#### **Frodsham Solar**

## Statutory Pre-Application Consultation: 07 November 2024 – 19 December 2024

Section 42 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the 2008 Act"), Regulation 3 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009, and Regulations 11 and 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 ("the 2017 Regulations")

This letter has been sent to you as part of a statutory consultation exercise being carried out pursuant to section 42 of the 2008 Act by Frodsham Solar Limited ("the Applicant"), in respect of proposals for Frodsham Solar.

## The Applicant

The applicant for this project will be Frodsham Solar Limited, which was introduced last year as part of a joint venture known as Peel Cubico Renewables.

In January 2024, Cubico Sustainable Investments ("Cubico") acquired Peel NRE's 50% stake in Peel Cubico Renewables Ltd. This includes the joint venture's solar development pipeline, meaning that Frodsham Solar is now a Cubico only project and Frodsham Solar Limited is wholly owned by Cubico.

## **The Project**

The Applicant intends to build a solar energy generation station and an associated on-site Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) ("Frodsham Solar") on land at Frodsham Marsh, Frodsham, Cheshire West and Chester. The proposal is situated to the north of the M56, including an area of land beneath the eastern cluster of turbines of Frodsham Wind Farm. A site location plan is enclosed with this letter.

The proposed design for Frodsham Solar would enable the generation of approximately 130 megawatts (MW) of electricity, as well as the storage of approximately 100 MW of electricity in a BESS. Frodsham Solar also includes the associated infrastructure for connection to the local electricity distribution network, as well as a private wire connection, that would enable local businesses to utilise electricity generated.



The proposals include the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of:

- A ground-mounted solar array (solar panels);
- An on-site battery energy storage system (BESS);
- Built infrastructure such as substations, transformers and inverters;
- Electrical connection infrastructure including an overhead line connection into the existing Frodsham Substation, as well as a private wire connection;
- Landscape and ecological mitigation and enhancement measures, including consideration of new permissive paths and biodiversity and bird mitigation areas; and
- Other ancillary works including access, fencing, and drainage.

Frodsham Solar is considered as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project ("NSIP") as the amount of electricity it could generate exceeds 50 MW. To be consented, it will require a Development Consent Order ("DCO") from the Secretary of State for the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero ("DESNZ") under the 2008 Act.

The DCO application will contain full details of the proposals for Frodsham Solar and will be accompanied by an Environmental Statement in accordance with the 2008 Act and the 2017 Regulations. The Applicant intends to make this application in Spring 2025.

#### **Consultation on Frodsham Solar**

Frodsham Solar is currently in the pre-application phase of the DCO application process. As part of that process, the Applicant is required to carry out consultation on the proposed DCO application before it is submitted. Your feedback as part of this consultation will be considered before the Applicant finalises its DCO application and will also be reported to the Secretary of State when the application is submitted.

We are writing to you as you have been identified as a consultee for the purpose of section 42 of the 2008 Act and/or Regulation 11 of the 2017 Regulations, or it has been decided it would be appropriate to consult you in any event.

#### This consultation includes:

- Consultation with prescribed bodies, host and neighbouring authorities (under section 42 and section 43 of the 2008 Act);
- Consultation with any persons with an interest in the land affected by Frodsham Solar (under section 42 and section 44 of the 2008 Act);
- Consultation with the local community in the vicinity of Frodsham Solar (under section 47 of the 2008 Act); and
- General public consultation on Frodsham Solar (under section 48 of the 2008 Act).



This consultation is running from **Thursday 07 November 2024** to **Thursday 19 December 2024**.

The approach to consultation set out in this document has been discussed with the relevant host local planning authority, as required by Section 47(2) of the Act, and regard has been had to the comments they have made. Details of how this consultation is being carried out can be found in the Applicant's Statement of Community Consultation, which was published in May 2023. The Applicant subsequently published an addendum to this document in October 2024, to provide more details of the upcoming statutory consultation. Both documents are available to view and download from the document library on the Applicant's website at: <a href="https://www.frodshamsolar.co.uk">www.frodshamsolar.co.uk</a>.

In addition, section 48 of the 2008 Act and Regulation 13 of the 2017 Regulations require the Applicant to publicise its proposed DCO application. A formal notice publicising the proposed application is therefore enclosed with this letter which includes a summary of the key elements of the proposals for Frodsham Solar and provides details of the consultation.

#### **Consultation materials**

As Frodsham Solar is an Environmental Impact Assessment ("EIA") development for the purposes of the 2017 Regulations, the Applicant has prepared a Preliminary Environmental Information Report ("PEIR"). This has been informed by the Scoping Opinion issued by the Planning Inspectorate and reports the results of the EIA process that has been carried out to date. The PEIR forms the basis of this consultation and also includes a non-technical summary. The purpose of the PEIR is to enable consultees to understand the likely environmental effects of Frodsham Solar and to help inform consultation responses. It should be noted that the EIA is an ongoing process.

In addition to the PEIR, the Applicant has produced a Community Consultation Leaflet and Feedback Form. These consultation documents provide information and invite feedback on the proposals for Frodsham Solar.

The consultation materials include:

- The PEIR (including appendices, plans and figures);
- A non-technical summary of the PEIR;
- Additional documents including the Community Consultation Leaflet and Feedback Form.

