**TRANSBOUNDARY SCREENING**

<b>Document(s) used for transboundary screening:</b>	Fosse Green Energy Scoping Report ('the Scoping Report - 19 June 2023)
<p>The Inspectorate on behalf of the SoS has considered the proposed development which comprises of a generating station with an anticipated capacity in excess of 50MW comprising the installation of solar panels, associated electrical equipment, cabling and on-site energy storage facilities together with grid connection infrastructure for the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of the Fosse Green Energy scheme.</p> <p>The Inspectorate concludes that the proposed development <b>is unlikely to have a significant effect either alone or cumulatively on the environment in a European Economic Area State</b>. In reaching this conclusion the Inspectorate has identified and considered the proposed development's likely impacts including consideration of potential pathways and the extent, magnitude, probability, duration, frequency and reversibility of the impacts.</p> <p>The Inspectorate considers that the likelihood of transboundary effects resulting from the proposed development is so low that it does not warrant the issue of a detailed transboundary screening. However, this position will remain under review and will have regard to any new or materially different information coming to light which may alter that decision.</p>
