Summary [APP-056]**

1.1.3. This document is produced further to the Applicant’s notice of intention to submit a request for changes to the application [AS-028] and subsequent **Change Request Document [Document Reference 8.14 Revision 1]** (the Change Request). 12/B<sup>1</sup>, 3/C, 3/D and 3/E from the extent of land subject to compulsory acquisition, temporary possession and works powers; the modification of Mitigation Parcel M1(A) to avoid registered common land/Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 access land parcels 1/E, 2/A, 3/A and 3/B; and an amendment to a proposed

permissive path route through Mitigation Parcel M1(A) so that it would avoid encroaching upon parcel 2/A.

- 1.1.4. This document has been produced to identify any potential implications arising from the Change Request, in terms of the conclusions of the ES.
- 1.1.5. Where the extent of change justifies it, ES Figures and ES Appendices may be updated and submitted as new versions. If this is the case, the changes to these Figures and Appendices are not captured within this Change Request ES Addendum but instead an appropriate cross-reference is made within this addendum to the relevant version of the ES Figures or ES Appendices which has been updated and submitted as part of the **Change Request Document [Document Reference 8.14 Revision 1]**.

## 2 Change Request

### 2.1. Environmental Statement Volume 1 and Volume 2 Updates

2.1.1. **Table 2-1** sets out amendments to ES Volume 1 and 2 documents (main ES chapters) that have been identified as a result of minor changes in respect of Special Category Land: Common Land/Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 access land Parcels, of which the ExA was notified on 30th April 2026 **[AS-028]** and are submitted to the ExA on 4th June 2026. Certain changes are accompanied by revised versions of the ES Volume 3 (Appendices) and 4 (Figures) documents. All changes to the ES Volumes 1 and 2 (Chapters) are reflected in this ES Addendum alone.

#### 3.1. Environmental Statement Volume 3 Updates