Consultation materials will also be provided in paper copy or on USB by request to the Applicant. 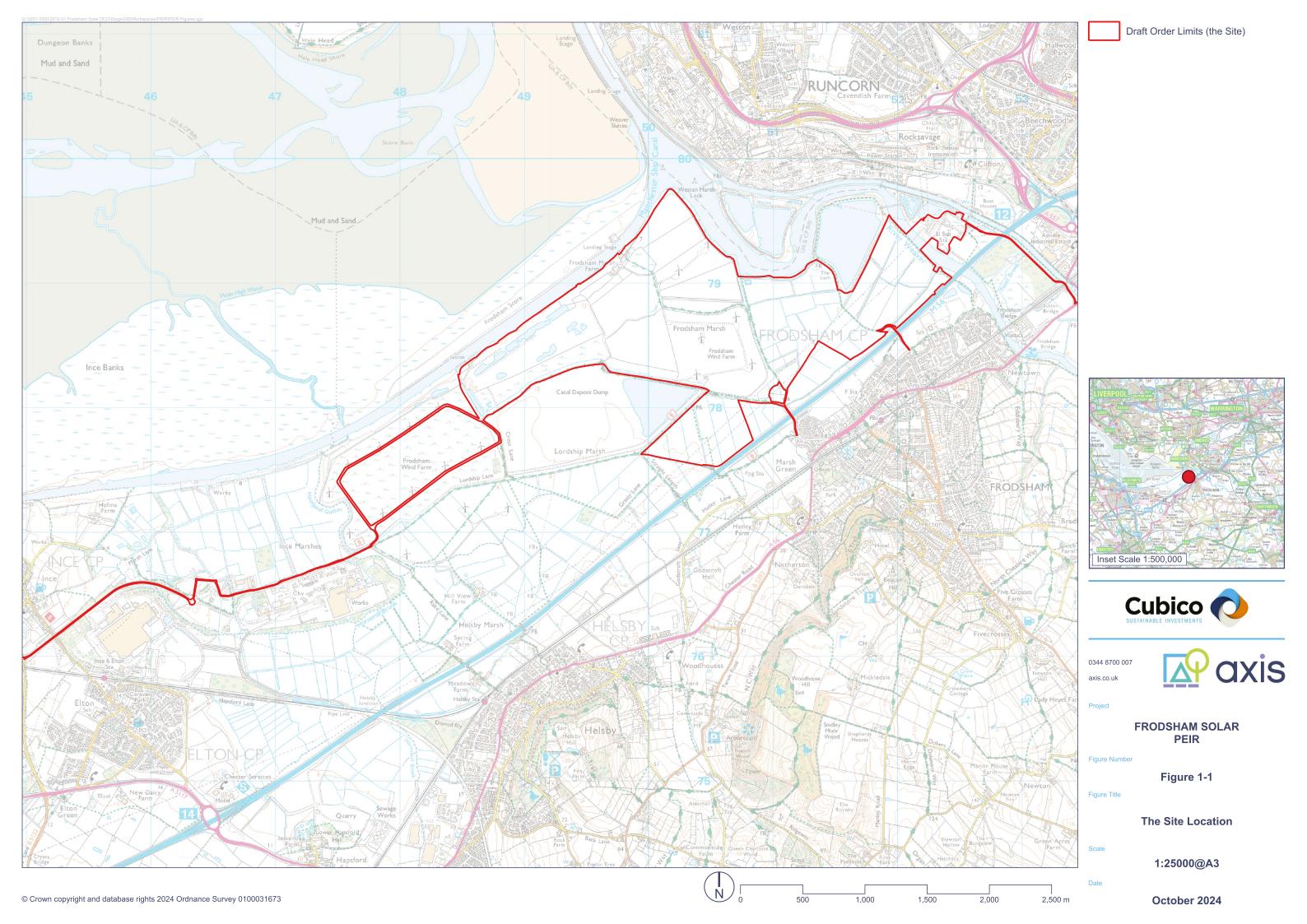

In January 2024, Cubico Sustainable Investments ("Cubico") acquired Peel NRE's 50% stake in Peel Cubico Renewables Ltd. This includes the joint venture's solar development pipeline, meaning that Frodsham Solar is now a Cubico only project and Frodsham Solar Limited is wholly owned by Cubico.

## **The Project**

The Applicant intends to build a solar energy generation station and an associated on-site Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) ("Frodsham Solar") on land at Frodsham Marsh, Frodsham, Cheshire West and Chester. The proposal is situated to the north of the M56, including an area of land beneath the eastern cluster of turbines of Frodsham Wind Farm. A site location plan is enclosed with this letter.

The proposed design for Frodsham Solar would enable the generation of approximately 130 megawatts (MW) of electricity, as well as the storage of approximately 100 MW of electricity in a BESS. Frodsham Solar also includes the associated infrastructure for connection to the local electricity distribution network, as well as a private wire connection, that would enable local businesses to utilise electricity generated.

The proposals include the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of:

- A ground-mounted solar array (solar panels);
- An on-site battery energy storage system (BESS);
- Built infrastructure such as substations, transformers and inverters;
- Electrical connection infrastructure including an overhead line connection into the existing Frodsham Substation, as well as a private wire connection;
- Landscape and ecological mitigation and enhancement measures, including consideration of new permissive paths and biodiversity and bird mitigation areas; and
- Other ancillary works including access, fencing, and drainage.

Frodsham Solar is considered as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project ("NSIP") as the amount of electricity it could generate exceeds 50 MW. To be consented, it will require a Development Consent Order ("DCO") from the Secretary of State for the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero ("DESNZ") under the 2008 Act.
